Restore statehood to J&K without delay: Sadhotra urges BJP, Centre



Madhuparamhans delivers religious sermons



Delving into the fundamental elements of nature, he described how water is derived from fire, fire from air; and air from the sky element. These five elements—earth, water, fire, air, and sky—are referred to as physical elements, each possessing unique attributes such as color, movement, and taste. For instance, the earth element is yellow, with a circular movement and a sweet taste, as evidenced by children instinctively tasting mud. He pointed out that water, often described as colorless and tasteless by scientists, can be distinguished by its salty taste and white color. Through simple examples, he demonstrated that humans can identify water even with closed eyes, proving its distinct taste and color.
