## CHC Billawar being upgraded to 100 bed facility

KATHUA: Deputy Commissioner Kathua Rajesh Sharma on Monday chaired a meeting to review the progress of key infrastructure projects being executed under the Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment (SASCI) in the district.

The meeting focused on assessing the physical and financial progress of the projects taken up to strengthen healthcare, improve rural connectivity and create essential support facilities. The projects reviewed included the up-gradation of Community Health Centre (CHC) Billawar from the existing 60-bedded capacity to a 100-bedded facility, construction of residential quarters for Panchayati Raj Institution (PRI) members and the 70-metre RCC bridge on the Bhoond-Jaanu road link, a vital connectivity project for the area.

The DC took a detailed review of the pace of progress of each project. He underscored the importance of completing all works strictly as per approved specifications, timelines and technical norms. He emphasised that the projects sanctioned under SASCI are required to be completed by March 31, 2026, as per the approved timeline. He called for maintaining the pace of execution to ensure timely delivery of public assets.

The DC directed the officers to address any implementation-related issues promptly to avoid delays and ensure optimal utilisation of funds. ADC Vishayjeet Singh; CPO Ranjeet Thakur; Executive Engineer, Hospital and Mechanical Division Kathua, along with AEEs of PWD Kathua Division attended the meeting. Executive Engineers PWD Basohli and Billawar joined the meeting virtually and briefed the chair on the status and progress of the respective projects.

## Drug peddler arrested, contraband substance recovered

The accused has been identified as Hilal Ahmad Wani, son of Abdul Khaliq Wani, a resident of Ghat Tokna. He was immediately arrested and taken to the police station, where he remains in custody, official added. A case under FIR No. 04/2026 has been registered at Police Station Pulwama under relevant sections of law, and further investigation is in progress.

## Forest fire triggers landmine blasts along LoC in Poonch

MENDHAR/JAMMU: A forest fire on Monday detonated multiple landmines along the Line of Control (LoC) in Poonch district, officials said. They said there is no report of any casualty in the blasts and efforts are on to douse the flames. The fire broke out in the Basooni forward area in Balakote sector around 1.50 pm, causing five landmines to explode, the officials said.

The forward areas along the LoC are dotted with landmines as part of an anti-infiltration obstacle system to prevent terrorists from intruding into Indian territory from across the border. According to the officials, the Army has intensified vigil as the fire is still raging.

## Nine Vehicles seized for illegal extraction & transportation of minerals

GANDERBAL: Police have seized nine vehicles, including seven tippers and two tractors, for transporting illegally extracted minerals from Nallah Sindh without mandatory permissions. ## DLAC reviews implementation of FSSAI in Poonch

The meeting focused on enforcement, inspection and sampling of food items to ensure adherence to prescribed food safety standards. Key issues deliberated included the availability and functioning of slaughterhouses, sampling of food items, promotion of the Eat Right Movement, availability of fresh fruits and vegetables in local markets and the functioning of Food Safety on Wheels, besides other related matters. The DC emphasized the importance of proactive measures to ensure the safety and quality of food products, thereby strengthening public health and consumer confidence.
