First fertiliser freight train arrives at Anantnag Terminal in south Kashmir

JAMMU: Northern Railway's Jammu Division achieved another milestone in freight transportation on Tuesday with the arrival of the first fertiliser train at South Kashmir's Anantnag Goods Terminal, strengthening the agricultural supply chain in the valley, an official said. The division is witnessing a steady increase in the arrival of various goods and commodities through inward rakes. In a crucial milestone

in the agricultural logistics and supply chain, a freight train consisting of 21 BCN wagons arrived at Anantnag Goods Terminal in South Kashmir from Muzaffarnagar in Uttar Pradesh, Public Relations Inspector, Jammu Division, Raghvender Singh said here. He said the wagon train carried approximately 1,339 tons of PDM (Potash Derived from Molasses) fertiliser from Indian Potash Limited, which will ensure a seamless

and timely supply of soil nutrients to farmers in the valley. The direct arrival of the fertiliser freight train will reduce dependence on road transport and make soil nutrients more readily available to farmers, providing a significant benefit to the agricultural sector, the official said. The initiative is expected to reduce transportation costs and expedite the distribution process, ultimately benefiting local farmers, he added.

Considering its significant benefits and utility, the development is likely to boost agricultural production in Kashmir and ensure the uninterrupted availability of fertilisers to farmers during the crucial sowing season. "This will also ensure economic development alongside the agricultural sector, boost local markets, strengthen the agricultural ecosystem in the region, and create new opportunities in logistics and related sectors," he said.

Four missing UP tourists safely rescued in Ladakh

LEH: Four tourists from Uttar Pradesh, who had gone missing during a trip to Pangong Lake, were safely rescued in the Union Territory of Ladakh on Tuesday, police officials said. The tourists - Yash Mittal, Shivam Chaudhary, Jaiveer Chaudhary and Shadanshu Panjdar from Agra - were on a trip to Ladakh and were reported missing by their families after they lost contact with them a few days back, the officials said.

Police acted swiftly and launched a coordinated search operation, leading to the safe recovery of the tourists who had lost their way and were trapped in a hut in harsh winter with sub-zero temperatures, the officials said. They said the tourists had gone to Pangong Lake in their private vehicle on January 9 and mistakenly followed the Leh-Manali road, which is presently closed due to snowfall, while returning to Leh.

The police parties were fanned out, based on their last location towards Sarchu, and located their vehicle, which had met with a minor accident on the roadside, the officials said, adding the search was extended to adjoining areas, including Debring and Whisky Nalla. They were found in a hut, some 20 km from their abandoned vehicle, the officials said, adding they had spent two nights inside the vehicle using its heating system before the fuel ran out.

The officials said all four were found in stable condition and were provided with the necessary aid, including food and water. They will be handed over to their families on reaching Leh on Wednesday, the officials said.

We act openly, no secret MoU: BJP on Chinese delegation's visit

NEW DELHI: The BJP on Tuesday said it held a formal meeting with a Chinese delegation openly, given the "improved" relations between New Delhi and Beijing, unlike the Congress which, it alleged, "secretly" signed a memorandum of understanding with the neighbouring country's ruling party. The ruling party also slammed the Congress for raising border issues, saying it has "no locus" to do so as the root of the actual problems with China can be traced back to the time of the first prime minister, Jawaharlal Nehru. "Nevertheless, the Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led government has been working to resolve it. And that effort is continuing unabated," BJP national spokesperson Nalin Kohli told PTI Videos. The BJP was reacting after the Congress targeted it over the Communist Party of China delegation visiting the BJP headquarters here, accusing the saffron party of showing hypocrisy in its dealings with the neighbouring country and asking whether it raised the issue of "repeated Chinese transgressions" during such interactions. The Congress media and publicity department head, Pawan Kherra, said his party demands full accountability and complete transparency from the government on its China policy.

Hitting back, BJP national spokesperson Tuhin Sinha said, "It was a process of a formal meeting. A formal meeting takes place when a situation improves. We do it very openly." "We do not secretly sign any such MoU which we can not explain for years," he said, in an apparent reference to the Congress reportedly signing a memorandum of understanding with the Communist Party of China.
