Commissioner Srinagar Municipal Corporation, Athar Amir Khan was also present on the occasion. On the occasion, the respective Revenue officials apprised the Deputy Commissioner that the rates for Stamp duty have been analysed and informed about the area wise percentage of changes to be incorporated for the year 2022. The Deputy
