The Cabinet's decision to extend the one-time special package on Di-Ammonium Phosphate (DAP) will help farmers by ensuring the fertiliser at affordable prices,

Briefing media, Information and Broadcasting (I&B) Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw informed that farmers will continue to get DAP at Rs 1,350 per bag and the extra ourden will be borne by the central government.

"One-time special package up to Rs 3,850 crore is approved for DAP fertiliser," he

Asked about the ongoing farmer agitation in Punjab and why the government is unable to convince them, Vaishnaw said, "If you would have moved around during Haryana elections, farmers gave great feedback on 'Andolan' versus real welfare versus 'good to farmers', you would have yourself seen".

The special package on DAP will be provided over and above the approved NBS (nutrient-based subsidy) to ensure the smooth availability of DAP fertiliser to the farmers at an affordable price.

The Centre provides 28 grades of P&K (phosphatic and potassic) nutrients to farmers at subsidised prices through fertiliser manufacturers/importers.

The subsidy on P&K fertilisers is governed by the NBS Scheme, with effect from

April 1, 2010. "Continuing top most priority in keeping farmers' welfare in firm focus, Government of India has extended a massive relief to farmers in keeping the price

of DAP fertiliser unchanged," the statement said. In spite of geopolitical constraints and volatility of global market conditions, the government said it has ensured the availability of DAP to farmers at affordable

prices for Kharif and Rabi 2024-25. The Centre has provided Rs 11.9 lakh crore fertiliser subsidy during the 2014-24

period, which is more than double the subsidy of Rs 5.5 lakh crore during 2004-14. Later in a press conference, Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan said the Cabinet also approved the export of 1 million tonnes of non-basmati rice to Indonesia through National Cooperative Export Ltd (NCEL).

For the targeted infusion of technology in the implementation of the crop insurance schemes, the minister said the Cabinet also approved the creation of a separate Fund for Innovation and Technology (FIAT) with a corpus of Rs 824.77 crore.

It will help in the use of technology for faster assessment of crop damage, claim settlement and lesser disputes. It will also help in using digital technologies for easer enrolment and greater coverage, Vaishnaw said.

In terms of policies issued, the PMFBY is the country's largest insurance scheme and third-largest in terms of total premiums. About 23 states and Union territories are implementing it.

PMFBY and RWBCIS offer financial assistance to farmers suffering from crop oss or damage caused by various unforeseen events. PMFBY covers crop losses pased on yield risk, while RWBCIS focuses on weather-related risks

The IMD said La Nina conditions, characterised by cooler ocean surface temperatures in the central Pacific Ocean and usually associated with colder winters in north India, were expected to develop in January but would be short-lived.

"It is unlikely to significantly impact the warming trend," an IMD scientist told

June 2023 marked the first instance of a monthly global temperature crossing the 1.5-degree threshold, a trend that persisted throughout the year, except for July Under the Paris Agreement, a permanent breach of the 1.5-degree limit refers to

sustained warming over 20-30 years.

Experts warn that the world is now entering a phase during which temperatures will consistently exceed this threshold.

The global average temperature has already risen by 1.3 degrees Celsius compared to the 1850-1900 baseline, driven by the rapid accumulation of greenhouse gases such as carbon dioxide and methane in the atmosphere.

Meanwhile, minimum temperatures are expected to be higher than normal in most parts of India in January, except in some areas of eastern, northwest, and west-central regions, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said.

Maximum temperatures are also likely to be above normal for most parts of the country, except in parts of northwest, central and eastern India, and central parts of the southern peninsula, Mrutyunjay Mohapatra, director general of the India Meteorological Department (IMD), said during a virtual press briefing.

Western and northern parts of central India are expected to experience more cold wave days than usual during January, he said.

The IMD said rainfall in north India during January to March is likely to be below normal, with less than 86 per cent of the long-period average (LPA).

The average rainfall for north India during this period, based on 1971-2020 data, is about 184.3 mm.

Northern and northwestern states like Punjab, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, Uttarakhand, and Uttar Pradesh grow rabi crops, including wheat, peas, gram and barley, in winter (October to December) and harvest them in

On Tuesday night, the Jammu and Kashmir administration announced the release of the detainees and constituted a four-member committee to hold talks with the protesting civil society members.


# CS launches YUVA survey to identify 1.37 lakh entrepreneurs

# Three-decade-old security bunker in Srinagar city dismantled

SRINAGAR: Three decades after it was constructed, one of the oldest security bunkers in Srinagar city has been dismantled -- underlining the improvement in the Kashmir valley's security situation.

The security bunker, constructed by the Border Security Force (BSF) in the early 1990s, at Braripora in the city's Safakadal area is in the process of being removed "The CRPF (Central Reserve Police Force), which was occupying the bunker and my property adjacent to it, has left the place. The bunker was built in early 1990s,

said Jayiz Ahmad Alaie. Locals also welcomed the decision to remove the bunker. "While most security bunkers were removed from the city in the previous decade this continued to remain operational. This was probably the biggest bunker in the city and occupied most of the road," said Tanveer Ahmad, a local.

Claiming that the bunker's presence used to create frequent traffic jams during peak hours, he said vehicular movement would become more fluid following its removal. A senior security official said the process of removal and construction of security bunkers was constantly reviewed. "If a bunker is needed, we will construct it. If an existing bunker is no longer needed, we will remove it," the official said or the condition of anonymity.

# Security forces launch search operation in R S Pura sector

The troops also fired a few rounds during the operation, they said. Meanwhile, a drone was found in Akhnoor sector.

The search operation was launched near the IB in R S Pura sector after inputs were received about suspicious movement in the area. Border Security Force (BSF) troops fired a few rounds during the operation, the sources said.
