PM Modi approves 8th Pay Commission 1.15 cr central employees, pensioners to be benefitted

DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday approved setting up the 8th Pay Commission to revise salaries of nearly 50lakh central government employees and allowances of 65 lakh pensioners.

The chairman and two members of the Commission will be appointed soon, I&B Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw told reporters here.

The term of the 7th Pay Commission will end in 2026. Since 1947, seven Pay Commissions have been constituted, with the last one implemented in 2016.

As the 7th Commission's term concludes in 2026, initiating the process in 2025 ensures sufficient time to receive and review recommendations


