Power employees resent formation of JKGL, call for work boycott from Dec 18

JAMMU: A meeting of Power Employees and Engineers under banner of JKPEEC- an amalgam comprising various unions led by Sachin Tickoo, General Secretary JKEEGA and Convenor PEECC Jammu, Jaipal Sharma Chairman JKPEEC Jammu & President DEA, Sanjeev Bali PPEU, Anil Sathia Lineman & Workers Union, Kulbir Singh EEU, H D Singh TEFT, Arun Gupta PDDEU, Balbir Singh Draftsmen Association, Jasbir Singh ITI Employees, Gurmeeet Singh, Purshotam Kumar CNGEU was held here on Saturday to discuss the issue of formation of a joint venture company namely JK Grid Company Ltd (JKGCL) with JKPTCL and Power Grid Corporation of India Ltd as its constituents. The coordination committee deliberated the modalities of company being incorporated and strongly resented the

move of Government not taking the employees' representatives on board. Terming the decision as a unilateral, the participants said that it is injustice with employees' future career prospects. The members further discussed the communication received by the UT administration from Ministry of Power dated September 1, 2021 which was purely an advisory in nature. In backdrop of above stated communication, a draft agreement of a proposed joint venture between JKPTCL and PGCL Ltd got leaked into the public domain invoking sharp criticism as the step has been initiated without taking employee associations in confidence.

Speaking on the occasion, the employee leaders said, "Formation of Joint Venture Company 'JK Grid Company' in haste without discussing the modalities of each and every clause with the employee representatives under the banner of

Jammu & Kashmir Power Employees & Engineers Coordination Committee shall not be acceptable to employees and the move shall be opposed tooth and nail. The trust deficit between employees and Government on this issue has further increased due to unilateral approach adopted by the government." The employee leaders urged Lieutenant Governor and Principal Secretary PDD that such decision should be put on hold and talks with coordination committee be initiated to deliberate on the issue to dispel apprehensions of employees, failing which the coordination committee shall be forced to proceed on UT-level 'Work Boycott Call' from Dec 18, 2021. The coordination committee held similar meeting under leadership of Munshi Majid Ali, President JKEEGA in Kashmir region and decided same agitational programme.
