JAMMU: Scripting a convincing victory by five wickets over formidable Game Changer Cricket Club in the summit clash, BCC United lifted the title trophy of Nagrota Premier League T20 Cricket Tournament organised by Team Jammu at Khel Gaon, Nagrota, near here on Monday.

JAMMU: Haryana batters toyed with poor Jammu and Kashmir bowlers and sent them on a leather-hunt to pile a big score of 319/3 at stumps on day-1 of the ongoing Cooch Behar Trophy at Dr Rajasekhara Reddy ACA VDCA Cricket Stadium, Vizag on Monday.

As per report reaching here, earlier, winning the toss and batting first, Haryana openers began cautiously but confidently and scored 120 runs in 31.2 overs, before Ayush Kumar was dismissed by left-arm spinner Ranjot

Singh for 70 off 95 balls. Another opener, Mayank Shandilya contributed sedate 67 runs off 138 balls, while Ahaan Poddar scored 63 off 125 balls.

Parth Vats was unbeaten on magnificent 89 off 151 balls, while Sarvesh Rohilla was at the crease with 8 runs at the draw of stumps today.

The pathetic show of J&K bowlers continued as none of the bowlers was impressive for major part of Haryana innings.

Ranjot Singh claimed 1 wicket by conceding 88 runs in his 22 overs, while

another left-arm spinner claimed 1 wicket in his 21 overs by giving away 90 runs. Speedster Dhruv Singh Parmar bagged 1 wicket by conceding 45 runs in his 16 overs, while Jasbir Singh was wicketless in his economical 14 overs, giving away just 18 runs.

With fourth match in this Multi-Day tournament and five matches already played in Vinoo Mankad One-Day Trophy, the J&K team management is still busy in trying to give bowlers role to batters and vice-versa. The result is evident.

The meeting held here today at the Chamber House was chaired by President CCI Jammu, Arun Gupta and attended among others by Sr. Vice President, Anil Gupta; Jr. Vice President, Rajeev Gupta; Secretary General, Gaurav Gupta; Secretary, Rajesh Gupta and Treasurer, Rajesh Gupta.

Addressing media persons after the meeting, President CCI Jammu, Arun Gupta said that it is a matter of great concern that common man is being made to suffer on account of the tussle between the PDD employees and the UT administration in resolving the issues of these employees.

Arun Gupta said that the people are already suffering due to the ongoing Covid pandemic, and now without electricity they have been left to fend for themselves. He said the traders and business establishments including industries have been adversely affected as they cannot run their busi-

nesses in absence of electricity especially in view of the fact that nowadays substantial transactions related to business, commerce and industries are conducted online.

Moreover, the drinking water supply remains badly affected due to black out in the region thus adding further to the woes of people, he lamented.

Even the students attending online classes are suffering badly as the online facility depends on power supply. It would be wrong to state that every section of the society is suffering due to indefinite strike of the employees of the Power Department, Arun Gupta asserted.

On behalf of the Chamber of Commerce and Industries Jammu, Arun Gupta made a fervent appeal to the Union Territory

Administration to resolve the genuine issues of the PDD employees at the earliest so that the normal power supply is restored and the people do not have to suffer any more.
