The Union home ministry, in a notification, highlighted the group's involvement in raising funds from various sources, including Pakistan and its proxy organisations, to support unlawful activities such as sustaining terrorist acts and orchestrating stone-pelting incidents against security forces in the region.

In addition, the notification underscored the group's disregard for constitutional authority and its repeated calls to boycott assembly elections, displaying a lack of belief in the democratic system of governance.

The central government's decision to ban the Tehreek-e-Hurriyat for five years stems from its concern that the group, if left unchecked, would persist in advocating for the secession of Jammu and Kashmir from India while disputing its accession to the Union.

The group's activities were deemed prejudicial to the integrity, sovereignty, security, and communal harmony of the country, with a potential to perpetuate a false narrative and anti-national sentiments among the people of Jammu and Kashmir.

In exercising powers conferred by the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967, the central government officially declared the TeH, Jammu and Kashmir, as an unlawful association for the next five years, effective immediately.

This measure reflects the government's commitment to curbing activities that pose a threat to the territorial integrity, security, and sovereignty of the nation, aiming to maintain public order and discourage sentiments of disaffection against India.

The reward for information leading to action against terrorists will also continue. The reward ranges between Rs 2 lakh and Rs 12.50 lakh, depending on the category of the terrorist, they said.

He pointed out that the record business on Diwali proved that every Indian is giving importance to the mantra of 'vocal for local'.

"Even today many people are sending me messages pertaining to the success of Chandrayaan-3. I am sure that, like me, you too feel proud of our scientists and especially women scientists," he said.

"When 'Natu-Natu' won the Oscar, the whole country rejoiced with fervour. Who would not have been happy to hear about the honour accorded to the 'The Elephant Whisperers'? Through them the world saw the creativity of India and understood our bonding with the environment," Modi said.

He pointed out that this year Indian athletes also performed marvellously in sports with Indian players winning 107 medals in Asian Games and 111 medals in Asian Para Games.

"Indian players won everyone's heart with their performance in the Cricket World Cup. The victory of our women's cricket team in the Under-19 T-20 World Cup is very inspiring. The achievements of players in many other sports added to the glory of the country," Modi said.

Now Paris Olympics will be held in 2024, for which the whole country is encouraging its players, he added.

"Whenever we made efforts together, it has had a very positive impact on the development journey of our country.

"We experienced successful campaigns such as 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' and 'Meri Mati Mera Desh'. We are all witness to the participation of crores of people in them. Construction of 70,000 'Amrit Sarovars' is also our collective achievement," he said.

Modi said he has always believed that the development of a country, which does not give importance to innovation, stops.

"India becoming an innovation hub is a symbol of the fact that we are not going to stop. In 2015, we were ranked 81st in the Global Innovation Index, today our rank is 40th," he pointed out.

Modi also underlined that this year, the number of patents filed in India was high, of which about 60 per cent were from domestic funds.

This time the highest number of Indian universities had been included in the QS Asia University Rankings, he said.

"If we start making a list of these achievements, it can never be completed. This is just a glimpse of how effective India's potential is, we have to take inspiration from these successes of the country; these achievements of the people of the country; take pride in them, make new resolves," Modi said.

He stressed that when India turns developed, the youth will benefit the most.

"But the youth will benefit more when they are fit," he said.

"Nowadays we see how much talk there is about lifestyle-related diseases, it is a matter of great concern for all of us, especially the youth. For this 'Mann Ki Baat', I had requested all of you to send inputs related to Fit India. The response you people have given has filled me with enthusiasm," the prime minister said.

A large number of startups have also sent suggestions on NaMo app and have discussed many of their unique efforts, Modi noted.

Through India's efforts, 2023 was celebrated as the International Year of Millets, he said, adding that this has given a lot of opportunities to the startups working in this field.

Modi also talked about at length the importance of physical and mental health.

"I am very happy to know that Mumbai-based startups like Infi-Heal and YOUR-Dost are working to improve mental health and wellbeing. Not only that, today a technology like Artificial Intelligence is also being used for this," he said.

He urged listeners to heed the advice and experiences of well-known people who then talked about physical and mental health during the broadcast.

NIA scaled up...

Besides getting five of India's most wanted, including Arsh Dala and Rinda, listed as "individual terrorists", four terror outfits were banned by the Centre in 2023 on NIA's proposal, the official said.

The official said a total of 68 cases were registered this year as the agency went against 'Jihadis', operatives of terrorist outfits active in Punjab, Naxals and gangsters in a big way in 2023.

These cases encompass 18 Jihadi terror cases in multiple states, three cases from Jammu and Kashmir, 12 cases of LWE, seven cases involving terrorist and organised criminal activity in Punjab, five cases of the Northeast, and two cases related to Fake Indian Currency Notes (FICN).

A total of 1040 pan-India searches and raids were conducted in the outgoing year against 957 the previous year, leading to the arrest of 625 accused - 28 per cent more than 490 arrested in 2022, the agency said, adding the arrested include 47 absconders, including five deported from the Philippines and the United Arab Emirates (UAE).

The agency arrested 65 accused in ISIS cases, 114 arrested for jihadi terror cases, 45 accused of human trafficking cases, 28 accused of terrorist and organized criminal activity and 76 accused of Left-Wing Extremism (LWE) cases.

As many as 513 accused were charge-sheeted during 2023, against 459 in 2022, the official said.

The agency said Rs 56 crore worth of assets belonging to the accused and suspects were attached as part of a strategy to squeeze terror funding and dismantle transnational terror-criminal networks.

"In 2022, the agency had attached a total of 37 properties worth Rs. 10.53 crore, while in 2023, the figure went up to 240 (including 156 bank accounts) with a total value of Rs. 55.90 crore.

"These properties belonged to the accused and suspects involved in terrorism, LWE, explosives and other prominent cases. The attachments, made under various provisions of UA(P)A, included 12 properties (of which four were bank accounts), worth Rs. 1.5 crore, of six listed 'Individual Terrorists'," she said.

The NIA achieved a "stupendous" 94.70 per cent conviction rate, with 74 accused sentenced in various cases in the outgoing year; the official said

"The number of persons charge-sheeted and convicted stood, respectively, at 513 and 74, as against 459 and 79 in 2022. The 74 accused convicted during 2023 were sentenced to various quantum of 'Rigorous Imprisonment' and 'Fines' as punishment," she said.

The agency said massive crackdowns across states were conducted to bust ISIS and Hizb-ut-Tahrir terror modules.

A two-day anti-terror conference was organised in November to strengthen, synchronise and boost nationwide response to terror; the official said.

The agency arrested 47 suspects, 14 more than the last year, who were on the run.

"One of the biggest breakthroughs in this regard came with the arrest of a key absconding accused in the Attari border heroin seizure case, involving smuggling of over 102 kgs of the narcotics from Afghanistan via the India-Pak border.

"Also, arrests made upon deportation and extradition signify NIA's commitment to

pursuing offenders across its international borders. While Amritpal Singh alias Ammy, Amrik Singh, Manpreet Singh alias Peeta and Mandeep Singh were deported from the Philippines, Vikram Brar was arrested upon deportation from the UAE," she said.

The number of searches and raids by the NIA also recorded a significant increase over the previous year, going up from 957 in 2022 to 1040 in 2023.

The agency's crackdown on violent Jihad across India proved to be a huge accomplishment for the NIA during 2023, which saw several modules of the banned global ISIS being busted through nationwide raids and searches, she said.

"A total of 15 accused were arrested in December, following raids at 44 locations in Maharashtra and Karnataka, which also led to the seizure of huge amounts of incriminating materials.

"A similar crackdown led to the arrest of eight operatives of the ISIS Ballari module on 18th December; thus enabling the NIA to foil the banned global terrorist organisations' plans to carry out a series of terror acts, especially IED blasts, across the country. Crackdowns were also carried out against such radicalised Jabalpur and HuT modules in Jabalpur and Bhopal in separate cases in September," she said.

The NIA action on the terrorist-gangster nexus resulted in the registration of two cases, charge-sheeting of 55 persons, 253 raids, 27 arrests and the attachment of 18 properties in 2023.

"Further, consistent coordination with international agencies has resulted in action against foreign nodes of the Syndicate. The arrest of Deepak Ranga, the prime accused in the RPG attack on the intelligence headquarters of Punjab Police, has been one of the most significant achievements of the NIA against terrorist-gangster syndicates," she said.

Ranga was wanted in several cases of terrorism and criminal acts being the alleged chief executioner of terrorist activities of Harvinder Singh Sandhu alias Rinda who is based in Pakistan and Lakhbir Singh Landa who is based in Canada- both are members of the proscribed terrorist organisation Babbar Khalsa International (BKI) and both are designated 'Individual Terrorists'.

"Another significant action against the terrorist gangster syndicate was the arrest of Manpreet Peeta, the right-hand man of Designated 'Individual Terrorist' Arsh Dala who was running widespread terrorist and extortion activities for Arsh Dala while based in the Philippines," she said.

Another target category for NIA during the year was Left-Wing Extremism, with massive crackdowns carried out against cadres and sympathisers of the banned CPI-Maoist and People's Liberation Front of India (PLFI), she said.

"Two accused were arrested in one such crackdown, involving raids across four states in an extortion and levy collection case, on 15th December. Besides an Indian Army uniform, arms and ammunition, digital devices and documents along with gold and silver jewellery as well as cash were seized during the raids," she said.

The NIA arrested Dinesh Gope, the PLF supremo, a splinter group of CPI (Maoist), in May 2023 who was on the run for almost two decades and wanted in more than 150 cases of state police as well as the NIA, and was carrying a cumulative reward of Rs 30 lakh announced by the state police and NIA for his capture.

The year 2023 also witnessed a sharp focus by the NIA on countering human trafficking involving Bangladesh and Myanmar nationals at the Indo-Bangladesh border; she said.

The agency managed to get six individuals, namely Mohammed Amin Khubaiab alias Abu Khulabalab alias Pinna alias Muhammed Amin Butt, Arbaz Ahmad Mir, Dr. Asif Maqbool Dar, Arshdeep Singh Gill alias Arsh Dala, Harvinder Singh Sandhu alias Rinda and Lakhbir Singh Landa, designated as 'Individual Terrorists' by the Union Government in 2023.

In addition, four terrorist organisations - The Resistance Force (TRF), People's Anti-Fascists Front (PAFF), Jammu & Kashmir Ghazvay Force (JKGF) and Khalistan Tiger Force (KTF) - have been banned in response to the proposal made by the NIA.

"The agency is actively pursuing necessary actions against these designated individuals and terrorist organisations to effectively counter their activities," she said.

J&K's industrial landscape...

Rs. 28,400 crore, NCSS offers a comprehensive package of incentives to attract businesses to Jammu & Kashmir. These incentives included capital investment subsidy, interest subvention, and GST-linked benefits, making the UT a lucrative destination for entrepreneurs.

The scheme has gained impressive momentum in just two years, with a total of 672 units registered under NCSS, a testament to its impact.

In 2023-24, a total of seven Secretary Level Committee (SLC) meetings were held, under the chairmanship of Vikranjeet Singh, Commissioner Secretary, Industries & Commerce Department and facilitated by Dr. Arun Kumar Manhas, Director Industries & Commerce, Jammu, and Khalid Majeed, Director Industries & Commerce, Kashmir as its Member Secretary for their respective Directorates.

These meetings approved the registration of 304 units, with 218 from Jammu Division and 86 from Kashmir Division. These units represent a diverse range of sectors, including manufacturing and services, indicating the scheme's broad reach and impact.

Furthermore, NCSS has already started disbursing substantial incentives. In 2023-24, Rs. 62.5 crore were approved through Capital Investment Incentive (CII), Rs. 19 crore through Working Capital Interest Subvention (WCIS), and Rs. 1.44 crore through Capital Interest Subvention (CIS). These approvals and subsequent disbursement are directly empowering businesses, enabling them to expand their operations and create new employment opportunities.

With 6 more SLC meetings planned in the remaining quarter of FY 2023-24, J&K is well on track to surpass the Department of Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIT) target of Rs. 150 crore in incentive disbursement. This achievement will be a significant milestone in the UT's industrial journey.

While NCSS marks a new chapter in J&K's industrial development, the Industrial Development Scheme (IDS) 2017 continues to play a crucial role. Launched as a precursor to NCSS, IDS offers its own set of incentives, including central capital investment support, interest subsidy, GST reimbursement, Insurance etc.

In 2023-24, IDS SLCs approved incentives worth Rs. 13 crore for J&K. These additional incentives complement the support provided by NCSS, further strengthening the industrial ecosystem in the UT. Besides, Rs 4 crore have also been approved by State level committee under Central Package I & II to the Unit holders of J&K.

Moreover, besides the central incentives UT Government also supports the Industries through different incentives viz DG Set, Pollution Control Devices etc provided under J&K Industrial Policy. Till date, more than Rs 10 crore have been approved under State package excluding GST Reimbursement which is granted by State Taxes Deptt, J&K.

The efforts of Industries & Commerce Department are paving the way for a vibrant and robust industrial landscape in Jammu & Kashmir. With a focus on attracting investment, fostering innovation, and creating a conducive business environment, the UT is poised for sustained industrial growth in the years to come.

This transformation will not only generate employment opportunities but also contribute significantly towards J&K's overall economic development and prosperity.

manufacturing, Singh said that the production has crossed the record figure of Rs 1,00,000 crore for the first time.

"The total value of India's defence exports, which was Rs 1,521 crore in 2016-17, has increased almost 10 times to reach a record level of Rs 15,920 crore in 2022-23," he stated.

Singh also spoke about the change of attitude over the years and highlighted the working style of the present government in tackling any situation.

"India is no longer tolerant of the 'let-it-be' approach. Today, under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the new India believes in the 'let's-do-it' approach," he added.

On the issue of women empowerment, Singh said the government has taken steps to ensure proper representation of women in all sectors including the military.

"Today, women are walking shoulder to shoulder with men in every field in the country. From fighter planes to Chandrayan, there is no field in which the presence of women is not seen," he added.

Emphasising on the role of youths in making the country developed, the Defence Minister said that the idea of making India an economic and military superpower is based on the confidence in the capabilities of talented youths.

"To empower the youth and enhance their capabilities, our government has promoted start-up culture and innovation ecosystem," he added.

Mentioning the start-up culture initiated by the Defence Ministry in the Defence industrial sector; Singh said the Innovation for Defence Excellence (iDEX) has been successfully promoting innovative ideas since its inception.

"Because of the various efforts by the government to promote entrepreneurship among youths, today there are over one lakh start-ups in the country," he said.
