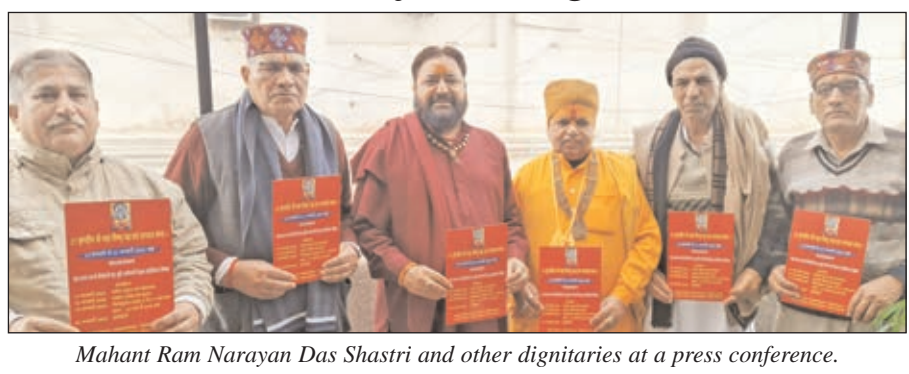

Arya Veerangana Dal J&K's winter camp concludes



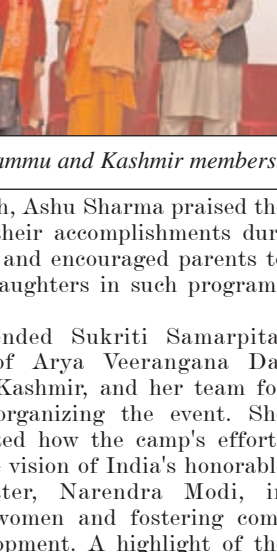
