Anti-Social Elements (ASEs). Emphasizing round-the-clock alertness, the SSP stressed heightened security measures along the National Highway, strengthening of nakas, establishment of surprise joint nakas at strategic locations, intensified patrolling and surveillance, adequate deployment in sensitive areas, and the conduct of random night nakas and ambushes at vulnerable points.

4 vehicles including 3 dumpers seized for illegal mining

SAMBHA: Continuing its drive against illegal mining, Samba Police has seized four vehicle including 03 dumpers in the jurisdiction of Police Stations Samba, Purmandal and Ghagwal which were being used for illegal transportation/mining of the construction material.

Police teams headed by SHO PS Ghagwal, SHO PS Purmandal, Incharge Police Posts Supwal of PS Samba and Incharge Police Post Rajpura of PS Ghagwal while performing patrolling duty in their jurisdictional areas have seized three dumpers bearing registration Nos. JK21J-5799, JK21A-8872, JK21H-7879 and a tractor trolley bearing registration No. JK21J-3663 which were being used for illegal transportation/mining of the construction material in the area.

The above mentioned vehicles have been seized by Samba Police and handed over to the Geology & Mining Department, Samba for further legal action.

ARTO Ramban disqualifies 3 Driving Licences, suspends 9 RCs, 2 Route Permit

RAMBAN: In a significant move to enhance public safety and curb drug-related activities, the Assistant Regional Transport Officer (ARTO) Ramban, Er. Kuldeep Singh has ordered the immediate disqualification of driving licences of three individuals for a period of three months in connection with cases registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act.

As per the official orders issued by the ARTO, Driving Licence No. JK19 2023000538 issued in favour of Mohd. Iqbal S/o Irshad Ahmed, R/o Gujjam Deddha, Gool; Licence No. JK19 2020000385 issued in favour of Shohab Majid S/o Abdul Majid, R/o Gool Dalwah; and Licence No. JK19 20170000550 issued in favour of Nittu Singh S/o Girdhari Lal, R/o Bodhi Dhandrath, Ramban, have been disqualified for a period of three months with immediate effect.

Similarly, the ARTO Ramban has suspended the Registration Certificates (RCs) of seven vehicles bearing registration numbers JK19A-1502, JK19-8185, JK19A-3946, JK19A-0435, JK19-3900, JK19-3565 and JK19-7667 for a period of three months. In addition, the Route Permit and Registration Certificate of one taxi cab (JK19A-5655) and one truck (JK19-4106) have also been suspended, and the Police Department has been directed to seize the vehicles.

The action has been taken in compliance with the directions of the Transport Commissioner's Office, based on reports received from the Inspector General of Police, Crime Branch, J&K, regarding the involvement of the concerned individuals in NDPS-related activities.

The vehicle owners have been directed to submit their Route Permits and Registration Certificates at the ARTO Office, Ramban, with immediate effect.

39 FIRs reregistered against house and land owners for tenant verification violations

SAMBHA: Samba Police has registered thirty-nine (39) FIRs against house and land owners for not providing details of tenants to Police during verification drive launched across the district during the year 2026.

The verification process was initiated by the Samba Police for the outsiders staying as tenants and domestic helpers. During the drive, twenty-eight (28) cases were registered at Police Station Bari Brahmana, eight (08) cases were registered at Police Station Samba and three (03) cases were registered at Police Station Vijaypur under relevant sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). It is pertinent to mention here that District Magistrate Samba has ordered for the mandatory Police verification of the tenants. Despite these directives, the concerned house and land owners failed to comply, leading to legal action.

Drug peddler nabbed with Charas

POONCH: In its continued efforts to curb drug trafficking and ensure public safety, Police Station Surankote today achieved a significant success by apprehending a drug peddler and recovering contraband during a special naka checking operation.

Acting on routine preventive measures, a special naka was laid at Mirza Morh by a police team of PS Surankote. During checking and frisking of pedestrians passing through the area, one individual was intercepted on suspicion. Upon thorough search, approximately 50 grams of Charas (Cannabis) was recovered from his possession. The accused has been identified as Faizaan Ahmed, son of Mushtaq Ahmed, resident of near Old Tehsil, Surankote. He was immediately taken into custody and the recovered contraband was seized as per legal procedures. Accordingly, FIR No. 11/2026 under Sections 8/20 of the NDPS Act has been registered at Police Station Surankote, and further investigation has been initiated. Efforts are underway to establish both forward and backward linkages of the accused to unearth the wider drug network involved in the illegal trade.

Bovine smuggling bid foiled; two vehicles seized

POONCH: In a continued drive to enforce the law and prevent illegal activities, a police party from Behramgala today intercepted 02 vehicles involved in illegal transportation of bovine animals during a naka checking operation.

Today during routine naka checking at Sailan-Bonikhet area, the police party intercepted two Tata Mobile vehicles bearing registration numbers JK11-8812 and JK11B-0711.

Upon inspection, it was found that the vehicles were illegally transporting bovine animals without valid permission or requisite documents.

During the operation, 07 bovine animals were rescued. Both the vehicles along with the rescued animals were taken into custody.

Accordingly, an FIR has been registered at Police Station Surankote and further investigation is underway to take appropriate action under the relevant provisions of law.
