It has also been ensured that the caretakers working at every cow shelter stay there at night and do the necessary work smoothly for the care of the cows.

The Chief Minister has directed that the nodal officers at the district level should regularly inspect the cow shelters and ensure that there is no shortage of fodder, straw, water, light etc. Apart from this,
