

JKPSA flays Govt for irresponsible attitude towards private schools, warns to hold protest on Dec 24

JAMMU: Flaying Government for its irrational and irresponsible attitude towards private schools of Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir, J&K Private Schools Association (JKPSA) Jammu has urged the administration to fulfill all genuine and pending demands of the private schools at the earliest. Speaking during a meeting organised by Ajay Gupta, General Secretary JKPSA under the leadership of President JKPSA, Kamal Gupta, members highlighted various burning issues being faced by them.

General Secretary Ajay Gupta highlighted agenda of meeting which included arbitrary orders issued for fixation & regulation of fee of private schools by the FFRC, resolution of 50 per cent fee reduction by Jammu Municipal Corporation (JMC), exploitation of private schools owners due to numerous bottlenecks created by Education department for affiliation/recognition of schools, delay in reopening of schools for offline teaching etc.

Members belonging from different areas of J&K, while speaking during the meeting,

said that online mode of education has now turned into a profit generating source for big IT companies and students are the worst sufferers, as online education cannot evolve a concept of team spirit, co-operation, coordination and work culture among them. The members expressed dismay over the resolution passed by JMC for private schools functioning within municipal limits of Jammu without knowing their sufferings. They further added that Chairperson FFRC Justice (Retd.) Muzaffar Hussain Attar has no frame work and policy to regulate fee of private schools as he is incorporating number of restrictions varying from school to school while fixing the fee.

President Kamal Gupta

demanded immediate review / withdrawal of all orders which are issued by FFRC on hit and trial policy for private schools. He also appealed to the Lieutenant Governor to constitute a monitoring cell to check

the discrepancies which FFRC is regularly committing while fixing fee of private schools. During the meeting, it was unanimously resolved that if Government will not mitigate the problems of private schools,

then designated members of JKPSA will hold a protest at Press Club Jammu on December 24, 2021 to highlight their demands.

ed from time to time, were biased against Jammu as successive state governments were not interested to treat Jammu at par with Kashmir Valley.

Zorawar Singh Jamwal further demanded that new assembly constituencies should be carved out in all 'deserving areas of Jammu region. He especially mentioned that the Panchari-Moungri belt, which always remained neglected, full-fills all criteria and deserves to be an Assembly segment.

Pointing towards the recent assurance of Union Home

Minister, Amit Shah during his visit to J&K, Zorawar said that Home Minister had promised to end discrimination with the Jammu region.

"We are kipping that the incumbent regime will fulfill its promise to treat Jammu with the same yardsticks it is treating other regions", he said and cautioned that people of the Jammu region will not tolerate further political discrimination after the abrogation of Article 370. "If Delimitation Commission failed to end political discrimination with Jammu region, we will be left with no other

option but to launch a mass movement for a separate state for Jammu region", asserted Zorawar and pointed towards the ongoing agitation launched by the various political and social groups of Ladakh. He questioned that if so many well welfare measures like reservation of jobs for locals can be extended to the populace of Ladakh UT, then why not similar measures for Jammu region. He asserted that the people of Jammu region are all prepared to launch a decisive battle to end discrimination once for all.

In his address, Jasvir Singh, shared information regarding the work being done by him during the last one year and his plan for further development of the area in the press conference in Jammu.

Jasvir Singh informed that in the last one year, the works which have been closed for years and are waiting for completion in Panchari Moungri have been restarted with the help of District Administration and Panchayati Raj Institution and all efforts are being made

to complete them soon and dedicate them to the public.

Among them, the hospitals being built by the Public Works Department, in which Badhotra, Lander, Mongari, Lali, Bariote, Damanot and Ladda are prominent.

In the education sector, Jasvir Singh added, construction has been expedited and efforts are being made to complete the works at Galio, Lander, Panchari, Panjar, Damnot and Ladda. The building of Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya Basnote will soon be completed and dedicated to the public.

He considered drug addiction as the biggest threat to the entire society and especially to the younger generation. He reiterated his resolve to make Panchari Moungri area drug free.

Singh demanded introduction of a new youth policy, a new recruitment policy, to fill up vacancies quickly, to make temporary employees permanent. He said that the Center should now hold assembly elections for bright future of Jammu and Kashmir.

Rana calls for stakeholder partnership to restore glory of old Jammu

JAMMU: Calling for multi-stakeholder partnership in development to assuage aspirations of all segments of the society, senior BJP leader and former legislator, Devender Singh Rana on Thursday sought expansion of heritage status of the old Jammu upto Mubarak Mandi, covering all the interior markets, upwards the historic Raghunath Bazar in order to restore the pristine glory of the Dogra pride but with a caveat that it should not impede the business prospects of these Bazaars in fact should be done with the purpose of increased traffic to these Bazaars thereby restoring their business opportunities as well.

"We urge Lt Governor Manoj Sinha to constitute an empowered panel, comprising the officers of the line departments and representatives from the trade and commerce to draw a road map for this purpose under the Jammu Smart City Project", Rana said during his interaction with traders of the heritage markets of the old city.

The office bearers of various market associations accompanied Rana during his exhaustive tour of the areas surrounding Mubarak Mandi, the Dogra seat of power of yester-years. They included Subash Abrol, President Mubarak

Mandi Bazar Association, Sanjay Jain, President Sarafa Association, Harish Gupta, President Paccia Danga Bazar Association, Rajesh Verma President Upper Bazar Association and others.

Rana said that all the points raised would be taken up with the concerned departments and appropriate forums for earnest action. He said development becomes unproductive if the stakeholders are not taken on board in the implementation of renovation and upgradation in particular. He said the participatory role of the people is necessary for successful execution of development projects. Earlier Rana also visited Shashvat Art Gallery, a Manuscript Conservation Centre established by National Mission for Manuscript at Dhowhni Bazar where many ancient manuscripts are archived.

Rana complained that the residents and shopkeepers have been subjected to conditions appropriate to, what they stated, an undeclared administrative siege, especially after putting in place two steel gates in June last year.

'Swarnim Vijay Dwar' dedicated to 1971 war martyrs

JAMMU: The northern command of the India Army on Thursday commemorated the sacrifice of its forces in the 1971 war by dedicating to them 'Swarnim Vijay Dwar' in Udhampur. This year is the 50th anniversary of the 1971 India-Pakistan war, and is being celebrated as 'Swarnim Vijay Varsh'.

On Dec 16, 1971, about 93000 Pakistani armed soldiers surrendered to the Indian Army in a historic capitulation. The war was waged for the cause of liberation of the oppressed in the erstwhile East Pakistan, which resulted in formation of Bangladesh. More than 2500 Indian soldiers lost their lives during the war. Kargil War hero and northern command chief Lt Gen Y K Joshi dedicated the 'Swarnim Vijay Dwar' to the

supreme sacrifice of Indian soldiers in a ceremony at Udhampur Military Station, a defence spokesperson said. The General Officer Commanding-in-Chief (GOC-in-C), Northern Command presided over the event at the Dhruba War Memorial and laid a wreath on behalf of all ranks of northern command, the spokesperson said.

The day was also marked by the unveiling of busts of two Param Vir Chakra and 18 Maha Vir Chakra recipients who participated in the 1971 War.

On December 7, the Khalra cycling expedition was also flagged off at Rakhmuthi Military Station at Akhnoor, Kashmir to commemorate the war anniversary. During its 10-day course, the expedition, undertaken by a team of 14 Soldiers, covered a distance of 650 Kilometres.

Infant mortalities in Ramnagar due to spurious drugs

NHRC again seeks proof of payment of compensation from J&K Govt

JAMMU: National Human Right Commission (NHRC) vide its recent direction has directed its Registry to issue final reminder to Chief Secretary, Govt. of UT of Jammu & Kashmir as well as Additional Secretary, Department of Health and Medical Education, UT of Jammu & Kashmir to submit proof of payment of Rs 3 lakh to NoKs of each deceased infants/child within six weeks positively failing which the commission will be constrained to invoke its coercive powers under section 13 of PHR Act, 1993 calling for personal appearance of the authority concerned before the commission. NHRC also directed UT administration that the additional /complete report as directed by the commission, be sent to it latest by January 29, 2022 for further consideration.

Sukesh C Khajuria an eminent Sr. Social Activist of J&K had approached

the NHRC for ordering appropriate compensation to the victims and fixing of responsibility of the state authorities in the case. The issue of deaths of infants/children due to consumption of a particular spurious cough syrup in Ramnagar Tehsil of Udhampur during the month of December 2019-January 2020 was taken up by Khajuria with NHRC seeking compensation for the families of victims and fixing of the responsibility of the concerned authorities. While taking up the matter on September 7, 2020 the Commission, after consideration of facts & circumstances of the case, found that there was a procedural lapse on the part of the Drug Department of the State of Jammu & Kashmir wherein the authority had duly failed to keep a regular vigil on the contamination and contents of medicines sold within its jurisdiction and thus held that the State is vicariously liable for said negligence. In view of

that, by exercising power under section 18(a) of PHR Act, 1993, the Commission directed Chief Secretary, Govt. of Jammu & Kashmir to show cause within four weeks as to why the Commission should not recommend payment of compensation of Rs. 3,00,000 to NoKs of each deceased in the present case, who died due to consumption of adulterated oral syrup/medicine. The authority was further directed also to file report with regard to action taken against the delinquent officials, on account of whose negligence such incident occurred. On one hand, the UT administration has been trying to portray that it was willing to pay compensation to victims, on the other hand it has even filed a special leave petition (SLP) in the Supreme Court against the order of J&K High Court which has not only rejected plea of administration against the payment of compensation but also passed strictures against conduct of the bureaucracy. The parents of victims/next of kin (NoK) of each deceased infants had completed all formalities with the Tehsildar Ramnagar submitting all the required documents/information like (i) name of the account holder (ii) Name of Bank & Branch (iii) bank account number (iv) IFSC code (v) copy of Aadhar card and undertaking on an affidavit duly attested by the 1st class magistrate stating that in event of any adverse judgment by the Apex Court in the matter of SLP titled Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir & ors. VS National Human Rights Commission & ors (pending adjudication) the compensation amount shall be returned back to the Government within a period of one month from date of any such judgment. Speaking regarding the case, Khajuria said, "Although, money cannot replace a human life but still can give some solace to the bereaved families who mostly are poor."
