acceptable at any cost . President SKUAST-TAJ pointed out that on one side, all the recommendations of the UGC related to appointment and CAS of teachers has been adopted by the Universities and on the other side, a rider has been put to enhance the age of the

Professors from 62 to 65 years, in only erstwhile State Universities of J&K namely SKUAST-Jammu, SKUAST-Kashmir, University of Jammu and University of Kashmir.

He further informed that there is always a dearth of experienced faculty at the level of Professor & equivalents in the Universities. The posts remain vacant due to non-availability of the candidates with the prescribed experience required for the position and to overcome the shortage of experienced Professors in the University, it is also imperative to enhance the retirement age of the experienced teachers / scientists from 62 to 65 vears without any condition. for utilizing their expertise in long term solution of the problems related to the research and academics.

An increase in retirement age of Professors without any review process will greatly support skilled / learned manpower and create a progressive atmosphere where senior faculty can contribute to sustain the New Education Policy and this will also be a positive and contributing step towards taking Indian science to the global platform, besides strengthening

1947 People and Advisory Board under SWD showcasing their superior Sixth day of NSS National Integration Camp filled with cultural exchange

JAMMU: The All J&K POJK 1947 Sharnarthi Intellectual Forum held a press conference to demand the constitution of a POJK 1947 People and Advisory Board under the Social Welfare Department (SWD). The forum stressed the urgent need for concrete measures to address the grievances of the displaced persons from Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (POJK) who have faced neglect for over seven decades.

The forum highlighted that, for the past 76 years, the POJK 1947 Sharnarthi community has been peacefully advocating for their legitimate rights through hunger strikes, rallies, and other democratic measures. In 1947, over ten lakh people were displaced due to Pakistan's aggression in Jammu and Kashmir. The displacement led to the loss of over 40,000 lives and the abandonment of significant moveable and immovable properties in POJK. Despite these sacrifices, successive governments have failed to recognize or compensate these losses. In stark contrast, the forum pointed out that families displaced from Kashmir due to militancy in 1989 received due claims and compensation, both in cash and kind. Meanwhile, POJK displaced persons have only received Rs 5.50 lakh per family as ex-gratia relief, which the forum described as discriminatory and inade-

The forum emphasized the need to establish a J&K Advisory Board for the development of POJK displaced persons, modeled



Basties in line with the commitments made by the Union Territory Government. A key demand was the provision of admissions for children from the POJK displaced community in All India Professional Colleges. The forum highlighted that similar opportunities are already extended to Kashmiri Pandit families and stressed the importance of educational empowerment for the younger generation of the POJK

In their concluding remarks, the forum urged both the Union Territory

Government and the Central Government to address these long-standing issues promptly. They stressed that the constitution of an advisory board and recognition of their legitimate demands are essential for ensuring justice and equality for the POJK displaced community.

The press conference was attended by prominent members of the forum, including Advocate Amrik Singh (President), Surjit Singh (General Secretary), S. Kuldeep Singh (Vice President), and others such as S. Paramjit Singh (Ex-Corporator), Charanjit Singh (Ex-Director, Citizens Cooperative Bank), Nasib Singh (Ex-Chief Manager, J&K Bank), Prof. K.D.
