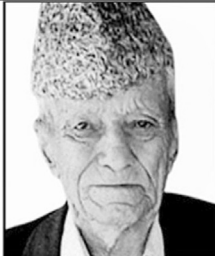

Man booked for performing obscene activities in front of daughter-in-law

Money withdrawn fraudulently from man's post-office account

JAMMU: Money was withdrawn fraudulently from a man's post-office saving account in Jammu on Wednesday.

As per details, a man lodged a complaint with Pacea Danga Police that over Rs 1.5 lakh has been withdrawn fraudulently from his account, in post office, by preparing forged documents. Police has registered a case and started investigation.

Woman, daughter held for anti-national sloganeering after encounter: Police

SRINAGAR: Police has arrested a woman and her daughter on charges of raising anti-national slogans in aftermath of an encounter in which two Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) terrorists were killed, officials said on Wednesday.

Afroza, wife of Mushtaq Sofi and her daughter, Aisha were charged under Sections 147 and 148 (rioting), 149 (unlawful assembly) and 326 (voluntarily causing grievous hurt by dangerous weapons or means) of Indian Penal Code and lodged at Women's Police Station, Rambagh, they said.

Two JeM terrorists were killed in an encounter at high security Rangreth area on Monday. Some local residents, mostly women, allegedly raised slogans against security forces after encounter amidst claims that gun battle was 'staged'. Several social media users have also questioned the authenticity of the encounter. Police, on Monday, issued an advisory on Twitter and warned the social media users against 'aiding' and 'abetting' terrorism. "Beware Social Media users. #Aiding & #abetting of #terror is as grave as the actual act of terror. It is #punishable under UAPA," the Kashmir Zonal police tweeted.

Unclaimed bag on Jammu-Srinagar NH sparks panic, traffic suspended briefly

RAMBAN: An unclaimed bag found lying on strategic Jammu-Srinagar national highway in Ramban district on Wednesday afternoon sparked a security scare and prompted authorities to suspend vehicular traffic for over an hour, officials said.

They said that the bag was found lying near Cafeteria Morh on 270-Km long high-way, the only all-weather road linking Kashmir with rest of the country.

The bomb disposal squad and sniffer dogs were pressed into service. It was found that the bag contained clothes and had apparently fallen out of some vehicle on high-way, the officials said. The highway was reopened for traffic after over an hour. Efforts are on to identify owner of the bag so that it can be returned, they said.

Complaint filed against fraudsters for offering fake helicopter tickets to Vaishno Devi pilgrims

JAMMU: Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board (SMVDSB) has lodged separate complaints with Crime and Cyber Crime branches of Jammu & Kashmir Police against fraudulent elements illegally offering helicopter tickets to intending pilgrims to famous shrine atop Trikuta hills in Reasi district, an official said on Wednesday. The SMVDSB advised all pilgrims to use only its official website for booking services such as helicopter tickets and not to fall prey to the fraudulent advertisements issued by unauthorised websites offering confirmed helicopter tickets and sale of 'Prasad'.

The official said Chief Executive Officer, SMVDSB, Ramesh Kumar on Wednesday reviewed helicopter operations for the pilgrimage and during the delib-

erations, it came to fore that some unscrupulous elements are selling fraudulent or fake tickets to pilgrims. These unscrupulous elements are illegally offering helicopter tickets from Katra-Sanjichhat-Katra through their websites/ travel portals/ travel agencies, the official said.

Taking a serious note of false, frivolous and unlawful chopper bookings, the Chief Executive Officer informed that the matter regarding fleeing of pilgrims by these fraudulent elements has already been taken up with Crime Branch and Cyber Crime branch of J-K Police, he said.

Kumar has appealed to the pilgrims that sale of helicopter tickets for pilgrims traveling from Katra to Sanjichhat and back is sole prerogative of the SMVDSB and it has not authorised any agent, agency or person to use Board's name to sell or undertake online bookings for any services. All the online services offered by Shrine Board are offered through the Official Website of Shrine Board: 'http://www.maa.vaishnodevi.org' and Mata Vaishno Devi App only, the officer said, adding that any misrepresentation of the Board by any person or agency whatsoever shall be dealt strictly.

Drug peddler arrested, huge quantity of contraband seized

ANANTNAG: Continuing its efforts to curb menace of drugs from the society, Police on Wednesday arrested a drug peddler in Anantnag and recovered huge quantity of contraband from his possession.

As per details, Police Station Srigufwara received specific information that one Sajad Ahmad Raina, son in law of Mohd Afzal, resident of Khiram Srigufwara has indulged in drug peddling and has hoarded a large quantity of narcotic substances in his house. Acting on information, a search team headed by SHO Police Station Srigufwara along with Executive Magistrate concerned raided the location. During search, the team recovered about 10 Kg Charas Chura and 1.4 Kg Charas powder. The accused was arrested and shifted to Police Station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, a case under relevant sections of law was registered and further investigation started.

Burglary case solved, 2 arrested

BUDGAM: Police on Wednesday solved a burglary case in Budgam and arrested two burglars, besides recovering stolen property worth more than one lakh.

As per details, on December 10, 2021, Police Station Magam received a complaint from one Mukhtar Ahmad Mir; son of Adul Aziz Mir, resident of Hyderpora stating therein that during intervening night of November 6-7, 2021, some unknown burglars struck his shop and decamped with cigarettes worth more than Rs 1 lakh. Accordingly, FIR number 242/2021 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Magam and investigation started.

During the course of investigation, an accused who was earlier involved in other theft cases and identified as Muzaffar Ahmad Dar; son of Ghulam Mohammad Dar; resident of Hanjiwera Pattan was rounded up. During questioning, he confessed his crime and disclosed role of another accused identified as Ibrahim Hajam, son of Mohammad Qasim Hajam, resident of Nehar Colony Mirgund Pattan. Stolen property worth more than Rs 1 lakh was also recovered on their disclosure. Both accused were arrested and shifted to police station where they remained in custody. The investigation of the case is going on.

Highest-ever 316 charge-sheets produced against 335 in 60 days by Reasi police

REASI: During slight relief in second COVID-19 wave, while keeping COVID Appropriate Behavior enforced, Reasi Police geared up its teams on crime investigation front and produced highest 316 charge-sheets against 335 accused in a short span of eight weeks, in courts of law in months of October and November this year; thereby setting a new record.

Sub division Reasi concluded investigations in 123 cases and produced charge-sheets against accused persons in various Courts. Investigation of 76 cases of Sub-division Katra was concluded and produced in the court of law during the same period. Sub-division Mahore produced 79 final reports in court of law after concluding investigation whereas charge-sheets in 38 cases were produced in the courts of law by Sub-division Armas. Total 316 criminal cases
