ventive healthcare plays a crucial role in reducing the burden of disease and improving the overall quality of life. DC Kathua reviews progress of bunker construction works

KATHUA: Deputy Commissioner Kathua, Rajesh Sharma today chaired a meeting to review the progress of construction of bunkers being taken up in border areas of the district.

The meeting focused on assessing the status of ongoing works, identifying bottlenecks and ensur-



ing timely completion of the remaining bunkers.

The DC was informed that, against a total of 802 bunkers taken up in Kathua district, including 717 individual and 85 community bunkers, as many as 796 bunkers have been completed so far. At present, only six bunkers are under execution including one community bunker and five individual bunkers, while the rest have already been completed and handed over.

The DC stressed the need for expediting the pace of work on the remaining bunkers and directed the concerned executing agencies to ensure completion of all target bunkers by the end of January 2026. He emphasized that the safety and security of border residents remains a top priority of the administra-

tion and any avoidable delay in completion of the works will not be tolerated.

The DC also called upon the XEN REW to clear all pending financial liabilities in a time-bound manner so that the works are completed smoothly without any resource constraints. He directed officers to maintain close coordination at the field level and conduct regular monitoring to ensure adherence to timelines and quality standards.

The meeting was attended by Additional Deputy Commissioner Kathua, Vishavjeet Singh; Chief Planning Officer, Ranjit Thakur; Assistant Commissioner Revenue, Vishav Partap Singh; Block Development Officers of Marheen and Hiranagar, besides other concerned officers.

Whereas, Smt. Dazi Kumari Bhat, Incharge Head Assistant, Geology and Mining Department submitted a representation to the Director, Geology and Mining, J&K for correction of her name from Dazi Kumari Bhat to Dazi Kumari in her service record and;

Whereas, Director, Geology and Mining, J&K forwarded the said representation to the Administrative Department and recommended for change of her name in accordance with the rule governing the subject and;

Whereas, Finance Department vide Circular No. FD-Code/154/2022-03 dated: 10.05.2023 has notified the procedure for change of name by Government employees. The clause 1 of the ibid circular reads as under:-

- A Government employee wishing to adopt a new name or to effect any modification in his/her existing name may do so, formally by a deed changing his/her name. The sample deed form is enclosed.
- The execution of the deed should be followed by publication of the change in a prominent local newspaper at the Government employee's own expense.
- The change in the name shall be made with Aadhaar authentication and complete verification of record of e-HRMS.

Whereas, the matter was examined in the Department and was accordingly taken up with the Director Finance, Mining Department for his opinion regarding consideration of the request of official to change her name as Dazi Kumari from Dazi Kumari Bhat in her service record, who conveyed as under:

The case has been examined in light of the instructions/procedure and found complete.

Whereas, Smt. Dazi Kumari Bhat, Incharge Head Assistant, Geology and Mining Department has executed the requisite affidavit/deed duly attested by the Executive Magistrate and notice about the correction in her name has been published in a prominent local newspaper and;

Whereas, the official has also published notification in the official Gazette for change of her name from Smt. Dazi Kumari Bhat to Dazi Kumari on her own expenses.
