

## 2 drug peddlers arrested with 15.30 grams heroin

SAMBA: Continuing its drive against drug smugglers/peddlers, Samba Police in successive day has arrested two more drug peddlers in the jurisdiction of Police Station Bari Brahmana and recovered 15.30 grams approximately heroin (chitta) like substance from their possession.



A Police party headed by SHO PS Bari Brahmana under the supervision of ASP SDPO Bari Brahmana and under the overall supervision of SSP Samba during vehicle checking naka established near Vijay Steel Factory, intercepted a Ciaz car bearing registration No. JK02BW-6500 moving towards Bari Brahmana side for its checking. During checking, 15.30 grams approximately heroin like substance was recovered from the possession of two persons sitting in the vehicle.

Both the drug peddlers identified as Zahid Hussain, son of Zakir Hussain, resident of Leh Ladakh at present Sarwal Jammu and Karunesh Sharma S/o Mohinder Sharma R/o Sarwal Jammu have been arrested and contraband item has also been seized.

A case FIR No. 02/2025 U/S 8/21/22/25/29 NDPS Act has been registered at PS Bari Brahmana and investigation started.

## Notorious criminal booked under PSA

SAMBA: Acting tough against criminals, Samba Police today booked a notorious criminal under the Jammu & Kashmir Public Safety Act (PSA) and lodged him in District Jail Kathua.



The notorious criminal namely Akash Kumar, son of Khem Raj, resident of Chaek Haria tehsil Marheon district Kathua has been booked under PSA after obtaining formal detention order from the District Magistrate Samba. The booked criminal has been subsequently lodged in District Jail Kathua.

The said criminal is involved in multiple cases registered against him at PS Ghagwal of district Samba and PS Rajbagh of district Kathua. The repeated criminal activities of the said notorious criminal have posed a serious threat to public peace and tranquility in the region.

In order to refrain the subject from indulging in criminal activities, a dossier under PSA was recommended by SSP Samba against the subject, upon which the District Magistrate Samba after getting satisfied issued a PSA warrant against him.

The arrest was made by a police team headed by SHO PS Ghagwal under the supervision of DySP Hqrs Samba and under the overall supervision of SSP Samba.

The locals have highly appreciated the efforts of the Samba Police in curbing the criminal activities in the area.

## Burglar arrested, stolen property recovered

KISHTWAR: In a major breakthrough, J&K Police in District Kishtwar successfully cracked a case of gas cylinder burglaries in Kishtwar town and arrested the accused involved in the crime.

SSP Kishtwar, stated that Police Station Kishtwar had received multiple complaints regarding the theft of gas cylinders. Acting on these com-

plaints, a team led by IC PP Hidyal was constituted under the supervision of DySP Headquarters to investigate the matter.

The investigation team use advanced methods, including evidence collection, analysis of CCTV footage, and the use of technical tools. This rigorous effort led to the arrest of the main accused, identified as Arshad Hussain, son of Abdul Wahid, resident of Gourian. Stolen property, including gas cylinders, was recovered from his possession.

A case, FIR No. 05/2025, under sections 305/331(3) BNS, has been registered at Police Station Kishtwar, and further investigation is underway.

## Two drug peddlers arrested with heroin

JAMMU: As part of their ongoing efforts to combat drug trafficking under Operation Sanjeevani, Jammu Police achieved a significant breakthrough on 3rd January 2025. A police team from Police Post Sidhra, while conducting routine patrolling in the Waliabad area of Sidhra, noticed a pedestrian displaying suspicious behavior. The individual, walking from Raghoora towards Sidhra, attempted to flee upon spotting the patrolling team.

Acting swiftly, the team led by the In-Charge of Police Post Sidhra, managed to apprehend the individual on the spot. The suspect identified as Bagh Hussain, son of Alam Din, a resident of Khanpur Raj Bagh, Kathua, currently residing in Raghoora, Jammu. During a personal search, the team recovered approximately 8-9 grams of heroin like narcotic substance from his possession.

Consequently, a case has been registered under FIR No. 05/2024, U/S 8/21/22 of the NDPS Act at Police Station Nagrota, marking a decisive step in the fight against drug trafficking.

## Bootlegger nabbed with illicit liquor

POONCH: Continuing its drive against the sale of illicit liquor in the District, Poonch Police achieved major success by arresting 01 bootlegger and recovered huge quantities of illicit liquor in the jurisdiction of Police Station Surankote.

Acting on reliable information regarding sale of illicit liquor on 04-01-2025 police party of PS Surankote led by SHO PS Surankote Raided 01 suspected location in which 01 person who was selling illicit liquor in the jurisdiction of PS Surankote was arrested and recovered 104 Desi Whisky 180ml each, 22 Double cross bottles 180 ml each and 16 cans 500 ml God father beer.

The whole operation was conducted under the supervision of SDPO Surankote Ajaz Choudhary.

In this connection, case FIR No's 01/2025 U/S 48A and 48F Excise Act have been registered at Police station Surankote and investigation started.

## 2,200 litres of illicit kerosene & diesel seized; accused arrested

SHOPIAN: In a significant crackdown on illegal activities, Police in Shopian recovered illicit kerosene & diesel in the jurisdiction of Police Station Keller and arrested accused person involved in the commission of crime.

Acting on a specific information about selling of kerosene oil in black market at Karlcheck Berthipora area of Shopian. A police party headed by SHO Police Station Keller and Incharge Berthipora along with Executive Magistrate conducted search in the shop of one person namely

Showkat Ahmad Hajam son of Ab Gani Hajam resident of Karlcheck Berthipora. During search, police party recovered 11 barrels containing 1600 ltrs of kerosene oil and 600 ltrs of diesel from the said shop. The accused person involved in the commission of crime has been arrested.

Accordingly, a case vide FIR No. 02/2025 under relevant sections of law has been registered in Police Station Keller and investigation has been initiated. Preliminary investigation reveals that the accused was selling the Kerosene oil illegally in black market. Source of procurement of subsidised kerosene oil is being investigated and the officials involved in facilitating black marketing shall also be dealt as per law.

## 6 drug peddlers arrested; contraband substances recovered

SRINAGAR: Continuing its efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, Police have arrested 06 drug peddlers across Kashmir valley and recovered contraband substances from their possession.

In Srinagar, a police team headed by SHO Police Station Shalteng, at a surprise naka established at Lawaypora/ Mujumud Axis intercepted a suspicious person. During checking, approximately 22 grams of heroin like contraband substance was recovered from his possession. He has been identified as Mohammad Yaseen Bhat @Shaka son of Ghulam Ahmed Bhat resident of Astan Mohalla Gundhasibhat Srinagar.

Moreover, a police team of Police Station Zadibal at a checkpoint established at Sazgari Pora, apprehended a suspicious person namely Waseem Ahmad Bafanda son of Ghulam Ahmad resident of Dangerpora Malbagh Hazratul. During his personal search, 04 grams of heroin and cash ₹ 3020 was recovered from his possession.

In Sopore, a police team led by SHO Police Station Sopore under the supervision of SDPO Sopore, Shri Sarfaraz Bashir-JKPS at a checkpoint established at Adipora crossing intercepted a suspicious person carrying a polythene bag. He has been identified as Owais Bashir Shakari resident of Sher-Colony, Sopore. During search, 5.10 grams of a brown sugar like contraband substance was recovered. In Awantipora, a police team during naka checking in the jurisdiction of Police Station Tral apprehended a drug peddler identified as Aqib Qadir Sofi son of Ghulam Qadir Sofi resident of Gang Tral. During search, officers were able to recover approximately 01 kg of powdered charas like contraband substance from his possession.

Meanwhile, in Baramulla a police team headed by SHO Police Station Boniyar at a checkpoint established at Bela Crossing Boniyar, intercepted a suspicious person. He has been identified as Rafiq Ahmad Sheikh, son of Tariq Ahmad, resident of Hundi Nowshera. During search, 50 grams of a charas like contraband substance was recovered from his possession. During questioning, the accused disclosed that he had procured the contraband from a woman identified as Shameema Begum, wife of Mohd Maqbool Sheikh, resident of Lari Kasi Boniyar.

Acting on this lead, a police team accompanied by the concerned magistrate, searched the residential house of the said woman. The operation resulted in the recovery of 62 grams of charas-like contraband substance and 1 kg of charas powder. Further investigation is underway to uncover the broader nexus of this illegal activity.

All the accused persons have been arrested and cases under relevant sections of law have been registered at respective police stations. Further investigations have been initiated.

# Muradpur villagers protest forced land acquisition, submit memo to LG

JAMMU: The residents and landowners of Muradpur village in district Jammu submitted a memorandum to the Lieutenant Governor, Shri Manoj Sinha to express anguish over the forced acquisition of their ancestral land for the construction of a Court complex in the area.

The landowners, a majority of whom are displaced persons from 1947, claimed that the land is their sole source of income and livelihood, urging the Lieutenant Governor to intervene and halt the acquisition and construction activities.

Speaking to reporters after submitting the memorandum, Rajiv Chuni, chairman of SOS International and representative of the affected landowners, including Sushil Kumar, Vijay Kumar, Ranjeet Singh, Krishan Lal, Des Raj, Rakesh Kumar, Sanjeev Kumar, Gulshan Kumar, Vikas Sudan, Vinod Kumar, Ved Raj, Daleep Kumar, Satinder Dev and Dharamvir expressed concern over the plight of the dis-

placed persons, alleging that the authorities have acquired the land in the most unfair manner without consulting stakeholders.

"This land has been their lifeline since 1947. The forced acquisition without proper notice or fair compensation is a grave injustice with the people who have already suffered badly due to their displacement in 1947. We urge the administration to reconsider its decision and ensure justice is delivered to the affected people," Mr Chuni said.

Sharing further details, the senior refugee leader said, "The disputed land, spanning 75 Kanals, 17 Marlas, and 6 Sarsai falls under Khasra Numbers 29, 30, 32, 33, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 47/1, 48, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, and 88 in Muradpur. These hapless people have been in possession of the land since their displacement and have relied on it as a primary means of sustenance".

Chuni alleged that the district administration acquired their land without prior notice or proper consultation. "The acquisition process was non-transparent and that lands belonging to influential per-

sons were exempted from the acquisition which is sheer injustice with the displaced persons from 1947," he said.

He said the residents have raised concerns about the compensation offered, which they argued was grossly inadequate. "While the administration has proposed a compensation of Rs. 9.00 lakh per Kanal, the local residents claim that the prevailing market rate, as per revenue authorities in 2018, stands at Rs. 1.40 crore per Kanal. The government must either halt the acquisition and construction of the Court complex immediately or ensure that compensation is provided in line with the current market rate," the senior refugee leader said.

He said the major demands raised by local residents include the immediate suspension of the Court complex construction on their irrigated land to prevent environmental and livelihood damage and immediate cancellation of land acquisition because of unfair practices and lack of consent.

He requested the Lieutenant Governor to sympathetically look into the genuine and legitimate demands of the dis-

placed persons from 1947, and direct for necessary action

without any delay.

The Lieutenant Governor paid patient hearing to the delegation and issued telephonic instructions to the Deputy Commissioner Rajouri, directing him that land allotted to refugees should remain undisturbed. The Lieutenant Governor further directed the acquisition of only those land parcels that do not belong to the refugee community.
