DLSA organises series of awareness programmes across Reasi District

REASI: Under the leadership of Chairman District Legal Services Authority Reasi (also Pr. District and Sessions Judge Reasi) Khalil Choudhary, Secretary DLSA Pooja Gupta today visited the Legal Aid Clinic at Bhambla.

The PLV deputated at the Legal Aid Clinic was present. During the visit, the Secretary checked the registers maintained at the clinic. The PLV was directed to maintain proper records of the visitors.

Meanwhile, awareness programs were organised in collaboration with Social Welfare Department Reasi on Prohibition of Child Marriage at Madarssa, Zero Morh Talwara and Panchayat Ghar Bagga.

Monika Sammotra from One Stop Centre Reasi was the Resource Person at Panchayat Ghar Bagga.



The resource person and PLVs sensitized the general public, especially parents and guardians to the ill effects and legal consequences of child marriage, provisions of the Prohibition of Child Marriage Act, 2006 and the importance of ensuring education, health and overall development of children. They were also informed about free legal aid services available through DLSA Reasi and the role of Legal Services Authorities in safeguarding the rights of women and children. Another program

was organised at Slum areas at Katra on the topic Right to Education (RTE) Act. The program was organised by PLVs of TLSC Katra to spread awareness among underprivileged communities about the constitutional and legal rights to free and compulsory education of children. The participants were encouraged to enroll their children in nearby government schools. They were informed about the free facilities provided by the government, including textbooks, mid day meals etc. The PLVs also

addressed queries of the public and emphasized the importance of education in building a better and empowered society.

An awareness program was organised at Court Complex Mahore on Strengthening Access to Justice for Marginalized Vulnerable Adivasis and Denotified/ Nomadic Tribes (SAMVAD) Scheme 2025. Panel Lawyer TLSC Mahore Imran Akram was the resource person.

DC Ramban reviews progress of development works, discusses disaster mitigation plan

The DC specifically directed the Executive Engineers of PWD, REW, Jal Shakti and JPDCL to ensure completion of works related to Education, Health, Minor Irrigation, Water Supply Schemes, Youth Services & Sports, Urban Local Bodies and other key sectors. The CEO, CMO and other concerned officers were instructed to closely follow up on the progress of projects under their respective jurisdictions. The Deputy Commissioner

KVK Reasi promotes Scientific Cultivation of Lettuce Crop

REASI: Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), Reasi under the administrative control of Sher-e-Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology of Jammu (SKUAST-J) is promoting and educating the farmers on the scientific cultivation of lettuce in Reasi distt. of J&K. KVK Reasi is providing the technical guidelines regarding the scientific cultivation of lettuce to the farmers so that they can generate more income and employment. KVK Reasi is working under the dynamic stewardship of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Prof. B.N. Tripathi and able guidance of Director Extension (DE), Prof. Amrith Vaid of SKUAST-J. According to Chief Scientist & Head of Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK), Reasi, Dr. Banarsi Lal keeping the nutritional and economic security in view, KVK Reasi is endeavoring to enhance the income and employment among the farmers of the area by the introduction of new ventures in the district. He said that



the lettuce crop has ample scope in the district and farmers can improve their livelihood security by its commercial cultivation. He informed that lettuce is one of the most important salad crops grown commercially across the globe and its demand is increasing day-by-day due to its nutritional and diet values.

He added that lettuce is a good source of vitamins, minerals and antioxidants. He added that it lowers cholesterol levels and protects neuronal cells of the body. He informed that the regular inclusion of lettuce in salads

is known to prevent osteoporosis, iron-deficiency anemia, cardiovascular diseases, age-related macular disease in the elderly people, cancers and Alzheimer's disease.

He expressed that Lettuce has low calorie content and zero fat. He further informed that it is a good source of chlorophyll and Vitamins A, B1, B2, C and K, folic acid and manganese. He informed that KVK scientists are guiding the farmers for organic lettuce cultivation and upgrading their knowledge for the preparation of organic formulations so that they can utilize them

for their crop production.

He discussed on the the hydroponics technology and highlighted its benefits. He explained the nutritional and packaging practices in lettuce crop for more profits. He informed the quality improvement and post-harvest technologies in lettuce crop.

He also explained that better quality of lettuce can help to find more marketing channels and thus the farmers can fetch more money by growing this crop. He added that it can also be grown in green house, poly house or hydroponically.
