PSB strike: Banking...

like cash withdrawals, cheque clearances and loan approvals came to a standstill due to bank branches not being operational.

Banking operations are likely to be impacted on Friday as well.

The pan-India strike was called by the United Forum of Bank Unions (UFBU) to protest against the government's decision to privatise two more state-run lenders this fiscal.

UFBU is an umbrella body of nine unions, including All India Bank Officers' Confederation (AIBOC), All India Bank Employees Association (AIBEA) and National Organisation of Bank Workers (NOBW).

The government had in Budget 2021-22 announced its intent to take up privatisation of two PSBs during the year.

Shutters of many branches of PSBs like State Bank of India (SBI), Punjab National Bank and Bank of India were down on Thursday with a message informing customers about the strike.

Apart from PSBs, some employees from old generation private sector banks and regional rural banks also joined the strike, unions said.

Bank employees right from sweepers to senior executives in scale 5 are observing the two-day strike on December 16 and 17, they said.

According to AIBEA General Secretary C H Venkatachalam, about 20.4 lakh cheques worth Rs 18,600 crore could not be transacted on Thursday.

Public sector lenders, including SBI, had earlier informed customers that services in their branches might be affected due to the strike.

"PSBs act as catalysts in the economic development of our nation in general and particularly for the underprivileged sections of the society and backward regions of the country.

"Nationalised banks have played a major role in the development of agriculture, small trade, small business, SSI, transport and in upliftment of weaker sections of the society," Venkatachalam said.

AIBOC General Secretary Soumya Dutta said it is unfortunate that operations of over 1 lakh branches of banks and regional rural banks have been impacted due to the strike because of the government's attitude.

Venkatachalam said many political parties including Congress, DMK, CPI, CPM, TMC, NCP and Shiv Sena have extended their support to the strike.

UFBU's Convenor (Maharashtra) Devidas Tuljapurkar said employee unions from Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) and Reserve Bank of India (RBI) have also supported the strike.

Around 60,000 PSB staffers in Maharashtra joined the strike.

In Mumbai, approximately 5,000 bank employees held a protest at Azad Maidan, he said.

UFBU's Convenor (West Bengal) Goutam Niyogi claimed the strike in the state was total.

Besides the two-day strike, a series of other agitations will be carried out if the government does not give up the idea of privatising PSBs, AIBOC General Secretary Sanjay Das said.

Das said the move to privatise state-owned lenders will hurt the priority sectors of the economy as well as credit flow to self-help groups and the rural economy.

According to him, 70 per cent of the country's total deposits are with PSBs and handing them over to private capital will put the common man's money at risk.

A section of bank employees, representing the All India Bank Employees Union, wore black badges and staged a protest in Chennai, raising slogans against the Centre's move.

In Tamil Nadu, the ruling Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) threw its weight behind the strike by offering its 'total support' to the protest.

The DMK was extending its support to the strike after union representatives

apprised party president and Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin on the just reasons behind the agitation, party General Secretary Durai Murugan had said.

In Rajasthan, 25,000 officers and employees working in more than 4,000 branches of PSBs participated in the strike, UFBU's state convenor said.

Bank employees held a demonstration outside the SBI office near Ambedkar circle in Jaipur.

In the Union Budget presented in February, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman had announced the privatisation of two PSBs as part of the Centre's disinvestment plan.

To facilitate privatisation, the government has listed the Banking Laws (Amendment) Bill, 2021, for introduction and passage during the current session of Parliament.

The government has already privatised IDBI Bank by selling its majority stake in the lender to LIC in 2019 and merged 14 public sector banks in the past four years.

Govt permits change...

permission is to be granted within 30 days of filing of the application with a provision of deemed approval if no decisions are taken.

The powers have been delegated to the District Collector to grant permission for land up to 12 ½ standard acres against a fee of 5 per cent of the market value of the land notified under the Stamps Act.

The regulations empower the applicant to commence the non agriculture use on the permitted land within one year from the date of the order issued by the District Collector in this behalf. However, the land can be diverted and used only for the purpose specified in the permission.

Moreover, the regulations provide exemption from seeking the permission in cases of conversion for construction of residential house or farm-related buildings and storages with a ceiling of 400 Sq. mtrs (17 Marla).

The Assistant Commissioner (Revenue), Sub-Divisional Magistrate and Tehsildar concerned have been entrusted with the responsibility of monitoring the implementation of these regulations within their respective areas of jurisdiction. Besides, it will be the duty of every Agriculture Extension Officer to report cases of violation to the revenue officers and any neglect on this account can attract disciplinary action for dereliction of duty.

The decision is aimed at ensuring production of sufficient quantity of food grains, besides promoting orderly growth of industrial and services sector in this Union territory and creation of employment.

He said District Development Council elections were announced with the aim to break the People's Alliance for Gupkar Declaration (PAGD).

"They thought either the alliance will break over seat-sharing or it will lose elections. Neither of the two happened. In fact, the alliance won the maximum number of seats. It proved that people from Kashmir and Jammu were not with the decision taken in August 2019.

Nothing has come to change that. Just like a resolution was passed in Parliament with regard to Jammu and Kashmir. Whenever there is talk about J-K, the members of Parliament say entire Jammu and Kashmir belongs to India and it is the job of the government to implement the resolution. On the same lines, the resolution of Assembly is binding on all governments," Abdullah said.

He said the BJP is actively pursuing the resolution route to erase the previous resolution passed by the assembly 21 years ago.

"They know our case in the Supreme Court is strong. Had our case been weak, the hearings would have been held much earlier. That's why they want to pass the resolution in the assembly," he added.

They said that despite elapse of considerable time, they were not provided any job by Harmeet, who has went underground and both are now unable to contact him. Police has registered a case against accused and started manhunt to nab him.

Thief arrested; Rs 2.04 lakh worth stolen property recovered

REASI: Police on Thursday solved a theft case by arresting accused and recovered stolen property worth Rs 2.04 lakh from his possession.

As per the details, on November 21, one Babli Devi and her husband Rajinder Singh, resident of Village-Seela Tehsil & District Reasi reported at Police Station Reasi that on intervening night of November 20-21, when both were not at home, some unidentified thieves struck their house. The entered the house at Seela and decamped with one Gold



nath, one Tikka, one Mangalsutra, one pair of ear-rings, One Ring, one pair of Silver Payal worth more than Rs 2 lakh. On this, FIR no 226/2021 under sections 457, 380 of IPC was registered at Police Station Reasi and investigation initiated.

Police team swung into action and suspects were rounded up. With the help of CCTV footage & enquiries, a prime suspect was zeroed in. During investigations it came to fore that the suspect was at Seela, Reasi on the day of crime. After hectic efforts, he was identified as Kewal Singh, son of Kaka Ram, resident of Gadhri, District Reasi. Team of Police Station Reasi started search for the accused who continuously evaded the arrest by changing his locations. On night of December 15, 2021 Police team raided a spot and nabbed him. During sustained questioning, the accused confessed his crime. On his disclosure, police team recovered stolen Gold & Silver items worth approximately Rs 2.04 Lakh. Further investigation in the case is going on to unearth his links in other theft cases.

Tourist igloo hut gutted at Bhadarwah

BHADARWAH: Tourism property worth lakhs was reduced to ashes when an igloo hut located at famous tourist resort at Khellani area caught fire in mysterious circumstances on Thursday afternoon.

According to reports, one of the 5 igloo huts build by Bhadarwah Development Authority (BDA) at Khellani tourist resort, 15 Km from Bhadarwah town caught fire and within an hour, entire PVC structure was reduced to ashes. No one was injured in fire incident although locals tried to extinguish fire as fire tenders could not reached spot.

When contacted, CEO BDA Navdeep Wazir said that after witnessing smoke from one of igloos at Khellani tourist resort, employees immediately rushed to the spot and along with locals tried to extinguish fire. "It seems that fire was caused due to short-circuit inside the igloo. We are going to lodge an FIR to get the matter investigated," he told.

Rs 11,900 fine recovered from SoPs violators in Ramban

RAMBAN: Continuing the enforcement drive to implement COVID protocol across

the district Ramban, the Enforcement teams on Thursday fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance.

The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs 11,900 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs. 72,96,400.

The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking COVID vaccination doses at their nearest CVC. District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr Suresh informed that as many as 1765 persons were administered second COVID vaccine doses across Ramban district on Thursday. As per daily bulletin issued by Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 2,487 samples including 640 RT-PCR and 1,847 RAT samples besides administering COVID vaccine to 1765 persons at dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.

Burglary case solved; stolen items recovered, 2 arrested

MANJAKOTE: Working out a case of burglary in Manjakote, police on Thursday arrested two persons involved in a case of theft of electronic items from a store.

In an official statement, police said that a case of burglary was worked out by team of Manjakote police station. Police said that a written application was submitted at Police Station Manjakote by owner of store stating that during the intervening night of December 7-8, some unknown person entered his store located at main market Manjakote and decamped with some items.

On this, FIR No 167/2021 under sections 457, 380 of IPC was registered at Police Station Manjakote and a team of police headed by SHO Manjakote, Harmohinder Singh under supervision of SDPO Manjakote Tanveer Jeelani started investigation into the matter. The investigation team gathered some inputs that stolen items are kept by accused in house of one Makhan Din alias Makhna, son of Noor Hussain, resident of Hayatpura, Manjakote which was taken on rent by some outsiders and during search, stolen items were recovered which included two batteries (250 mAh, 165mAh), two water geysers, two stabilizers, five hotplates, ten bundles of wires and 150 LED lights.

The two suspects were zeroed in by police and during investigation they confessed the crime. Identified as Mohd Rizwan, son of Zamurad, resident of Hayatpura Manjakote and Abdul Rehman son of Mohd Hussain resident of Dhanore Rajouri, the accused further told that they have also stolen two motorcycles, which were recovered from their possession.

BSF ASI attempts suicide
