2 policemen martyred, 12 injured in terror attack in Srinagar outskirts

SRINAGAR: Two policemen were martyred and 12 others suffered injuries as terrorists carried out a deadly attack on a bus carrying Jammu and Kashmir Armed Police personnel on the outskirts of Srinagar on Monday -- the 20th anniversary of the Parliament Attack -- officials said.

The bus came under fire from terrorists in Zewan in Pantha Chowk area this evening, police officials said.

They said at least 14 policemen sustained injuries in the attack. The injured were evacuated to various hospitals where two of them died.

Quoting officials, a Srinagar based news agency KNO identified the martyrs as ASI Ghulam Hassan ARP-861250 and Selection Grade Constable Shafiq Ali. Belt Number 782/AP9th ARP091317. The injured were identified as Bishember Das, Sajad Ahmed, Rameez Ahmed, Sanjay Kumar, Vikas Sharma, Abdul Majeed, Muasdhir Ahmed, Ravi Kant, Showkat Ali, Arshid Muhammad, Liyaqat Ali and

The official said that the vehicle was coming from an armed police complex in Zewan towards Pantha Chowk. The bus ferrying policemen suffered immense damage while

and bullet marks from all sides, especially the front portion as suggested by the pictures viral on social media. An eye-witness said that locals helped policemen evacuate the injured to the hospital.

reported that at least three injured policemen are critical who are being treated at army base hospital at Badamibagh, Srinagar while others are stable. Witnesses said that the traffic remained disrupted for almost an hour on the Zewan-Panthachowk-Khonmoh road and was later restored after the police bus that was attacked was removed from the scene. Police sources said that the Zewan attack is this year's deadliest attack by terrorists.

The area has been cordoned off and a search operation launched to track down the assailants, the officials said, adding that further details are await-

On December 13 in 2001, terrorists attacked the Parliament complex and opened fire, killing nine people. All five terrorists were shot dead.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has sought details on the terror attack while conveying condolences to the families of the martyrs.


