## Over Rs 67 lakh penalty imposed on two stone crushers for illegal mining in Ujh River

KATHUA: Over Rs 67 lakh penalty was imposed on Magnum stone crusher and SK Stone crusher for illegal mining in Ujh River on Sunday.  
The penalty was imposed by District Mineral Officer (DMO) Rajinder Singh after measurement of large number of pits around the stone crushers from where the minor mineral was excavated and lifted for processing.  
The DMO informed that earlier several complaints and video of illegal excavation with the help of heavy JCB chain machines by the these stone crushers surfaced on the social media.



Taking cognizance of the matter, team of mineral guards was deputed by DMO to collect the data and evidences after capturing geo-tagged photos and videos of all the illegal mining sites around the stone crushers.  
After calculating the penalty, notices were served upon owners of stone crushers to deposit whole amount in seven days positively besides strict warning

for adhering to rules and guidelines of Geology and Mining department.  
The DMO further informed that regular operations are being conducted in the Rivers- Ujh, Ravi, Tarnah, Bhini, Sahar, Mager and other local Khads where mineral leases and stone crushers. He said strict action shall be initiated for illegal mining.

## Kisan Mela witnesses installation of First Hi-tech Poly House

KISHTWAR: In a milestone achievement, the farmers of Sub Division Paddar on Sunday received the first High-tech Poly House erected over a 500 square meter area under the Holistic Agriculture Development Programme.  
This unique component, aimed at promoting niche crops, was constructed at a cost of Rs 17.65 lakhs.  
Deputy Commissioner Kishtwar Dr Devansh Yadav along with concerned officers and PRIs members inaugurated the poly house at the Sub Divisional Agriculture complex in Gulabgarh, today.  
The polyhouse is fully equipped with high-tech features supporting a constant temperature throughout the year; required relative humidity, and irrigation facilitated through laid drop lines. This infrastructure enables year-round cultivation of cash crops and vegetable seedlings.  
The technology of high-tech poly houses is a boon for progressive farmers opting for Hydroponics (Soilless culture of growing plants), wherein nutrients are circulated in soilless media to fulfill the plant's nutritional require-

ments. effort of the Agriculture and

Simultaneously, the Deputy Commissioner Kishtwar presided over the Kisan Mela at Gulabgarh Paddar.  
Present at the event were DDC member Paddar Hari Krishan Chauhan, PRIs, CAO Kishtwar Amjad Hussain Malik, CHO Sajjid Mustafa, AD Fisheries Lal Hussain, Tehsildar, BDO, SDAO Paddar Sahil Gandotra and other field functionaries from concerned departments.  
The event, a collaborative

## JKTJAC demands resolution of issues of teaching fraternity

UDHAMPUR: A monthly meeting of Jammu Kashmir Teachers' Joint Action Committee (JKTJAC) under the leadership of UT President Vinod Sharma and District President Udhampur Lekh Raj Parihar held at Udhampur on Sunday. The meeting was attended by the JKTJAC representatives from all the eleven zones of the district.  
While speaking on the occasion Mr. Vinod Sharma raised various genuine and burning issues of the teaching fraternity and appealed the authorities to resolve them amicably for the welfare of thousands of teachers of the UT.  
Raising the issue of comprehensive transfer policy in favour of teachers appointed under ReT scheme he said that these teachers have been working in the same schools for last more than two decades and suffering badly including females due to non avail-

ability of transfer policy. He appealed worthy Administrative Secretary School Education for consideration of the genuine demand of transfer policy for the welfare of thousands of these teachers who have been serving in far flung areas even during militancy when other Teachers hesitated to serve there. He also urged him ( Administrative Secretary) to accord approval to 24 inter district mutual transfer files , conversion of headteachers posts into non plan posts of masters so that many headless middle schools get justice, clear cut directions from Administrative Department regarding providing permission to Teachers and masters to enhance their qualifications and consideration of already accorded permissions by DSEJ/CEOs .  
While speaking he appreciated the teachers friendly attitude of worthy Director School Education Jammu by issuing mutual transfer

orders of two districts and hoped similar approach to issue regularisation orders of ReTs who have completed 5 years ReT period, conversion of RRETs to Teachers Grade II/III and mutual transfer orders of other districts.  
Other demands highlighted on the occasion included Raising Grade of teachers at par with their counter parts in other UTs; Filling up of vacant posts ZEOs as many zones are headless, Issuance of DPC list of teachers to master.  
He also demanded the settlement of GP fund ( Refundable and non refundable ) cases of teaching and non teaching staff of education department which are lying in different treasuries for last 6 to 8 months due to non availability of cash.  
Speaking on the occasion Lekh Raj Parihar demanded the release of Mid Day Meals dues which the teachers have managed from their own pockets as recently released amount was too

short to meet out the already incurred expenses.
