The owners who have already let / sub-let/ $\rm rented$ out their $\rm house(s)/$ business establishment or part(s) thereof to any tenant(s) on any date prior to the Issuance of this order, shall within ten days after-the issuance of this order, submit without fail the detailed particulars of the outsider(s) working in Industries/ construction companies/business establishment / domestic helpers/tenants (commercial and agricultural) as per the declaration form to the concerned Police Station.

It is clarified that individuals relating to all arrangements of letting or sub-letting the property like Paying Guest, Tenants (Commercial and Agricultural) etc. shall also be covered by this order.

Owners who have allowed Jhuggi's in their lands shall also be required to disclose the details as per the declaration form.

Every SHO in district Samba shall conduct verification of outsiders working In Industries/ construction companies / business establishment / domestic helpers/tenants (commercial & agricultural) and also maintain a separate register for such pur-

Every Tehsildar, through the Institution of Lambardar, Chowkddar and through PRI Members shall disseminate the information about this order and the need for mandatory disclosure of details of outsiders especially in border villages

Any person found violating the aforementioned order shall be dealt with, in accorlance with law. Since it is not possible to serve the order individually, it is being ssued ex-parte. Sr. Superintendent of Police, Samba shall ensure enforcement of said order in letter and spirit.

The order shall come into force with immediate effect and shall remain in force for a period of two months from the date of its issuance, If not withdrawn or rescinded earlier.

"Therefore, we are focusing on the future of the poor, farmers, women and youth. For us, these are the four biggest castes of the country. When the poor, farmers, women and youth are empowered, the country will become powerful," he said.

Addressing the gathering, Prime Minister Modi noted that the Yatra completed 50 days recently and has connected with about 11 crore people.

"Vikas Bharat Sankalp Yatra has become not only the journey of the government out also the journey of the country," he said. "Modi ki guarantee wali gaadi' is reaching every nook and corner of the country.

The poor people who spent their lives waiting to get the benefits of government schemes are seeing a meaningful change today. "The government is reaching the doorsteps of the beneficiaries and proactively pro-

riding the benefits," the prime minister said. Along with the vehicle of 'Modi ki guarantee', government officers and people's rep-

resentatives are reaching the people, he added. Since the Yatra began, 12 lakh new applications for Ujjwala connections were

received along with lakhs of applications for Suraksha Bima Yojana, Jeevan Jyoti Yojana, PM SVANidhi, Modi said.

Underlining the impact of the Yatra, the prime minister said health checkups for nore than two crore people have been carried out so far including one crore TB checkups and 22 lakh sickle cell checkups.

The doctors are reaching the doorsteps of the poor, Dalits, deprived and the tribals which was considered a challenge by the previous governments, Modi said.

He also highlighted Ayushman Yojna which provides health insurance worth Rs 5 lakhs, free dialysis for the poor and low-cost medicines at Jan Aushadhi Kendras.

"Ayushman Aarogya Mandirs built across the country have become huge health centres for villages and the poor," he added.

Modi also spoke of the government's impact on women empowerment in the country and mentioned the availability of loans through the Mudra Yojna, women playing the roles of Bank Mitras, Pashu Sakhis and Asha workers.

He pointed out that 10 crore women have joined women self-help groups in the last 10 years, where more than Rs 7.5 lakh crore have been provided to them.

Due to this, Modi said, many sisters have become 'Lakhpati Didi' over the years. Touching upon its success, the prime minister talked about the government's campaign to further increase the number of 'Lakhpati Didis' by two crore.

When the Jammu and Kashmir assembly in Srinagar was attacked in October 2001, the terrorists were looking for me, Abdullah said.

"I had left the assembly just five minutes before the attack to meet the governor we were Indians, we are Indians and will die Indians. Had we wished to go with Pakistan, we would have done it in 1947 and nobody would have stopped us," the National Conference leader said.

He said the last Dogra ruler Maharaja Hari Singh himself had reached an agreement with both India and Pakistan, seeking time to take a call as he was neither willing to go to Pakistan nor India and was interested in independent Jammu and

"Then Pakistan raided the region If Sheikh Mohammad Abdullah (NC founder) and his party had not been with him (Maharaja), we would have never been a part

He also said "some parties" were misleading the people on various pretexts like a legislation which talked about allowing those who had gone to Pakistan to return and resettle in Jammu and Kashmir.

Abdullah said he has always said that nobody is going to return from Pakistan and it is the prerogative of the Indian government to allow them back but the people were misled and seeds of hatred were sowed in their hearts.

He also referred to the abrogation of Article 370 granting special status to J&K and said it was neither India nor Pakistan but the Maharaja who introduced certain laws in 1927 to safeguard the land and jobs of his poor subjects from the natives of

neighbouring Punjab

Abdullah also questioned the appointment of outsiders in top positions in the police and universities in Jammu and Kashmir. He said when nobody was willing to fight elections in 1996, it was the NC under his leadership which came forward for the people.

"It was a time when they were afraid of visiting Kashmir or the border areas of the Jammu region, fearing terrorist attacks. We ensured all closed schools in villages were open within one year, reconstructed 700 small and major bridges, placed doc tors in hospitals and worked for all sections of the society without any discrimination." he said.

He said the people have no access to the civil secretariat as the bureaucrats are not answerable to the public.
