

JU inaugurates major e-Governance initiatives to enhance digital administration and services

JAMMU: The University of Jammu (JU) on Thursday marked a major milestone in its digital transformation journey with the inauguration of three key e-Governance initiatives—Leave Management System, IT Service Desk Management System, and the Automated Official Email Creation System on the University of Jammu domain.

The initiatives were formally inaugurated by the Vice-Chancellor, JU Prof. Umesh Rai, who underscored the critical role of technology in ensuring efficient, transparent, and accountable governance. Prof. Rai appreciated the Centre for IT Enabled Services & Management (CITES&M) for its sustained efforts in modernising administrative and academic processes through innovative digital solutions. He stated that the newly launched systems would significantly improve transparency in leave processing, strengthen grievance redressal mechanisms, and serve as important steps towards transforming the University into a modern digital ecosystem.

All three systems have been designed, developed, and implemented in-house by CITES&M, University of Jammu, under the guidance of Dr. Guneet Singh Sudan, Director, CITES&M. Addressing the gathering, Dr. Guneet Singh Sudan said that the initiatives aim to streamline workflows, enhance user experience, improve data security, and strengthen institutional efficiency in line with the national objectives of Digital India and Good Governance. He emphasised that rapid adoption of technology is essential for institutions to remain relevant in the fast-evolving, AI-driven era. Elaborating on the Leave Management System, Dr. Guneet Singh Sudan informed that it has been implemented for teaching employees and officers of the University. The system offers a comprehensive online platform for submission, recommendation, and approval of leave applications, covering the complete leave lifecycle including Station Leave and Country Leave. While all 15 types of leave have been configured, in the first phase five categories: Casual Leave, Earned Leave, Maternity Leave, Paternity Leave, and Child Care Leave, will be available for online application across the main campus and off-site campuses.

Speaking about the IT Service Desk Management System, Dr. Sudan stated that the platform will function as a centralized mechanism for registering and resolving IT-related complaints and service requests. It ensures systematic tracking, prioritisation, monitoring, and timely resolution, thereby improving service delivery across the University.

Regarding the Automated Official Email Creation System, he explained that the system will enable automatic generation of official email IDs on the University of Jammu domain for undergraduate and postgraduate students, significantly reducing manual intervention and enhancing operational efficiency.

With the launch of these digital initiatives, CITES&M reaffirmed its commitment to technology-driven governance and

Various organizations warn against renewed threat to Raika Forest Collectively raise call "Save Raika Forest. Save Jammu's climate"

JAMMU: Environmental activists and civil society groups on Thursday strongly opposed the re-publication of the fencing tender for Raika Forest, terming it a renewed threat to Jammu's ecology, heritage, and future.

Addressing a press conference at the Press Club Jammu under the banner "RAIKA: Jungle, Jeevan Aur Jammu Di Virasat," Anmol Ohri (Climate Front-Jammu), Bhushan Parimol (Environment Awareness Forum), and Rupchand Makhnotra (Nature Human Centric People's Movement) jointly said the move reflects a deliberate disregard for public resistance and environmental justice.

They highlighted that in December 2025, the government re-issued the fencing tender for Raika Forest, despite sustained public opposition in the past. They said this re-publication followed a PIL filed in November 2025, which cited delays in High Court construction and reduced a living forest into a so-called "pending project."

According to the organizers, this is not the beginning of development but the return of a project that people had already rejected.

Recalling earlier resistance, they said that during August-September 2024, the initial fencing tender triggered 30 consecutive days of peaceful protests, forcing authorities to halt construction-related activities until 2025.

"That pause proved that people's voices matter when they are heard," they said, adding that public resistance against the Raika Forest-High Court project dates back to 14 February 2021, led by climate-conscious citizens and the Friends of Raika Forest collective.

Drawing parallels with Delhi, the speakers warned that Jammu is heading down the Aravalli Hills path, where ecological destruction led to chronic pollution and extreme heat. They said Raika Forest serves as Jammu's natural shield, and its loss would worsen AQI levels, intensify heat waves, and make the city increasingly uninhabitable.

They emphasized that Raika Forest is Jammu's lung, not vacant land. The proposed project threatens 38,006 trees spread over 813 kanals of forest land, one of the largest and closest carbon sinks near

Jammu city. The forest supports more than 150 species of trees and shrubs and wildlife including peacocks, foxes, porcupines, reptiles, leopards, and the endangered musk deer. They warned that forest clearance would lead to rising respiratory illnesses, soil erosion, flood risks, biodiversity loss, and increased human-animal conflict.

They further cautioned that once construction begins, urban sprawl in the form of private markets, offices, and encroachments would inevitably follow, leading to the complete urbanization of the forest belt.

"Jammu's Himalayan character is already disappearing due to unchecked concretization," the speakers said, adding that Sidra-Raika is a cultural, emotional, and ecological space deeply connected to the people of the region.

Highlighting social concerns, they organizers said that 59 Gujjar households face the loss of land and

Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Sangharsh Samiti to launch "Sanatan Jagran Yatra"

JAMMU: A meeting of the Core Committee of the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Sangharsh Samiti was held on Thursday at Geeta Bhawan here to deliberate on the controversy surrounding admissions to MBBS seats in the medical college run by the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board.

The meeting was jointly chaired by the Samiti President, Colonel Sukhvir Singh Mankotia, and the President of Shri Sanatan Dharam Sabha, Parshotam Dadhichi. The committee members expressed strong resentment over the alleged allotment of all MBBS seats to non-Sanatanis, terming it a serious injustice to the Sanatan community. Speakers accused the Shrine Board of acting in connivance and failing to uphold its original mandate.

They recalled that the Shrine Board, constituted in 1988, was entrusted with the responsibility

of managing the offerings made by devotees, ensuring the safety and convenience of pilgrims, facilitating smooth darshan, and promoting Sanatan Dharma through initiatives such as gurukuls and gauhalas.

During the meeting, members alleged that for the past nearly two decades, Shrine Board funds have been diverted towards projects such as hospitals, universities, and road construction, which they said fall under the purview of the government. The committee

asserted that the offerings made at the shrine should be utilised exclusively for the upliftment and promotion of Sanatan Dharma.

Addressing the gathering, Colonel Sukhvir Singh Mankotia outlined the future course of action of the Sangharsh Samiti. He announced the launch of a region-wide "Sanatan Jagran Yatra" aimed at transforming the issue into a mass movement. Through this initiative, the public would be informed about what the Samiti

described as the marginalisation of Sanatanis in institutions established using religious offerings. He further declared that a large-scale signature campaign would be conducted across the Jammu division to mobilise public opinion.

He also stated that protest demonstrations would be intensified to draw the attention of the Lieutenant Governor's administration and the Omar Abdullah-led government, warning that the Samiti would continue its agitation until its demands are addressed.

Parshotam Dadhichi, while addressing the meeting, criticised the silence of political representatives on the issue and stated that the time had come for elected leaders to take a clear stand. It was unanimously decided that letters would be sent to all MLAs from Jammu, urging them to boycott official programmes of the Lieutenant Governor. The committee also resolved to invite the Leader of the Opposition, Sunil Sharma, to Geeta Bhawan to publicly clarify his and his party's position on the matter.

Members including Akshay Kumar, Advocate Baldev Singh, Deepak Gupta, Sanjay Gupta, Shilpi Verma, Akshi Billowria, C.M. Seth, Subhash Jandial, and Sanjeev unanimously endorsed the resolutions.

The committee warned that if the administration fails to take concrete action in the near future, the movement would be intensified further.
