The Awareness programme was inaugurated by Director Agriculture Kashmir, Chowdhury Mohammad Iqbal in presence of Chief Agriculture Officer Ajaz Hussain Dar, Chief Agriculture Officer Kulgam Sartaj Ahmad Shah, Chairman Women Cooperatives Shakeela Jan, District Agriculture Officers, Sub divisional level officers and progressive farmers of the district.

Director while speaking on the occasion deliberated on the aim of establishing the PMKSK in the district. He said the demand for agriculture is rising rapidly with

increase in population and per capita income and growing demand from the industry sector. In this endeavour, the PM KSK centre will provide the doorstep facilities to the farmers by providing Soil

testing facility, Call centre facility, Fertilizer availability etc. He also addressed farmers on the importance of Nano urea fertilizer awareness for reducing the losses of Nitrogen in the atmosphere. Director elucidated the role of Nano urea in reducing the input cost of farmers in production and to safeguard the environment for present and future generations. He said that the UT government has approved 29 projects under holistic development of agri-

culture and allied sectors, and implementation of these projects would not only energize the agriculture sector but will also change the economic fortune of the farming community of the region.

Iqbal impressed upon the officers to raise awareness regarding these approved projects among the farming community so that the desired results and targets could be achieved in an effective and time bound manner. He asked the officers to ensure that the benefits under these projects reaches every grass root level farmer. Other Officers addressed the farmers about the need of shifting towards the use of Nano Urea fertilizer prepared by IFFCO.

Earlier, Director Agriculture flagged-off a group of saffron farmers on a six days exposure visit under CAT, sponsored by NABARD.

# AJK Plus 2 Lecturers' Forum urges Govt to redress their issues

JAMMU: A UT level meeting of All JK Plus 2 Lecturers' Forum was held on Monday through virtual mode under the chairmanship of R S Slathia with Pardeep Singh Rakval, President presiding the meet.

The main agenda of the meeting was regularisation of I/C lecturers holding PG degrees through distance mode in Science Stream.

The meeting resolved in one voice that these lecturers have been posted after verification of their degrees by the

Directorates of School Education Jammu/Srinagar.

Pardeep Singh Rakval expressed resentment for unwanted delay in regularisation of these lecturers as the same degrees have been recognized by Jammu & Kashmir PSC and SSRB.

Slathia expressed surprise over the fact that these degrees have been given recognition for the direct selection of lecturers in Science stream by JKPCS and SSRB but the department of Education is unnecessarily harassing the I/C lecturers and delaying their regularisation.

The speakers further said that lecturers have been regularised holding such degrees in the recent past alongwith regularisation of others.

Other issues that came under discussion include grant of ACP in favour of +2 Cadre, repatriation of lecturers/principals working in hard/very Hard zones, Non-vacation status in favour of plus two Principals and creation of posts of Vice Principal in all Higher Secondary Schools in JK UT, transfer policy in favour of SRO 202 employees, revisiting of ATD during the months of

Jan-Feb in winter Zone areas and May- June in summer zone areas of the UT, regularisation from lecturers to Joint Directors.

The district Presidents in one voice advocated for academic excellence so that our young generation does go well in their careers but this can be achieved only by filling all vacant posts of lecturers, Principals, CEOs, DIET Principals and Joint Directors.

# Over 4500 drug abuse victims given Rehabilitation Treatment at De-addiction centre SMHS, ATF JVC Srinagar

SRINAGAR: The Deputy Commissioner (DC) Srinagar, Mohammad Aijaz Asad on Monday undertook a visit to Treatment Facility(ATF) at JVC, Bemina and Drug De-addiction Centre, SMHS Hospital of the District to oversee the Treatment and Counselling facilities being provided to the affected youth undergoing treatment.

Additional Deputy Commissioner, Srinagar, Dr Syed Haneef Balkhi, Chief Planning Officer, Mohammad Yaseen Lone, District Social Welfare Officer, Dr Mukhtar Ahmad, DDMO, Srinagar, Imtiyaz Anin Naik, Professor and Incharge of DDC, SMHS, GMC, Srinagar

Dr Yasir Rafter and other concerned Officers accompanied the DC during the visit.

The Deputy Commissioner visited Addiction Treatment Facility(ATF) at JVC, Bemina to take stock of the functioning of the Centre and facilities being provided to the visiting drug affected persons.

On the occasion, the DC was given a detailed description about the operation of the centre by Medical Superintendent JVC, Dr Shifa and HoD Department of Psychiatry, Dr Abdul Majid.

While interacting with the staff of ATF, the DC emphasised upon the Doctors and

other Paramedical staff to take the job as a noble task and treat the affected people with patience and dedication.

On the occasion, the DC was informed that as many as 1500 patients have been given treatment at the Center.

The Deputy Commissioner also inspected the ongoing work on new Psychiatry block of the JCV Bemina and emphasised on its time bound completion.

At Drug De-Addiction Centre SMHS Hospital, the DC stock of the facilities and mechanism adopted by the authorities for the treatment, counseling and rehabilitation of the drug affected persons.

The DC held a detailed interaction with the patients/inmates undergoing treatment in the Hospital and took feedback from them regarding the medical facilities and counselling being given to them.

The patients apprised the DC that they are being given satisfactory treatment at the centre. They also assured that they will spread the message about the ill effects of the menace so that no one becomes an addict to the substance abuse.

During the interaction, the DC advised them to strongly resolve to shun the habit of drug addiction and properly take the treatment administered at the centre and free

themselves from the clutches of drug abuse.

At the occasion, the DC was apprised that from January 2022 to January 02, 2023 as many as 3645 drug affected persons were given treatment along counselling at Psychiatry Unit of SMHS Hospital.

The DC said the District Administration will provide all possible support to the affected persons and shall help them settle in careers by extending benefits of various employment generation programmes of the Government. He said by availing the benefits through different self-employment schemes they can earn livelihood with dignity and honour.

The DC said elimination of drug menace from society is top priority of the Government and to combat this rising societal problem, multi-pronged rehabilitation, counselling and guidance policy is being implemented on ground to monitor drug abuse and take remedial measures to curb the menace.

The DC sought cooperation from the families particularly from parents to overcome the menace among the youth which also leads to other social evils and crimes. He said parents have an important role to keep the youngsters away from the use of drugs and also the family support for the affected people could lead them towards normal life.
