**Kathua encounter exposes Pakistan's desperation ahead of National Days: Purnima**

JAMMU: Purnima Sharma, BJP Spokesperson and Former Deputy Mayor, today strongly lauded the security forces for successfully neutralising a Jaish-e-Mohammed terrorist in the Kathua encounter, terming it a major success against Pakistan-sponsored terrorism and a clear warning to enemies of the nation. In her statement, Purnima Sharma said the swift and decisive action by the security forces, including the Army and J&K Police, reflects their high level of preparedness, coordination and unwavering commitment to safeguarding the nation's unity and integrity. She said the Kathua operation once again proves that the security forces remain alert round the clock and are fully capable of neutralising any ter-
