
Wanted HM terrorist **Javaid Matoo arrested** from Nizamuddin area STATE TIMES NEWS

NEW DELHI: The Delhi Police's Special Cell on Thursday arrested a Hizbul Mujahideen terrorist, wanted in 11 terror attack cases in Jammu and Kashmir, from the national capital, an official said.

It is a major breakthrough, Special Commissioner of Police (SCP) HGS Dhaliwal said at a press conference.

Javaid Ahmad Matoo, 32, a highly indoctrinated terrorist carrying a reward of Rs 10 lakh, was arrested from Delhi's Nizamuddin area. He was driving a stolen car when he was apprehended, police said.

Matoo is named in "11 known terror attack cases", including five grenade attacks and killing of at least five police personnel in sperate incidents, in Jammu and Kashmir, Dhaliwal said and added that he is a member of the terrorist outfits Hizbul Mujahideen and Al

JAMMU: A magnitude 3.9 earthquake hit Kishtwar district in the early hours of Thursday, officials said. There were no reports of any loss of life or damage

to property, they added. The earthquake, with its epicentre near Kishtwar, occurred at 12.38 am, the National Centre Seismology said.

The quake hit at latitude 33.34 degrees north and longitude 76.67 degrees, at a depth of five kilometres. An earthquake of magnitude 4.3 on the Richter Scale iolted Afghanistan
