# Got vital leads in Rajouri terror attack case: DGP

SRINAGAR: Security forces have got several concrete leads in the Rajouri terror attack case in which seven civilians were killed, Director General of Police Dilbag Singh said on Tuesday.

Singh said several people who were in contact with the terrorists have been questioned and the police will "achieve success very soon".

He said the security forces have launched operations in the area four times, but so far, there has not been any

"We have got many solid proofs during the investigation. We have the details of many people who came in their contact, some of them have been questioned as well. Arrests will be made as per the requirement. This process is on and I am hopeful that we will achieve success very soon," the J-K Reviews security situation in valley

# Two LeT terrorists eliminated in Budgam

SRINAGAR: Two Lashkare-Toiba terrorists were killed in a brief encounter with security personnel near the court complex in Budgam district on Tuesday, police

"On a specific input about the movement of terrorists through Budgam, a joint area domination party of the Army and Police tried to stop one suspected vehicle near the court complex. Terrorists fired upon and in retaliation two terrorists were killed," spokesperson said.

Additional Director General of Police, Kashmir, Vijay Kumar said the slain terrorists were affiliated to proscribed outfit Lashkar-e-Toiba and have been identified as Arbaaz Mir and Shahid Sheikh, both from Pulwama district.

Kumar said both the terrorists had escaped from a cordon and search operation Magam area.

An AK rifle and a pistol were recovered from them, Speaking to reporters on

the sidelines of an event, DGP Dilbag Singh said the militants were probably looking for a new hideout after they fled from the previous one last week.

"There was an operation in Redbugh area two days ago in which there was some firefight, but terrorists managed to escape. We were

looking for them and checkpoints had been put up for that.

"We had inputs about their movement in a vehicle. When this vehicle was signalled to stop, terrorists came down and started firing. In the retaliatory fire, two terrorists were killed, Singh said.

"It is a matter of investigation whether they were headed to Srinagar. Perhaps they were moving in search of a new hideout after leaving the old one," he added.



#### Nadda gets extension as BJP Chief till June 2024 posal of extending Nadda's

NEW DELHI: BJP president J P Nadda's term was extended till June next year at the party's national executive meeting on Tuesday, with Union Home Minister Amit Shah asserting they will win the 2024 Lok Sabha polls with a bigger mandate than 2019.

The widely expected development underlines the party's preference for continuity as it gears up for the all-important Lok Sabha polls, expected in April-May next vear.

Announcing the decision. Shah told reporters here that Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, a former party president like him, moved the protenure till June next year and the executive unanimously endorsed it.

Later in a tweet, Nadda, expressing gratitude towards Prime Minister Narendra Modi and all members of the BJP's national executive, said, "we have to form the BJP government in the next Lok Sabha elections with more than two-thirds majority under the leadership of Modi ji.'

The BJP's parliamentary board has already approved the extension of Nadda's term as the party president.


