VC, JU inaugurates six-day Capacity Building Workshop on Leadership and Digital Competencies

JAMMU: A six-day capacity building workshop titled "Leadership and Digital Educational Competencies" commenced on Monday at the Department of Lifelong Learning (DLL), University of Jammu (JU). The workshop is being jointly organized by the Department of Lifelong Learning and the Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre (MMTTC), JU, with the objective of enhancing leadership abilities and digital competencies among faculty members in higher education.

The workshop was formally inaugurated by Prof. Umesh Rai, Vice-Chancellor, JU, who graced the occasion as the Chief Guest. In his inaugural address, Prof. Rai emphasized that meaningful leadership is rooted in a strong sense of responsibility, accountability, and commitment towards the institution.
