city, the work of circular road was started by the government about 5 years ago but due to unknown reasons it is stuck in limbo and it should be completed soon.

Due to lack of any public parking in Rajouri city, on one hand the city residents have to face problems and on the other hand people coming from outside also have to face problems, hence public parking should be made in Rajouri as soon as possible. Since there is no warehouse in Rajouri city, the traders here

have to face problems and this also affects their business. A demand was made to DC to set up a warehouse soon. The dream of a mini secretariat in Rajouri was shown many years ago but till now only a place has been identified for the mini secretariat and this should also be completed as soon as possible.

Property of drug peddler seized

BISHNAH: Police on Tuesday attached property of a drug peddler.

As per details, an information was received at Police Station Bishnah regarding one drug peddler who was involved in narcotics trade from long time. On this special police teams of Police Station Bishnah with the help of CCTV footages of the area arrested the accused person namely Baldev Raj alias Raju, son of Kalu Ram, resident of O Kothey Bulanday Tehsil Bishnah, District Jammu.

It is pertinent to mention that accused was previously arrested in multiple cases presently detained under PIT NDPS and lodged in



Distt. Jail Ambphalla Jammu for commission of offences punishable under 8/21/22 of NDPS Act 1985 and Exeise act. Moreover during investigation it has been found that the accused is holding immovable property of description of having two residential houses situated at village Kothey Bulanday Tehsil Bishnah, District Jammu which has been derived from proceed of illegal Narcotic traffic in contravention of provisions of NDPS Act. The said property of the accused has been seized as per the provisions of section 68-F of NDPS Act 1985.

Further investigation of the case is going on.

Extend date, grant full relief package to refugees: Ravinder Sharma

JAMMU: JKPC has supported the demand of POJK, Chammb & West Pakistan refugees for extension of the date for the disbursement of sanctioned relief amount of Rs 5.5 lakh from last date tomorrow (31st Jan) till further orders and also grant of full package for them by NC- Congress government to centre in 2014.

JKPC Senior Vice President & Chief Spokesperson Ravinder Sharma has urged the government to consider the most genuine demand of the displaced community, who had lost everything during migration and still their generations are facing lot of hardships and issues of settlement. There are large number of eligible families who are unable to get some documents because of old records of 75 years being untraceable or there are some litigations besides there is need to review some formalities, leading to delays in the matter of POJK as well as West Pakistan refugees.

The government should be very lenient & sympa-

thetic in such matters and still those left out families should be covered by ease to basis. He also regretted that the daughters & their off springs are also entitled to relief when there is no male member. It's matter of relief not inheritance of evauee property, which as Tenancy rights are deprived to inherit against law of equality.

Sharma demanded full package along with all it's components, without any delay otherwise it's great injustice to them. Rather after ten years, the package should be revised as per current price index.


