

CCIU refunds defrauded amount of Rs. 1.07 Lakh

SAMBHA: Cyber Crime Investigation Unit (CCIU) of Samba Police has refunded defrauded amount of rupees one lakh seventy five hundred (Rs.107500.00) in two different online financial fraud reported by the complainants.

Complainants namely Rommit Sharma, son of Kewal Krishan, resident of Bara tehsil Vijaypur district Samba and Abhay Khajuria, resident of Jakh tehsil Vijaypur district Samba have lodged online financial fraud complaints in National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal in which fraudsters cheated them of Rs.100000.00 & Rs. 7500.00 respectively.

A team of Cyber Crime Investigation Unit headed by Inspector rank officer under the supervision of DySP Hqrs. and under the overall supervision of SSP Samba displayed relentless efforts and advanced technical skills, leading to the successful refunding of all the defrauded amount of Rs.107500.00 to the complainants.

Three drug peddlers nabbed with 10.30 grams heroin, two with 4 grams heroin

SAMBHA: Intensifying vigorous drive against drug peddlers/smugglers, Samba Police has arrested five drug peddlers in two separate incidents in Vijaypur & Ghagwal area and recovered 10.30 grams approximately heroin like substance and 4 grams approximately heroin like substance respectively from their possession.

A Police party headed by SHO PS Vijaypur under the supervision of SDPO Vijaypur and under the overall supervision of SSP Samba while performing vehicle checking duty at nake NIHW AILMS Vijaypur, intercepted an alto car bearing registration No. JK06-3434 for its checking. During checking, 10.30 grams approximately heroin like substance and four mobile phones were recovered from the possession of three persons travelling in the said car.

The drug peddlers identified as Akashjot Singh S/o Prabhjot Singh R/o W.No. 10 Mill Area RS Pura district Jammu, Sahil Kumar S/o Romesh Lal R/o Jasore tehsil R.S Pura district Jammu and Pawandeep Singh S/o Narinder Singh R/o Chatha district Jammu have been arrested and contraband item has also been seized.

A case FIR No. 01/2025 U/S 8/21/22/29 NDPS Act has been registered at PS Vijaypur and investigation started.

It is pertinent to mention here that during the preliminary enquiry, it has surfaced that the accused persons have stolen the said alto car. During further checking, one battery was also recovered from the said vehicle.

Similarly in another incident, a Police party headed by Incharge Police Post Rajpura under the supervision of SHO PS Ghagwal and DySP Hqrs Samba and under the overall supervision of SSP Samba during vehicle checking naka established near Nursery Sanoora, intercepted a motorcycle

bearing registration No. JK21F-9647 for its checking. During checking, 04 grams approximately heroin like substance was recovered from the possession of rider and pillion rider.

Both the drug peddlers identified as Kuljit Singh @Kalu S/o Bharat Singh R/o Sanoora tehsil Rajpura district Samba and Vivek Sharma S/o Parkash Chand R/O Harsath tehsil Ghagwal district Samba have been arrested and contraband item has also been seized.

A case FIR No. 183/2024 U/S 8/21/22/25/29 NDPS Act has been registered at PS Ghagwal and investigation started.

Extortion case solved; 3 accused persons arrested

SRINAGAR: In a significant achievement, Police in Srinagar has solved a case of extortion and physical assault with the arrest of three individuals involved in the commission of crime. On Dec 23, 2024, an individual namely Gh Mohiuddin son of Gh Hassan Sheikh resident of Firdous Abad B a t a m a l o o , approached PS Maisuma in an injured condition and submitted a written complaint stating therein that on 21st/22nd December, at around 0200 hours, while he was enroute to Budshah Chowk for sanitation work, he was wrongfully restrained by a group of assailants. The miscreants physically assaulted him and forcibly took some cash from his wallet before fleeing the scene.

Accordingly, a case vide FIR No. 30/2024 under relevant sections of law was registered in PS Maisuma and investigation initiated. Through meticulous efforts, including analysis of CCTV footage and other technical evidence, the investigating team arrested the individuals involved in the commission of crime. They have been identified as Ishfaq Ahmad Dar @Ish Mut son of Khurshheed Ahmad Dar resident of Nishat Khaki Mohalla, Srinagar, Tahir Ahmad Mir @90, son of Sonaullah Mir resident of Bangladesh Colony Rainawari, A/P Palpora Noorbagh, Srinagar and Arsalan Mushtaq Wandroo @Karihil, son of Mushtaq Ahmad resident of Hasibath Rainawari, Srinagar.

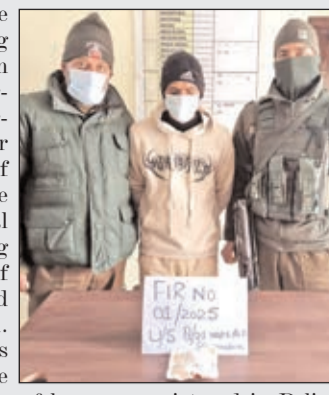
Police seeks help to identify accused person involved in theft case
