



Ram Mandir construction technically assisted by atleast 4 National Institutes: Dr Jitendra

NEW DELHI: Shri Ram Mandir construction has been technically assisted by atleast four leading National Institutes of CSIR (Council of Scientific & Industrial Research) and DST (Department of Science & Technology) under Ministry of Science & Technology, in addition to certain inputs from other institutions like IITs as well as ISRO (Indian Space Research Organisation).

Disclosing this here on Sunday, Union Minister, Dr Jitendra Singh said, the four institutes which made a significant contribution include CSIR -Central Building Research Institute (CBRI) Roorkee; CSIR - National Geophysical Research Institute (NGRI) Hyderabad; DST - Indian Institute of Astrophysics (IIA) Bengaluru and CSIR-Institute of Himalayan Bioresource Technology (IHBT) Palampur (HP).

CSIR-CBRI, Roorkee has

majorly contributed towards Ram Temple construction; CSIR-NGRI, Hyderabad gave significant inputs on foundation design and seismic safety; DST-IIA Bengaluru provided technical support on Sun's path for Surya Tilak and CSIR-IHBT Palampur has made tulips bloom for the divine Ram Mandir Pran Pratishtha ceremony in Ayodhya on 22nd January, said the Union Science Minister.

Dr Jitendra said, the main temple building, which is 360

ft long, 235 ft wide and 161 ft high, is made of sandstone quarried from Banshi Pahadpur, Rajasthan. Cement or iron and steel is not used anywhere in its construction.

The Structural Design of the 3-storey temple is designed earthquake resilient and can withstand strong tremors of magnitude 8 on the Richter scale for as long as 2,500 years, he said.

"CSIR-CBRI, Roorkee has contributed towards Structural Design of the main temple, designing

Surya Tilak mechanism, design vetting of temple foundation, and Structural Health Monitoring of main temple," he said.

Dr Jitendra said, besides CBRI, the CSIR-NGRI Hyderabad also gave significant inputs on foundation design and seismic/ earthquake safety.

Few IITs were also part of expert advisory committee and even Space technologies from ISRO have been used in the construction of the grandiose structure, he said.

A unique feature of the Ram Temple, said Dr Jitendra, is the Surya Tilak mechanism, designed in such a way that the Sun rays will fall on the forehead of Lord Ram's Idol at 12 noon on Sriram Navami day every year for about 6 minutes.

Ram Navami, celebrated on the ninth day of the first month of the Hindu calendar, which is usually in March-April, marks the birthday of Lord Rama, the seventh incarnation of Lord Vishnu,

he said.

The Science & Technology Minister said, Indian Institute of Astrophysics Bengaluru provided technical support on Sun's path and Optica, Bangalore is involved in manufacturing of the lenses and brass tubes.

"Gear box and reflective mirrors/lenses have been arranged such that sun rays from Third floor near Shikara will be brought to Garbha Griha using well known principles of tracking Sun's path," he said.

Dr Singh said, CSIR labs spread across the country represent the modern day monuments of New India. Indian Institute of Integrative Medicines (IIIM) Jammu is leading the Aroma Mission and Purple Revolution, he said.

Dr Jitendra said, PM Modi has in the last ten years stressed on the fusion of traditional and modern knowledge through an extended integration of all schools of thought.

DC Srinagar visits One Stop Centre for Women, Dist Hub for Empowerment of Women

SRINAGAR: Deputy Commissioner (DC), Srinagar, Dr Bilal Mohi-Ud-Din Bhat Today undertook a visit to One Stop Centre for Women (OSC) and District Hub for Empowerment of women (DHEW) here at Bemina and took stock of the functioning of both the facilities/services.

Chief Planning Officer, Assistant Commissioner Revenue, SDM West, District Social Welfare Officer, Staff members of DHEW, OSC and other concerned were present on the occasion.

While reviewing the functioning of the One Stop Centre (OSC) for Women, the DC was given a detailed appraisal about the Centre that has been established to provide assistance to women facing physical violence, sexual, physiological, or emotional abuse in private and public spaces.

During the visit, the Deputy Commissioner took first hand appraisal about the functioning of the Centres and enquired about the facilities being given to the women in distress. the incharge and other staff and victims of violence, the DC stressed them to work with added zeal and commitment towards their duties. He stressed them to treat victims in a compassionate way and ensure their issues are resolved in a time bound manner.

Similarly, the DC also inspected the District Hub for Empowerment of Women

established with the objective to facilitate inter-sectoral convergence of schemes and programmes meant for women (women centric Schemes) with the mandate to create an environment in which women realize their full potential.

He was apprised about the functioning of the Office and the linkage of women beneficiaries who have been benefited and assisted through the office of the District hub for empowerment of women.

District Mission Coordinator informed the DC, who is also the Chairman Mission Shakti that total 2289 women have been benefited/linked since April 2023 till date at the Centre, besides 164 awareness programmes were also conducted so far.

With regard to the upgradation of infrastructure, the DC asked the concerned to take up the necessary landscaping and beautification works for the centres.

During his visit, the DC

kick started the National Girl Child Week 2024 under Bati Bachao Beti Padhao with the signature ceremony to save the Girl Child and educate them at the office of the District Hub for Empowerment of Women Srinagar.

Later, the Deputy Commissioner visited Abhinandan Home Solina and Adoption Centre 'Phulwari' at Sanat Nagar and took stock of both the Centres.

At Abhinandan Home, Solina, the DC took a first-hand assessment of facilities available at and requirements of the school for children with special needs.

He also held a detailed interaction with the staff and management, besides interacted with the students at Abhinandan Home Solina.

The DC also spent an hour with students of the school on the occasion to encourage and boost their morale and confidence.

The DC stressed the concerned Staff to work with added zeal and dedication besides treat the students in a compassionate manner. On the occasion, the children with special needs enrolled in the Institute putforth several issues before the Deputy Commissioner.

The DC listened to the children's issues patiently and passed instructions to the concerned for early redressal of their issues.

ROC J&K participates in meeting of Regulators of Corporate Sector in country held

JAMMU: Two-day high profile meeting of Regulators of India's Corporate Sector (ROCs and RDs) chaired by Secretary Corporate Affairs took place at Indian Institute of Corporate Affairs, Manesar on the 19 & 20th of January, 2024.

In the workshop, besides the periodical review of the Inquiry, Inspections & Investigation cases, the review and stock take of the pending prosecution complaints/chargesheets lying with various Courts was also conducted.

Under the chairmanship of the Union Secretary, Corporate Affairs, the performance of each office and office bearers was evaluated jointly by the Additional Secretary and Director General Corporate Affairs. Emphasis was laid upon to take all the cases of Inquiry, Inspection and Investigation to the logical conclusion in time bound manner.

The pending Investigations are to be completed in time bound manner so as to file the charges sheets in the Courts wherever applicable and for others to go for the

in-house adjudication done by the respective Registrar of the Companies (ROC).

The Northern Region comprises the offices of ROC NCT of Delhi & Haryana, Jammu Kashmir & Ladakh, Chandigarh, Uttarakhand and Kanpur.

ROC J&K was represented by Haamid Bukhari and he apprised the top officials about the status of different cases for which the prosecution has been filed either in the Courts of CJsMs or in the specialised courts of Additional Sessions Judges, Anti Corruption.

Particular emphasis was laid upon the Non-compoundable cases pending before Sessions Court where the punishment is imprisonment for more than two years and upto 10 years.

Bukhari also apprised the higher ups about the status of different Investigations and Inquiries that the office in J&K is being allocated and mandated to complete.

Besides, the showcase studies of different Investigations was displayed to be replicated by other offices, like the Raids of ROC Chennai on certain

firms and the search and seizure apparatus that was used to carry forward the proceedings.

ROC Delhi gave a detailed power point presentation where in, he highlighted his crackdown on the companies unlawfully being controlled by the entities without disclosures.

Further detailed discussions took place to fine-tune the Search and Seizure operations defined under the Companies Act, 2013.

The stock take exercise concluded with the setting of targets for each office towards the closure of this financial year, in terms of the prosecutions pending in the courts, and completion of the matters where in, Inquiry, Inspection and Investigations are going on.
