JAMMU: The Post Police Pounichak headed by ICPP Pounichak PSI Vijay Kumar has seized/Challaned Royal Enfield Bullet



motorcycles equipped with modified silencers and pressure horn's that were causing noise pollution and public nuisance in the area and also seized seven two wheelers that were found plying on roads without documents and numbers plates.

This action follows numerous complaints from residents disturbed by the loud noises produced by these modifications. Authorities have announced plans to extend enforcement efforts to other areas of Rural Zone of Jammu and to target individuals and businesses involved in selling and installing these unauthorized silencers and those who are using unregis tered vehicles, in accordance with the Motor Vehicles Act.

It's important to note that unauthorized modifications to vehicle silencers and plying vehicle without number plates and documents are illegal under the Motor Vehicles Act. Such alterations not only contribute to noise pollution but can also reduce the efficiency of the bike and pose safety risks. Besides this these unregistered vehicle are widely getting used for numerous criminal activities including snatching and drug peddling. Authorities are urging vehicle owners to refrain from making such modifications and are warning of strict penalties for those who continue to violate these regulations.

Crackdown on illegal mining, 8 vehicles seized

Bovine smuggling bid foiled; 42 bovines rescued, 3 vehicles seized

During naka checking duty at Bikram chowk naka, Police party o PP Nehru market intercepted one truck bearing registration no JK-13E -4142 and during checking found 25 bovine ani mals loaded in merciless manner without food and fodder without any valid permission for transportation of bovine animals. The driver of the vehicle managed to flee away from the spot taking the advantage of darkness but one person namely Mohd Ladi S/O Abdul Rashid R/O Sikanderpur Bishnah was apprehended on the spot. In this regard, cog nizance has been taken as FIR No. 12/2025 of PS Gandhinagar under relevant Sections and all the bovine ani mals rescued and investigation of the case started. Police sta tion Gharota also foiled one bovine smuggling attempt in which 05 bovines were rescued from a vehicle bearing regis tration number No. JK02DH/9819 which was coming from Jammu towards Nagrota via ring road Kheri when naka party signal him to stop, driver of the vehicle fled away from the spot leaving the vehicle there by taking advantage of the darkness. 5 bovines were rescued and vehicle seized.
