Jammu areas plunge into darkness, PDD employees go on strike

JAMMU/SRINAGAR: Many parts of Jammu and Kashmir on Saturday witnessed complete power shutdown as thousands of power supply employees on Saturday launched a "work boycott" across Jammu and Kashmir to press for their four-point demands, including shelving a proposed joint venture between the Jammu and Kashmir Power Transmission Corporation Limited and the Power Grid Corporation of India Limited.

The employees, from all unions and associations, from linemen to senior engineers, decided to go on indefinite strike after failure of talks with the government, and staged demonstrations in the twin capital cities besides in district headquarters, a spokesperson of the coordination committee of power supply employees said.

He said they had presented a four-point formula to the government but it failed to accept their demands, including a white paper on non-fulfilment of the recommendations of the unbundling report and the failure to create positions as mandated by the committee at gazetted and non-gazetted levels, regularisation of daily wagers and regularisation of all Power Development Department engineers. They also demanded delinking their salary from grant-in-aid and releasing a regular budget for all PDD employees on deputation to different corporations and a white paper of service condition of PDD employees on deputation to the Chenab Valley Power Projects Private Limited (CVPPPL) and similarly situated employees deputed from the NHPC, the spokesperson said.


RSS not Govt's remote control, says Bhagwat

COVID: J&K records 151 fresh cases, one death

JAMMU: With 151 fresh cases, Jammu and Kashmir's COVID-19 tally has climbed to 3,39,691, while the death toll due to the viral disease has gone up to 4,511 with one more fatality, officials said on Saturday.

Of the fresh cases, 42 were reported from the Jammu division and 109 from the Kashmir division of the Union Territory, they added.

Srinagar district recorded the highest number of 55

cases, followed by 17 cases each in Baramulla and Jammu districts, the officials said. There are 1,458 active cases of the infection in the Union Territory currently, while the number of patients who have recuperated is 3,33,722, they added.


There are 50 confirmed cases of mucormycosis (black fungus) in the Union Territory, the officials said, adding that no fresh case was reported since Friday evening.
