India Open: Spotlight on Satwik-Chirag as jumbo Indian contingent aims to end two-year title drought

NEW DELHI: The contingent is the biggest ever but focus would be on a handful of tried-and-tested names, especially the men's doubles Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty, when Indian shuttlers go up against a worldclass field in the India Open Super 750 tournament beginning here Tuesday.

Despite the name, Indian success at the tournament hasn't been particularly regular with none from the host nation winning any title in the past two editions.

The 46-strong group that will take the court this week would be desperate to make some amends after an ordinary Olympic campaign six months ago.

The expectations would be especially high from Satwik and Chirag, who claimed the doubles title in 2022, the same year in which the currently erratic Lakshya Sen notched the men's singles top

More than 200 players from powerhouse badminton nations such as India, China, Japan, Denmark, South Korea and Indonesia will be in action this week.

Chirag and Satwik, who are former world number ones, have made a good start to the season by reaching the semifinals of the Malaysia Super

"The last time we came here was after playing the final of the Malaysia Open and reached the final here also. This time also we have started (the year) with a semi-final in Malaysia and want to improve on last year's results," Chirag said.

"It is our home tournament and we really want to go one better than last year. Playing in different conditions, the first few rounds are tricky to get used to. Some stadium are fast and some slow but we have been in circuit for 7-8 years, so we are accus-

While the Indians have shown impressive form, they will be seeking improvement in quick rallies and service variations in a bid to better their runners-up position in the tournament last year.

ister Hardeep Singh Puri flayed the AAP on Monday over the Delhi High Court's observations on its government's failure to place certain CAG reports before the Assembly and asserted that the party will get a blow from the voters in the upcoming polls in the capital for "suppressing" the national auditor's Hearing a petition filed

by some Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) MLAs, the high court said on Monday that the reports of the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India on the city administration should have promptly been placed before the Assembly for discussions, but the government of the National Capital Territory "dragged its feet", raising "doubts on its bonafides".

"It is crystal clear. You (the AAP government) have delayed (placing the

Assembly)," Puri told PTI when asked for his comments on the court's observations in the matter.

He said the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) government should have sent the reports to the Assembly speaker and lieutenant governor as soon as it received those, and initiated discussions in the House on the CAG's find-

The BJP leader said when the CAG takes up "any issue" for auditing, it provides an opportunity to every stakeholder to submit their comments.

"You (the AAP govern-

ment) comment (on the CAG's observations) and say that it is not right. But they put the report(s) under the carpet," he said. There was no immediate

reaction from the AAP on the BJP leader's charge. Puri also

slammed Arvind Kejriwal over the issue and said the AAP the national auditor in 2017 saying the Congress would have sold the country had there not been the CAG, is now "suppressing"

its reports. The Union minister pointed out that the high court has fixed January 16 as the next date of hearing

in the matter.

"First, a slap will come from the court. The second slap will come from the poll results," he said, suggesting that the AAP will suffer a setback in the upcoming Delhi Assembly election for allegedly keeping the CAG reports under the carpet so far. The 70-member Delhi Assembly will go to polls on February 5 and the votes will be counted on February 8.

In the 2015 and 2020 Delhi Assembly polls, the AAP won 67 and 62 seats respectively. The BJP won three seats in 2015 and eight in 2020, while the

The court framed charges of murder and other offences against Tytler on September 13 last year. A witness claimed Tytler came out of a white car in front of the gurdwara on November 1, 1984, and instigated a mob against the community, leading to the killings
