is "unacceptable". "India has taken a serious note of the highly objectionable visit of the British High Commissioner in Islamabad, along with a UK Foreign Office official, to Pakistan occupied Kashmir on January 10," it said.

"Foreign Secretary has lodged a strong protest with the British High Commissioner in India on this infringement," the MEA said.

"The Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh are, have been and shall always remain an integral part of India," it said in a statement.

has brought about a huge improvement in the situation. "We have launched a multi-pronged crackdown on terror and terror networks. Apart from neutralising terrorists, hundreds of their sympathisers, OGWs, have been arrested. We have started attaching properties of those who support terror voluntarily. This has acted as a deterrent," he told PTI during an interaction.

He said the strict implementation of the rule of law has dealt a big blow to the teror ecosystem. "Violence has drastically come down after police started to strictly implement the rule of law," the officer added.

Over the last couple of years, police have cracked down on overground workers or terror associates in Jammu and Kashmir, booking them under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act. Hundreds of properties, including those of militants and terror associates, worth crores of rupees have also been attached as part of the

The officer added that the people have understood the futility of violence.

"They want to go on with their normal, routine lives and want to reap dividends of eace. We have seen the impact of the maintenance of peace. Life is going on nor mally, businesses are flourishing, educational institutions are running normally, and ourism has achieved new heights," he said.

The senior officer said upgrading police stations and deploying specially trained police personnel have lent a huge help to area domination exercises and keeping a vatch on inimical elements.

"This has helped in maintaining peace," he added.

Crediting low recruitment of local youngsters into terror ranks as another main eason for the decline in violence, the officer said the youths of Kashmir have understood that nothing can be achieved by picking up arms.

Recently, at the annual year-end press conference of the Jammu and Kashmir Police, Director General of Police R R Swain had said while 130 youngsters had joined the militant ranks in 2022, the number dropped to 20 in 2023.

On the issue of targeted killings, the senior police officer cited above said terrorsts adopt this strategy to create disturbances and hamper peace.

"We have devised a counter-strategy and taken several steps, including issuing strict SOPs within the department," he said.

The officer further said while 'hybrid militants' were active in the Valley, their num-

On reports of militants in Jammu and Kashmir using new technologies, he said there are countermeasures for all new technologies.

"We are capable enough to counter any such measure. If there is some new technology, security agencies also work on that and find ways to counter it," he told PTI. The officer also said that security forces have succeeded to a large extent in stopoing the infiltration of terrorists and arms and ammunition along the Line of

Control (LoC) in the Kashmir valley. "There has been less or no snowfall this time due to which there could be attempts to send more infiltrators. But we are on alert. We have maintained a strong and strict (counter-infiltration) grid," the officer said.

 $understand\ the\ importance\ of\ having\ good\ relations,"\ he\ said,\ adding\ that\ India\ was$ involved in building roads, power transmission lines, supply of fuel, providing trade access, investing and having people spend holidays in other countries.

These are parts of how a relationship is developed, though sometimes things do not go the right way and one has to reason with people to bring it back to where it should be, the EAM pointed out.

Asked about the United Nations not being able to prevent most wars but some of its members having been successful in denying India a permanent seat in the Security Council, Jaishankar said the UN used to be relevant in the 1950s and 1960s and the five nations in the Security Council used to dominate other countries due to a

What has happened in the past 30-40 years means it is no longer the case, Jaishankar said, adding the limitations of the UN are now visible and many people believe India, one of the largest economies in the world, must be there (in the Security Council as a permanent member).

He pointed out that no one expected a united outcome post the G20 meetings held last year under India's presidency but "we managed".

"Every passing year, the world feels India should be there but the world does not give things easily and generously. 'Kabhi kabhi lena padta hai' (sometimes we need to step forward and take it). We will keep moving on," the EAM said.

Asked about the large number of Indians surrendering their passports to settle abroad despite India being the fifth largest economy in the world, Jaishankar said

"In a democracy, you have to accept some individual choices because that is the nature of life. But the best answer is how we can provide more and better employ-

ment opportunities in India," he said. Jaishankar added that one should not look at people moving abroad in the negative

sense since it is a matter of pride that in sectors like hospitality, aviation, shipping etc Indians are willing to take employment to contribute.

"Because wherever they work, its is a plus point for us," he claimed. One being asked about some of the prominent achievements of the country in foreign affairs, he said the relation with the United States of America was negative or difficult from 1947 to the next 50 years but began changing for the better under the

prime ministership of Atal Bihari Vajpayee. There is a difference in how USA views India today, he said.

"They recognise the importance India holds, especially in technology. The enthusiasm in American businesses for India has changed. They were never very strong earlier. The relationship with Australia has changed significantly," the EAM said.

The relationship with Gulf nations has also changed if one sees the trade, political and security confidence, he said.

"Next month we will be seeing the opening of the Swaminarayan Temple in Abu

Dhabi (in the United Arab Emirates). To me there is a profound change in the way that country is looking at us," he added.

Junagadh and Madhda," he said.

Disrespectful: Hansal Mehta on Omar's criticism of show's filming in J&K assembly complex

MUMBAI: Director Hansal Mehta has responded to National Conference Vice-President Omar Abdullah's criticism of filming of a show in the Jammu and Kashmir Legislative Assembly complex, saying that such an "unwelcoming attitude" is the reason why India is considered an "unfriendly shooting location".

Abdullah, the former Chief

Minister of the erstwhile state of J&K, had on Friday criticised the Jammu and Kashmir administration for allowing shooting of Huma Qureshi-starrer "Maharani" inside the assembly complex and called it an "absolute shame".

Mehta, the maker of critically-acclaimed series like "Scam 1992" and "Scoop", replied to Abdullah's post on X, calling it "disrespectful" and "regressive".

"Why is it a shame? How is filming of a drama demeaning democracy or the mother of democracy'? Everybody on a film set including actors, background actors(called extras' by you) are all citizens of this country and have every right to work with dignity and deserve respect and understanding- at least from somebody as educated as

yourself," the filmmaker

In countries around the world, filmmakers and actors are allowed to use public places, government buildings and council halls for shooting, Mehta added.

"It is because of this unwelcoming attitude that India is considered an unfriendly shooting location and we often prefer shooting abroad. I have great respect

for you but this feels very disrespectful, regressive and myopic," the filmmaker said. "Maharani", created by

Subhash Kapoor, was shot inside the assembly complex in Jammu in June last year. The series is inspired by political turns in Bihar in the 1990s when the then Chief Minister Lalu Prasad, mired in the infamous fodder scam, installed his wife Rabri Devi as his successor.
