CRIME REPORT

10 drug peddlers nabbed across J&K with haul of contraband

JAMMU: Police on Thursday nabbed ten drug peddlers across Jammu & Kashmir in separate actions and recovered a haul of contraband from their possession.

As per details, during Naka, a team of Police Station Jhajjar Kotli led by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Insp Devinder Singh rounded up two suspects, traveling in a vehicle (PB08ES/0794) coming from Kashmir, who turned suspicious on seeing police. On search, 19 Kg 800 gm poppy straw was recovered from possession of two suspects, identified as Manjeet Singh, son of Jasveer Singh and Karamveer Singh, son of Jaswant Singh, both residents of Haripur Tehsil Adampur District Jalandhar, Punjab. Duo was arrested and FIR No 186/2021 under sections 8/15/25/29 of NDPS Act was registered against them at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli. The overall arrests and recoveries were made under supervision of SDPO Nagrota Parupkar Singh.

Similarly, at another Naka laid by team from Police Station Satwari led by SHO Satwari Insp Deepak Jasrotia assisted by PSI Tejinder Singh, a suspect was rounded up. On search, 75 gm Charas was recovered from his possession. The accused, identified as Amit Kumar, son of Narotam Sharma, resident of Lower Gadigarh, Jeevan Nagar- Baliana road was arrested and FIR No. 277/21 under sections 8/20 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Satwari. The arrests and recoveries were made under supervision of SDPO South P K Mengi.

Also, a team of Police Post Narwal led by Incharge Police Post SI Achal Rana during patrolling duty rounded up a suspect. On search, 8 gm heroin was recovered from his possession. Identified as Neeraj Kumar, son of Late Sudesh Kumar, resident of Rajeev Nagar, Narwal, the accused was arrested on the spot. The arrest and recoveries were made under supervision of SDPO East Sajjad Sarwar.

A team of Police Station Majalta led by Inspector Virender Gupta SHO Majalta and ASI Krishan Lal laid a Naka at Police Check Post Battal. During Naka, police stopped a truck (PB32B-2742) and recovered 7.5 Kg poppy straw from it. Truck driver namely Ajay Singh, son of Gurdal, resident of Lashara Tehsil Garh Shanker, District Hoshiarpur, was arrested and FIR no 112 /2021 under sections 8/15 of NDPS Act was registered against him.

Bus Stand police has also arrested a drug peddler near Samarat Hotel and recovered 7.5 gm heroin from his possession. The accused was identified as Gurjeet Singh alias Manga, resident of Gadigarh.

Meanwhile, Pulwama Police arrested four drug peddlers and recovered huge quantity of contraband from their possession. A police party of Police Station Pulwama during patrolling at Tengarh area intercepted four suspicious persons who tried to escape from the spot after noticing police party, but were apprehended tactfully. They were identified as Junaid Ahmad Ganaie, son of Mushtaq Ahmad, resident of Chatapora; Umer Feroz Bhat, son of Feroz Ahmad Bhat, resident of Pulwama, near Wani Masjid; Aijaz Ahmad Thoker, son of Ab Majeed, resident of Old Bus Stand Pulwama & Qaisar Nazir Mir, son of Nazir Ahmad Mir, resident of Mughalpora Pulwama. During search, officers recovered 49 bottles of codeine phosphate from their possession. They were arrested and shifted to police station where they remained in custody.

In another action, a party from Police Station Litter, following an input, conducted a raid in village Rakh Litter. During search, 20 Kg Bhang-Patri was recovered from house of Rayees Ahmad Thoker, son of Ab Rashid Thoker, resident of Rakh Litter. The accused is still at large and efforts are on to effect his arrest. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered at respective police stations and investigation started.

Army rescues accident victims

RAMBAN: Army on Thursday rescued two accident victims and shifted them to hospital after giving them first aid.

As per details, quick response by Army at Nachlana in District Ramban (J&K) saved lives of two truckers, who were moving from Srinagar to Jammu. Driver Kuldeep Singh lost control of truck due to which the vehicle rolled down 40 meters into a Nallah. The driver and co-driver were grievously injured and trapped inside vehicle. After two hours of relentless efforts of



army personnel, both were safely evacuated from accident site to specialised Medical Center of army where they were provided lifesaving first aid and further sent to SDH Banihal for further treatment.

Rs 31,000 fine recovered from SoPs violators in Ramban

RAMBAN: Continuing the enforcement drive to implement COVID protocol across the district Ramban, the Enforcement teams on Thursday fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance. The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs 31,000 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs. 71,31,900.

The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking COVID vaccination doses at their nearest CVC.

District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr Suresh informed that as many as 1199 persons were administered first and second COVID vaccine doses across Ramban district on Thursday.

As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr. Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 2,589 samples including 652 RT-PCR and 1,937 RAT samples besides administering COVID vaccine to 1,199 persons at dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.

11 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: To check menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which police teams of Police Station Nagrota, Police Post Beli Charana, Sainik Colony and Talab Tiloo acted stringently on specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 11 different vehicles involved in illegal mining. The seized vehicles included 5 vehicles i.e., 5 Dumpers (JK02CR 5266, JK02AT 6178, JK14C 4955, JK14FB 193 and JK14C 8655) seized by Beli Charana police; a tractor-trolley without registration number seized by Nagrota police; 2 tractor-trolleys (JK02BB 4428 and JK02CP-8954) and 1 tipper (JK02BX-1599) seized by Sainik Colony police and 2 tractor-trolleys without registration number seized by Talab Tiloo police.

The overall recoveries were made by SHO Police Station Nagrota Insp Vishav Pratap Singh, Incharge Police Post Beli Charana; ASI Sanjeet Singh, Incharge Police Post Sainik Colony; PSI Mohd Younis Khanday and Incharge Police Post Talab Tiloo, PSI Rajesh Kumar in their respective jurisdictions. DMO Jammu was also intimated about the same.

Two thieves nabbed; stolen water tank, tractor recovered

JAMMU: Police on Thursday nabbed two thieves and recovered a stolen water-tank and tractor.

As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Channi Himmat regard-

ing theft of a water-tank and tractor by some unknown persons. On this, FIR No 191/2021 under section 379 of IPC was registered and investigation started. After this, a special team from Police Station Channi Himmat under the supervision of SDPO East Sajjad Sarwar was constituted. The team led by SHO Channi Himmat Insp Deepak Katoch, with strenuous efforts generated input that thieves have taken water tank and tractor to Shibba Bamyal area. Finally with assistance of team from Police Station Kanahak, two suspects were rounded up who were identified as Mohd Latif, son of Bagh Hussain, resident of Top Paloura and Abdul Rashid, son of Mohd Sadiq, resident of Dasanu Reasi, at present Lower Muthi. During questioning, accused confessed their involvement in the crime and on their disclosure, stolen water-tank along with tractor (JK02AP-4398) was also recovered by Police.

10 bovines rescued; smugglers flee

KATHUA: Police on Thursday foiled a bovine smuggling attempt by rescuing 10 bovines, however smugglers managed to escape.

As per details, a team led by Insp Amit Sangra SHO Police Station Rajbagh under supervision of SDPO Border Sachit Mahajan during a Naka near NH Moga Langar noticed a suspicious vehicle (PB07BX-3253) which was signaled to stop for checking. During checking of aforesaid vehicle, 5 bovines were found laden in it, which were rescued. FIR No 255/2021 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA was registered at Police Station Rajbagh and further investigation started.

While in another instance, a team of Police Post Chadwal led by PSI Rohit Manhas under supervision of SDPO Border Sachit Mahajan during Naka checking duty at Seswan noticed a suspicious vehicle (Mahindra) bearing registration number JK08F-9028.

The vehicle was signaled to stop for checking, after which 5 bovines were found laden in it. The vehicle was seized and FIR No. 256/2021 under section 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Rajbagh. Overall, 10 bovines were rescued and two vehicles were seized by Police but smugglers managed to flee.



Heavy machinery engaged in illegal mining seized

RAJOURI: Police on Thursday seized heavy machinery engaged in mining work from a river in last two days. During intervening night of December 7-8, a team from Chatyar Police Post led by PSI Sahil Chowdhary conducted patrolling of river area and found heavy machinery being used for mining of river bed. The machinery was seized on the spot which included two heavy chain excavation machines, a tractor-trolley with mining Jaala bearing registration number JK11B 4863, a Tipper bearing registration number JK11C 9643 and another tipper bearing registration number JK02AP 7653. Police team has informed District Mining Officer about seizure of heavy machinery for further legal proceedings.

Girl rescued, kidnapper arrested

UDHAMPUR: Police on Thursday rescued a girl and arrested her kidnapper.

As per details, based on complaint of a family that their girl has been kidnapped, FIR No. 202/2021 under Section 363 of IPC was lodged at Police Station Ramnagar and a team led by Insp Pushpinder Singh under the supervision of Anwaar ul Haq Addl SP Udhampur and Dr Bhishm Dubey SDPO Ramnagar was constituted. Accordingly, raids were conducted at different suspected locations as accused keep on shifting their places. Based on reliable input, Udhampur Police finally rescued kidnapped girl from kidnapper namely Jaswant Singh, son of Mohinder Singh, resident of Bainsta, Ramnagar who was arrested from Bus-stand Jammu. Kidnapped girl was safely brought back to Police Station Ramnagar and handed-over to her family after proper legal procedure. Further investigation of the case is underway.

Shopkeeper arrested for highly objectionable social media post on Gen Rawat's death

RAJOURI: Police on Thursday arrested a shopkeeper from a village near Rajouri for posting objectionable content against Chief of Defence Staff, General Bipin Rawat on social media.

Police has not disclosed his identity but said that an FIR has been lodged against him at Rajouri Police Station and further investigation and legal proceedings against accused are going on. According to police, the social media post by shopkeeper was 'sensitive in nature and highly objectionable'. Police said that as soon as objectionable post on Facebook was noticed, the accused was taken to Police Station for questioning and was arrested subsequently.

In Jammu also, President, Sainik Colony Beopar Mandal, Rakesh Chodhary has lodged a complaint with Cyber Crime Police Station against those who made objectionable comments over death of CDS and others in a Chopper crash. Police has taken cognizance in matter and started identification of anti-national elements.

Major fire damages CRPF camp in Srinagar

SRINAGAR: A major fire broke out in a Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) camp at Sanath Nagar, Srinagar in which huge property got damaged on Thursday.

As per details, fire broke out in 132 Bn CRPF camp housing in an old migrant property at housing colony Sanath Nagar at midnight of Wednesday-Thursday and engulfed entire building within minutes. Fire tenders from nearby fire station and headquarters rushed to douse the flames. The fire has caused extensive damage to the property. However, none got injured in the incident. The exact cause of fire is yet to be ascertained.

Murderous attack over land dispute

JAMMU: Over a land dispute in Chinore area, one party attacked other party with sharp-edged weapon on Thursday.

As per details, Raj Kumari lodged a complaint with police that two persons, sons of Shanti Devi, with whom a dispute is going on over a plot, along with some people entered her plot and damaged construction there besides beating labourers. After complaint, police has arrested two persons and registered a case. The attackers have been identified as Rajesh and Mukesh, both sons of Shanti Devi.

Dowry harassment cases reported

JAMMU: Two dowry harassment cases have been reported in Jammu on Thursday.

As per details, Nargis Bhatt, resident of Kulgam, presently staying at Subash Nagar has lodged a complaint with police that her husband namely Shami-ul-Paddar, used to harass her for dowry and has also thrown her out of house.

Meanwhile, another women lodged a similar complaint at Women Cell against her husband namely Raj Kumar, resident of Rani Talab, Digiana.

One die, another injured as bike skid off

AKHNOOR: One died while other got injured after a bike skidded off the road near Sungal Morh, Akhnor on Thursday.

As per details, a motorcycle got slipped near Sungal Morh due to which a person died on the spot while other got seriously injured. The deceased was identified as Nareshwar (21), son of Prabh Dayal, resident of village Lehar Akhnor while injured was referred to Government Medical College Hospital Jammu after giving first-aid at Sub District Hospital SDH Akhnor. Police has registered the case for further investigation.
