Farmers suspend agitation, protesters to head home from Dec 11

DELHI: Samyukta Kisan Morcha Thursday announced the suspension of its over a year-long agitation after they received a formal letter from the central government accepting their key pending demands including withdrawal of police cases against the protesters and on

Calling off the agitation, the SKM, an umbrella body of 40 farm unions, said farmers will celebrate December 11 as 'Vijay Diwas' and take out victory marches following which they will head home.

Asserting that this is not the end of the movement, Farmer leaders said they would meet on January 15 to see if the demands have been fulfilled by the government.

"This is not the end as the movement is just suspended. we have decided to meet again on January 15," SKM core committee member Balbir Singh Rajewal said at

Farmers, mainly fromPunjab, Harvana and Uttar Pradesh, started protesting at Delhi border points --Singhu, Tikri and Ghazipur -- on November 26 last vear against the three contentions farm laws. The laws were repealed by Parliament on November 29, but farmers continued their protest over their pending demands.

In the letter to the protesting farmers, Agriculture Secretary Sanjay Aggrawal referred to the five main demands of farmers which were pending after the three

accepting the Besides demand to withdraw police cases against farmers during the agitation, the government informed the SKM that a committee on its demand for a legal guarantee of Minimum Support Price (MSP) that will include SKM members will be formed.

Another SKM member Gurnam Singh Chaduni said that "a review meeting will be convened on January 15 to see if the government has does not, we can take a call on resuming the protest".

Soon after the SKM's announcement about the suspension of the stir, the protest sites erupted into celebrations with farmers raising their union flags, greeting each other on the success of their agitation and playing patriotic songs from their tractors.

Protesters were also seen dismantling their tents, even as farmer leaders said they will leave for their respective destinations on Saturday. The SKM, which has been spearheading the agitation, also apologised to people who had to face inconvenience due to its protests.

NEW DELHI: India will keep scheduled international passenger flights suspended till January 31 next year, aviation regulator DGCA said on Thursday.

Amid rising concerns over the coronavirus variant Omicron, the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) had on December 1 decided not to resume scheduled international flights from December 15, less than a week after announcing that it would restart the services.

The DGCA issued a circular on Thursday, saying, "The competent authority has decided to extend the suspension of scheduled international commercial passenger services to and from India till 2359 hours of January 31, 2022."

This suspension won't apply to international all cargo operations and flights specifically approved by DGCA, it mentioned.

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the country's top military brass on Thursday paid homage to India's first Chief of Defence Staff Gen Bipin Rawat, his wife Madhulika, Brig LS Lidder and 10 more defence personnel at the Palam air base after their bodies were brought to Delhi in a military aircraft.

Defence Minister Rainath Singh. NSA Ajit Doval, Army Chief MM Naravane, Navy Chief Admiral R Hari Kumar, Air Chief Marshal AVR Chaudhari and Defence Secretary Ajay Kumar were among those who paid homage to the deceased at a sombre ceremo-

"Paid my last respects to Gen Bipin Rawat, his wife and other personnel of the Armed Forces. India will never forget their rich contribution." Modi tweeted.

Heart-wrenching scenes were seen at the Palam airport as 13 caskets were lined up inside a hangar in presence of their family

The prime minister also reached out to the family members of the deceased and talked to them for a few minutes

The 13 people were killed when their helicopter crashed near Coonoor in Tamil Nadu in an air tragedy that triggered grief across

An Indian Air Force C-130J Super Hercules transport aircraft carrying the bodies from the Sulur airbase touched down at the Palam technical airport around 7:35 pm.

Only three of the 13 bodies have been identified so far -- Gen Rawat and his wife, Madhulika Rawat and Brigadier LS Lidder. Army officials said the bodies of those identified will be released to the families for last rites.

The other bodies will be kept at the mortuary at the Army Base Hospital till they are identified. The bodies of Gen Rawat and his
