CAA implementation within a week: Union minister

KOLKATA: Union minister Shantanu Thakur on Monday claimed that the Citizenship (Amendment) Ports. Act or CAA will be implemented across the country within a week. Trinamool Ruling

Congress in West Bengal, on the other hand, dismissed the claim as a "poll rhetoric", while vowing to prevent CAA implementation in the state.

Thakur, the BJP MP from Bongaon Lok Sabha seat, which has a substantial population of Matua community, outlined plans for swift implementation of the contentious legislation within seven days.

The CAA, enacted by the BJP-led government at the Centre in 2019, seeks to grant Indian citizenship to persecuted non-Muslim including immigrants, Hindus, Sikhs, Jains. Buddhists, Parsis, and from Christians. Bangladesh, Pakistan, and Afghanistan who entered India before December 31,

Addressing a public rally

at Kakdwip in South 24 Parganas district on Sunday evening, Thakur, also the Union Minister of State for Shipping, and ys, said, "Ram Waterways, said, Mandir has been inaugurated. Within the next one week, CAA will be implemented not only in West Bengal but also across the

Continuing his critique of the TMC government in West Bengal for its staunch opposition to the CAA, he said, "This state government claims that if you have voter and Aadhaar cards, vou are a citizen of this country and can cast your votes. If that is the case, then why is it that thousands of people here have been deprived of their right to vote? The chief minister has to answer why these people have been deprived."

He emphasised the imperative of implementing the CAA to safeguard future generations.

Speaking to reporters in on Monday, Thakur, also a prominent Matua community leader, reiterated, "I stand by what I stated yesterday. The CAA will be implemented within seven days. This is my guar-

"We are the ones who took to the streets to protest against the NRC (National Register of Citizens). They (BJP) are now chanting CAA as they aim to politicise it before the elections. Everyone is a citizen of this country; if they are not voters of this country, how are they benefiting from central government schemes?" she

TMCThe supremo advised locals in Cooch Behar, particularly Rajbanshis, to ensure that their names are on the vot-

ers' list to "protect them-

selves" from the CAA. The West Bengal BJP unit declined to comment on Thakur's statement but expressed optimism about the CAA's implementation before the 2024 Lok Sabha polls.

"I cannot comment on what he (Thakur) said; only the government can speak about it. The government and the party are two separate entities in our system. However, I have confidence in Union Home Minister Amit Shah that the CAA rules would be drafted before the Lok Sabha elections," said BJP state president Sukanta Majumdar.

Last month, Shah had reiterated that the implementation of CAA is inevitable as it is the law of the land.

During a BJP meeting in Kolkata, he accused Banerjee of misleading people on the CAA issue.

Non-appearance of accused cannot be ground to cancel bail in criminal case: SC

NEW DELHI: The mere non-appearance of an accused personally before a court cannot be a ground for cancellation of bail in a criminal case, the Supreme Court has held.

The ruling by a bench of Justices BR Gavai, Sanjay Karol and Sandeep Mehta came while hearing an appeal against a Calcutta High Court verdict dated September 6, 2023.

The high court had cancelled the bail of Krishna Sharma on the ground that he failed to appear before it despite the court's direction

"However, we find that merely because the appellant did not appear personally could not have been a ground for cancellation of bail," the apex court

It said the parameters for grant of bail and its cancellation are totally different.

"The bail already granted may be cancelled if it is found that the person who has been granted the benefit of bail has violated any of the conditions or misused the liberty by influencing the witnesses or tampering with the evidence," the bench said in its January 24 order. The top court, while setting

aside the high court verdict, said nothing of that sort has been recorded in the judgement

The bench noted the submission of Sharma's counsel that he could not attend the high court proceedings on the said date as there was a traffic jam due to VIP movement. It noted that Sharma's lawyer

also could not be present in the high court as his Vakalatnama (power of attorney) stood with-The high court had recorded

in the judgement that neither Sharma nor his counsel was present in the court on the said

"This exposes an insolent stance of opposite party No.2 (Krishna Sharma) to evade the process of law," the high court had said and ordered. 'Accordingly, we are constrained to cancel the bail of opposite party No. 2 and direct non-bailable warrant to be issued for his apprehension. Trial court shall take necessary steps for issuance of such process and its execution in accordance with law.

EC announces biennial elections for 56 seats on Feb 27

NEW DELHI: The Election Commission on Monday said that the biennial Rajya Sabha polls will be held on February 27 for 56 seats, as the tenure of incumbents including forprime minister Manmohan Singh and BJP president J P Nadda will end in April.

The vacancies also include seats held by nine Union ministers including Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, Minister Education Dharmendra Pradhan, Environment Minister Bhupendra Yadav and Health Mansukh Minister Mandavi

The nomination process will begin on February 8 with the issuance of the notification.

While 50 members retire on April 2, six do so on April 3, the EC said. Others retiring in April

include BJD members Prashanta Nanda and Amar Patnaik (Odisha), BJP chief spokesperson Anil Baluni (Uttarakhand) and Fisheries Minister Parshottam Rupala, and Congress members Naranbhai Rathwa and Amee Yagnik from Gujarat.

Minister State for Affairs Muraleedharan, **MSME** Minister Narayan Rane, former Union minister Prakash Javadekar, Congress member Kumar Ketkar, NCP member Vandana Chayan and Shiv Sena (UBT) member Anil retiring from Desai areMaharashtra.

Uttar Pradesh will have the highest number of vacancies of followed by seats, Maharashtra and Bihar (six each), Madhya Pradesh and West Bengal (five each), Karnataka and Gujarat (four each), Odisha, Telangana, Andhra Pradesh (three), (two) Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana Chhattisgarh (one each).

For renomination to Raiva Sabha, BJP president J P Nadda will have to look for a seat outside his home state of Himachal Pradesh as the Congress is in power there.

The Congress can also look forward to sending its nominees to the Upper House of Parliament from Karnataka and Telangana -- the states where it came to power last year. In Karnataka, four Rajya

Sabha members are retiring, and in Telangana, three.

In Maharashtra, the Rajya Sabha elections will be keenly watched after the political realignment in the state due to splits in the NCP and the Shiv

In Karnataka, the retiring areRajeev Chandrasekhar of the BJP and L Hanumanthaiah, G C Chandrashekhar and Sved Hussain of the Nasir Congress

BRS' Joginipally Santosh Ravichandra Kumar Vaddiraju and B Lingaiah Yadav are the retiring members from Telangana. The Congress which is ruling in Telangana, can hope to send at least two of its nominees to Rajya Sabha from the state.

at popular tourist spots like Sonamarg and Gulmarg, the tourists used to make a beeline to places like Sinthan Top connecting Anantnag district with Kishtwar which remains covered under snow for most of the year.

Meanwhile, authorities have issued advisories to tourists and locals visiting places like Sonamarg and Gulmarg.

They have said only 4X4 vehicles and those with antiskid chains would be allowed to travel towards Gulmarg and Sonamarg due to slippery conditions in the wake of snowfall.
