You are directed number of times through this office and sub division office notice to start the incomplete left out work and execute its construction on war footing basis with no further delay but are making lame excuses after a laps of more than 01 year. The Assistant Executive Engineer PWD(R&B) Sub-Division Ramban vide above cited reference notice has reported that you have complete only 70% of the work and tile work, painting work and furnishing work still pending for the reason not known to this office. This type of negligent working is viewed very seriously by the undersigned, as the progress of work is monitored by the higher Authorities on monthly basis and undersigned has to cut sorry figures in the high level meetings.

As such you are finally directed to start the above said building work by 1st of January, 2024 and expedite its construction on war footing basis with no further delay, and complete the same on war footing basis by deploying adequate men and machinery at any cost, failing which action under Registration rules shall be initiated against you. In case of your failure your CDRs/EXTRA CDRs/FDR/Normal deposit meant for the work shall be confiscated and you shall be debarred from participation in tendering process at least 1-2 years which may be noted.
