Court rejects bail plea in kidnapping & rape case

JAMMU: Additional Sessions Judge Udhampur Dinesh Gupta rejected bail application of one Arshad Ahmed, who was facing trial in rape and kidnapping case.

Additional Sessions Judge Udhampur Dinesh Gupta after hearing APP Himanshu Parkash observed that in the instant case prosecution raised allegation of kidnapping and rape against accused, which are grave and heinous offences punishable under sections 366/376/109 IPC, while on the other hand accused/applicant took the defence that both the accused/applicant herein and prosecutrix with their free

will and consent enter into wedlock and executed Nikahnama and duly notarized Marriage agreement was also executed by the prosecutrix. "During investigation, after the recovery of prosecutrix, the statement of Prosecutrix was recorded under section 164. "Prosecutrix in her statement as well as when appeared as a witness before the court categorically denied the assertion of marriage and further stated that accused kidnapped /abducted her and committed rape with her. Further in the instant case the statement of other material witnesses is yet to be recorded which includes the father of the prosecutrix, so in the backdrop of discussion, it cannot be held that accusations leveled against the applicant are frivolous. There is material on record to prima facie show the involvement of the applicant in the alleged crime. So keeping in view the heinousness of crime, exercising discretion for grant of bail in favour of the applicant would not be in the public interest," the court observed and dismissed bail plea.

Martyrs of Barshala massacre remembered

JAMMU: On fifth of January, 1996 Pakistan sponsored terrorists massacred 16 Hindus at Barshala in Doda district. On Thursday Doda Visthapit Samiti organised a program at Belichrana in Jammu and paid homage to the martyrs . People hailing from various places Ramban, Kishtwar; Doda putting up at Doda basti Jammu came in large number to pay homage to the martyrs of Barshala. Many people from erstwhile Doda district are residing at Jammu as the displaced persons.

After paying the homage to the martyrs displaced persons , pledged to go back to their erstwhile homes and demanded that first of all UT government and central government should come forward with special package . Displaced persons asked the government to remove the encroachments from their lands which has been occupied by the locals in their ancestral villages.

Representatives of Doda Visthapit Sewa Samiti Anil Kumar, Diler Singh, Ranjit Singh along with Koushal Sharma, Ashraf Shah, Manzoor Hussain were present at this moment.

It is worthwhile to mention that on January 5th, 1996 the terrorists of the Harkat Ul Ansar organization massacred 16 Hindus in one go. At that time people were watching a television program in one of the homes. Those who were martyred were Hansraj Sharma, Som Dutt Sharma, Jagdish Kumar, Bhushan Kumar; Manohari Lal, Shashi Raj, Smil Kumar; Shiv Kumar; Shashi Pal, Krishan Dutt, Rajinder Kumar, Swami Raj, Ajay Kumar , Bhushan Kumar.

PUBLIC NOTICE

Registration of Dairies & Gaushalas

As per the revised guidelines for "Environmental Management of Dairy Farms and Gaushalas" issued by Central Pollution Control Board in terms of Order passed by Hon'ble NGT, all the Dairy owners & Gaushala operators within JMC limits are once again informed through this notice that they shall register their Dairy units/ Gaushalas with JMC through online mode at jansugam.jk.gov.in within 30 days of the publication of this notice. This is also applicable to the livestock owners within JMC limits having animals for individual sustenance.

All the provisionally registered dairy/ Gaushala units which are having 15 or more animals must obtain consent to operate from JKPC.

The dairy owners/ Gaushala operators who fail to register their units (Dairy farm/ Gaushala) with JMC within Stipulated time period, shall not be allowed to operation within JMC limits without issuing any further notice and also matter shall be taken up with JKPC to impose environmental compensation as per the CPCB methodology.

It is further informed that no new dairy unit/ Gaushala shall be allowed to open within JMC Limits without obtaining prior NOC from JMC and consent to establish from JKPC. In case of any violation, the action under rules shall be initiated, against the violators. defaulters. For detailed guidelines regarding opening of new dairy unit/ Gaushala, Kindly visit jkspcb.nic.in.
