**JKEEGA expresses gratitude for clearance of regularization proposal for 200 JKPD Engineers**

JAMMU: Jammu & Kashmir Electrical Engineering Graduates Association (JKEEGA) has welcomed the clearance of the regularization proposal for over 200 engineers of the Jammu & Kashmir Power Development Department (JKPDD), in line with the Establishment Cum Selection Committee's decision based on the SAC decision of 2019. In a joint statement, Er Pirzada Hidayatullah, President of JKEEGA, and Er Sachin Tickoo, General Secretary of JKEEGA, expressed their gratitude to Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, Chief Secretary Atal Dulloo, and H. Rajesh Prasad, Principal Secretary of PDD, for their proactive role in clearing the proposal. They also acknowledged the efforts of the HRM section of PDD in this regard and expressed hope for further progress on the remaining cases. The approval of this regularization proposal is seen as a major step towards achieving zero percent adhocism in JKPD, a key goal outlined in the SAC decision of 2019. This decision also ordered a one-time exemption to bypass the JKPCS for the regularization of JKPD engineers. It is significant that, for the first time in a long while, senior engineers in JKPD, including those who have already superannuated or even current Chief Engineers, will soon begin drawing the salaries corresponding to the posts they occupy once formal orders of regularization are issued. The statement emphasized that the regularization decision is historic and the result of a constant struggle. Engineers, despite being on the frontline, have often performed their duties under difficult circumstances, but the in-charge culture had demoralized the cadre. The clearance of this proposal is expected to bring much-needed relief and motivate the engineers to perform even better. The JKEEGA leadership also expressed their heartfelt thanks to all engineers and employees of JKPD, AIPEE, and the office bearers of JKEEGA, both in Jammu and Srinagar, for their unwavering support throughout the struggle. Er Sachin Tickoo and Er Pirzada Hidayatullah also highlighted that the engineers, who had been under immense pressure in recent years, displayed great character by consistently raising their demand for regularization. It was their strong stance that paved the way for the clearance of the proposal. JKEEGA expressed its hope that the remaining engineers will have their regularization proposals processed quickly, ensuring the full implementation of the SAC decision of 2019. They appealed to Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, who also holds the charge of the Power Ministry, and Principal Secretary PDD to maintain the momentum and fast-track the next proposals for the remaining engineers, so that justice is done.

**Lady drug peddler arrested in NDPS case**

JAMMU: Reaffirming its zero-tolerance policy against drug peddlers, Jammu & Kashmir Police under Operation Sanjeevani conducted a major operation in Bishnah, arresting one notorious Lady drug peddler. The accused lady peddler has been identified as Kirna Kumari, wife of Joginder Kumar, resident of Kothey Chorli, Bishnah Sister of Sunny Sahansi.



The lady was arrested in continuation of the investigation of case FIR No. 203/2024 under relevant sections of the NDPS Act and Arms Act that was registered at Police Station Bishnah, Jammu. The arrest of the lady took place as result of detailed financial investigation/unearthing of backward linkages of the aforementioned case. The arrested accused

lady was part of a network responsible for one continuous drug supply chain, distribution in the area. The operation, led by SHO Police Station Bishnah, was executed under the supervision of SDPO R.S. Pura and SP Headquarters Jammu.

**Rajouri police recovers 35 grams heroin; three arrested**

Rajouri: Police on Monday recovered 35 grams heroine from th possession of three arrested persons. On January 20, 2025 a team from PS Rajouri, during routine vehicle and pedestrian checking at Kallar Nakka, intercepted a Tampo Traveller bearing registration number JK01W 2023 traveling from Jammu towards Poonch. The vehicle, which had a driver and two individuals, was stopped for checking. Upon noticing the police the individuals began acting suspiciously raising doubts. A thorough personal search of all was conducted which led to the recovery of 35 grams of

heroin-like narcotic substance from their possession. During questioning, the accused disclosed their identities as Javid Ahmed, son of Abdul Ghani resident of Samote Surankot Poonch; Abdul Aziz, son of Allah Ditta resident of Pamrote Surankot, Poonch and Umar Nazir, son of Nazir Hussain, resident of Draba Surankot Poonch. In this regard, a case under FIR No. 35/2025 under Sections 8/21/22/25/29 of the NDPS Act has been registered at PS Rajouri. All three accused have been arrested, and further investigation is underway to ascertain the backward and forward linkages of the case.

**Ex-CPFWA urges Govt to redress long-standing grievances of central paramilitary forces**

JAMMU: Ex-Central Paramilitary Forces Welfare Association, Jammu and Kashmir Unit urged the Central Government to redress the long-standing grievances and demands of Central Paramilitary Forces on priority. Addressing a press conference here today, V.K. Sharma (Retd. DIG) and Harinder Mahajan highlighted the ongoing issues faced by CPMF personnel, including disparities in their treatment compared to the Army. "One of the major points

raised during the conference was the discrimination faced by CPMF personnel since 2014, particularly with respect to their rights and benefits. "The CPMF personnel have not been granted One Rank One Pension (OROP), a benefit that was extended to the Indian Army, despite serving in similar high-risk conditions and facing similar challenges," they said adding that unlike their counterparts in the Indian Army, CPMF personnel have not received adequate pension hikes, further deepening the disparity in their financial treatment after retirement. They expressed concerns over the lack of comprehensive medical facilities for CPMF personnel. Raising the issue of Martyr's status, they said, CPMF personnel who lose their

lives in the line of duty do not receive the same recognition and benefits as soldiers of the Indian Army, which the association feels is unfair given their contributions to national security. V.K. Sharma, while addressing the press, emphasized that since 2014, the central government has treated CPMF personnel in a "step-motherly" manner. Despite their tireless work, including maintaining security in sensitive regions, CPMF forces continue to be deprived of the benefits that their counterparts in the Indian Army receive, he said. The association pointed out that none of the Directors General (DGs) of paramilitary forces have expressed favourable responses to the issues raised by their respective departments. Furthermore, the association expressed disappointment that Members of Parliament (MPs) from Jammu and Kashmir (UT), have not yet raised the issues of CPMF personnel in Parliament. Despite several appeals, no concrete actions have been taken to address the grievances of the forces, they

said. The association urged local Members of Legislative Assembly to raise these critical issues in the legislative sessions and seek resolutions from the government. V.K. Sharma welcomed the setting up of the 8th Pay Commission by the central government, but strongly requested that an active member from the CPMF be included in the commission. In the first week of February 2025, a delegation from the Ex-Central Paramilitary Forces Welfare Association (J&K UT) will meet Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir, Omar Abdullah, to present the problems faced by CPMF personnel, he said. The delegation will be led by Harinder Mahajan, under the guidance of V.K. Sharma. The members of the Ex-Central Paramilitary Forces Welfare Association (J&K UT) are part of the delegation include DK Chauhan General Secretary, CPMF Harbans Lal Sharma - Vice President, Noor Muhammad - President, District Samba, Surjeet Singh, Naresh Maini, Kirtan Singh and Gurdeep Singh.
