contact with the Embassy of India in Caracas," it said.
There are around 50 NRIs (non-resident Indians) and 30 PIOs (persons of Indian origin) in Venezuela, according to the embassy in Caracas.
After Maduro and his wife were flown out of Caracas, US President Donald Trump told a news conference that his country will run Venezuela until a transition of power can take place.
"We are going to run the country until such time as we can do a safe, proper and judicious transition," Trump said.
The US president also said the "extremely successful" operation should serve as a warning to anyone who would threaten American sovereignty or endanger American lives.

The US captured Maduro after carrying out a months-long military campaign targeting Venezuela's oil tankers and attacks on boats that Washington alleged were part of a drug cartel.
In his reaction, Brazilian President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva said the US attacks on Venezuela and the capture of Maduro amounted to a "flagrant violation of international law".
"Attacking countries, in flagrant violation of international law, is the first step toward a world of violence, chaos, and instability, where the law of the strongest prevails over multilateralism," he said.
China asked the US to release Maduro and his wife, and underlined the need to resolve issues through dialogue.

"Such hegemonic acts of the US seriously violate international law and Venezuela's sovereignty, and threaten peace and security in Latin America and the Caribbean region," the Chinese foreign ministry said.
Russia "strongly" urged the US to release the Venezuelan president.
Venezuela's Supreme Court has asked Vice-President Delcy Rodríguez to take charge of the country as the interim president.
Rodríguez visited New Delhi in February last year to participate in the India Energy Week.

India and Venezuela share a history of warm relations. A major thrust to the bilateral relationship was imparted by former president Hugo Chavez's State Visit to India in March 2005.

The two countries have robust cooperation in the energy sector.
India's ONGC Videsh Limited (OVL) has a joint venture with Corporacion Venezolana del Petroleo (CVP). The joint venture is known as "PetroeraIndovenezolana SA" for the production and exploration of oil in the San Cristobal field, in which the OVL has a 40-per cent stake.

The OVL's investment in the project is approximately USD 200 million, according to the Indian embassy.

The dedication of the iconic Chenab and Anji bridges, considered as engineering marvels, the operation of Vande Bharat trains, promotion of religious tourism, increased freight movement of goods like apples and cement, and acceleration of economic development ushered a new era for the Union Territory, the railways said, terming the achievements as a "historic step" in connecting Kashmir and transforming the lives of the people of the region.

The USBRL was inaugurated by Modi on June 6, 2025, connecting the Kashmir Valley to the rest of the country throughout the year, while the Chenab bridge which is 35 meters higher than the iconic Eiffel Tower in Paris and the country's first Cable-Stayed Anji Rail Bridge were dedicated to the nation, showcasing the technical excellence of this project.

Maduro arrives in US after stunning capture

Deposed Venezuelan leader Nicolas Maduro arrived in the United States to face criminal charges after being captured in an audacious nighttime military operation that President Donald Trump said would set the US up to "run" the South American country and tap its vast oil reserves to sell to other nations.

Maduro landed late Saturday afternoon at a small airport in New York following the middle-of-the-night operation that extracted him and his wife, Cilia Flores, from their home in a military base in the capital, Caracas - an act that Maduro's government called "imperialist." The couple faces US charges of participating in a narco-terrorism conspiracy.



The dramatic action capped an intensive Trump administration pressure campaign on Venezuela's autocratic leader and months of secret planning, resulting in the most assertive American action to achieve regime change since the 2003 invasion of Iraq. Legal experts raised questions about the lawfulness of the operation,

which was done without congressional approval. Venezuela's vice president, Delcy Rodriguez, meanwhile, demanded that the United States free Maduro and called him the country's rightful leader as her nation's high court named her interim president.

Some Venezuelan civilians and members of the military were killed, said

Rodriguez, who didn't give a number. Trump said some US forces were injured, but none was killed.

Speaking to reporters hours after Maduro's capture, Trump revealed his plans to exploit the leadership void to "fix" the country's oil infrastructure and sell "large amounts" of oil to other countries.

After arriving at a small airport in New York City's northern suburbs, Maduro was flown by helicopter to Manhattan, where a convoy of law enforcement vehicles, including an armored car, was waiting to whisk him to a nearby US Drug Enforcement Administration office.

A video posted on social media by a White House account showed Maduro, smiling, as he was escorted through that office by two DEA agents grasping his arms.

Unauthorised pony operator booked on Vaishno Devi track

Army Chief embarks on visit to UAE, Sri Lanka

NEW DELHI:

Army Chief Gen Upendra Dwivedi on Sunday embarked on a four-day visit to the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and Sri Lanka to explore ways to shore up bilateral military cooperation.

In the first leg of his two-nation tour, Gen Dwivedi is visiting the UAE to hold wide-ranging talks with the top military brass of the influential Gulf nation. He will also visit key military establishments including the UAE National Defence College and interact with officers and troops.

"These engagements are aimed at further enhancing bilateral defence cooperation, professional military exchanges and strategic understanding between the two armed forces," the Army

said.

It said Gen Dwivedi's January 5-6 visit to the Gulf nation underscores a shared commitment to deepen mutual understanding and enhance cooperation in areas of common interest.

Gen Dwivedi's trip to the UAE is taking place weeks after the Gulf nation's Commander of the Presidential Guard, Major General Ali Saif Humaid Alkaabi, visited India.

The Army Chief's visit comes in the midst of fast-paced developments in the Gulf region including escalating tensions between the UAE and Saudi Arabia over the situation in Yemen.

The military cooperation between India and the UAE witnessed a significant momentum after the visit to that country by then Army

Chief Gen MM Naravane in December 2020.

It was the first-ever visit to the UAE by a head of the Indian Army.

From the UAE, Gen Dwivedi will travel to Sri Lanka for a two-day visit from January 7 to 8.

In Colombo, he will hold talks with senior political and military brass, including the defence secretary and the commander of the Sri Lanka Army.

The discussions will be on matters of mutual interest, including training cooperation, capacity building and regional security, the Army said.

The Chief of Army Staff will also address Sri Lankan military officers at the Defence Services Command and Staff College (DSCSC) and trainees at the Army

War College in Buttala.

General Dwivedi will also pay homage at the memorial for the Indian Peace-Keeping Force (IPKF) in Colombo. India had lost around 1,200 soldiers during the Indian Peacekeeping Force's stay in Sri Lanka between July 1987 and March 1990.

In April last year, Prime Minister Narendra Modi paid tributes to the fallen warriors of the IPKF at the memorial during his visit to the island nation.

"The visit of the Chief of the Army Staff to the UAE and Sri Lanka reaffirms India's commitment to strengthening defence cooperation, fostering mutual trust and enhancing interoperability with friendly nations in the Indian Ocean Region and West Asia," the Army said in a statement.

IAF chief urges ADA to stick to timelines for operational readiness

Air Chief Marshal A P Singh on Sunday said the Aeronautical Development Agency (ADA) must strictly adhere to delivery timelines to keep the Indian Air Force operationally ready in a rapidly evolving security environment.

He was speaking after inaugurating the two-day national seminar 'Aeronautics 2047', organised by ADA at the Centre for Airborne Systems (CABS) here.

The seminar marked 25 years of the Light Combat Aircraft (LCA) Tejas flight programme, and the Chief of the Air Staff congratulated ADA on achieving the milestone, according to a statement.

Emphasising the urgency of timely inductions, Singh said there was a need to adhere to delivery schedules to ensure the IAF remains operationally prepared in constantly evolving times.

Secretary, Department of Defence Research and

Development, and Chairman of the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO), Samir V Kamat, under-

scored the importance of developing indigenous cutting-edge technologies to reduce import dependence and realise the vision of Viksit Bharat (Developed India) by 2047.

The seminar has brought together domain experts, industrial partners, academia, aviation enthusiasts and speakers from across the aerospace ecosystem to deliberate on the evolution of aeronautics, design innovation, manufacturing and future frontiers, the statement said.

Discussions are focused on next-generation aircraft manufacturing and assembly, digital manufacturing, aerodynamics for future combat aircraft, propulsion technologies, flight testing techniques, digital twin technology, certification challenges, flight control systems and avionics, maintainability issues, artificial intelligence in

aircraft design, and precision manufacturing of actuators.

According to the statement, the event will also trace the journey of the LCA Tejas from concept to squadron.

Designed and developed by ADA, the aircraft has completed over 5,600 successful flight trials, with more than 100 government laboratories, academic institutions and industries contributing to the programme.

Several niche technologies, including carbon composites, lightweight materials, fly-by-wire flight control systems, digital utility management systems and a glass cockpit, were developed to make the LCA a fourth-generation fighter, it added.

The LCA Mk-1A, an advanced variant of the indigenously designed and manufactured fighter aircraft, is expected to meet the operational requirements of the IAF, while the LCA Mk-II and LCA Navy variants are currently

under development.

A series of technical talks by distinguished speakers associated with the Tejas programme will be delivered during the seminar.

"India has benefited enormously from the development of the LCA Tejas, having acquired both the capability and capacity to build fighter aircraft indigenously," the statement said.

"The LCA programme is one of the most successful indigenous defence programmes, through which the IAF has been equipped with an exceptional superiority fighter. So far, 38 aircraft-32 fighters and six trainers-have been inducted into two IAF squadrons," it added.

As part of the seminar, several public sector undertakings, defence PSUs, industries and micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) are showcasing indigenously designed and developed products for airborne applications, it further said.
