JAMMU: A delegation of PoJK Pahari Speaking Displaced People's Forum on Thursday met Additional Commissioner in the office of Divisional Commissioner Jammu. The delegation raised the issue of persistent delay while issuing Pahari Speaking Certificate to the PoJK displaced persons settled in Jammu division except Poonch and Rajouri. Representing their concerns, the delegation expressed that the displaced persons (DPs) of PoJK are basically the aboriginal of Poonch, Muzaffarabad and Mirpur districts (now in PoJK). They were forcefully displaced from these areas in 1947 after the tribal invasion in which thousands were violently murdered, burned and raped,

leaving behind their properties, they added. As per the records of GoI 31,619 (registered) and 9,500 (unregistered) families managed to escape from the tribal invasion are presently settled in Jammu and Kashmir. During the last seven decades the community continued to

stay in the camps which have not been regularized in revenue records, they said adding that the community does not have complete ownership rights.

The delegation also explained that several youths of the displaced community applied for the PSP certificate as per pro-

visions of SO 127 dated 20 April 2020 but the applications are not being entertained and delayed unreasonably on one or the other pretext.

The delegation demanded immediate intervention of Divisional Commissioner in the matter and issue clear instructions in writing to the concerned Tehsildars so that they can issue PSP certificates to the entitled applicants and avoid unnecessary delay and embarrassment to the members of the displaced community. The delegation included Om Parkash Khajuria, Manik Sharma, Vinod Sharma, Naveen Sharma, Jyotish Sudan, Prince Saksham and Jatin Raina.

SO extending term of Srinagar Gurdwara office bearers quashed by High Court

JAMMU: Justice Sanjeev Kumar of J&K High Court has quashed SO No. 218 dated 13-07-2020, acting in exercise of powers conferred upon it by Rule 63-C supra, which extended term of office bearers elected in 2015 for a period of three months from the date of expiry of their term or till the elections to the committee were held under the Act of 1973 and Rules framed there under, whichever earlier.

While quashing SO, Justice Sanjeev Kumar directed that petitioners in WP(C) 1762/2021, who are also respondents 6 to 10 in WP(C) 1931/2021, are not legally entitled to continue in office beyond term of five years, for which they were elected and at least beyond the expiry of three months after expiry of their term in view of extension granted by Government. High Court fur-

ther observed that the administration and management of Sikh Gurdwaras all over the Union Territory of J&K, in particular in district Srinagar, cannot be kept in limbo and, therefore, a constitution/nomination of Sikh Gurdwara Prabandhak Committee, Srinagar, is inevitable and that with a view to run day-to-day administration and management of Sikh Gurdwaras of district Srinagar, the Government shall come out with an appropriate notification in terms of Rule 63-C of the Rules of 1975, constituting/nominating suitable Gurdwara Prabandhak Committee within a period of four weeks. Court further directed the Government to ensure that neither the petitioners of WP(C) 1762/2021 nor the petitioners of WP(C) 1931/2021 are nominated to the aforesaid Prabandhak Committee.

It shall be advisable if Government constitutes a committee of some independent persons having no affiliation with rival factions litigating in the Courts of law. The Government shall do well to appoint some retired District & Sessions Judge or an officer, serving or retired, of the rank of not less than an Additional District Magistrate to head the committee and all functions under Act of 1973 and Rules framed there under, shall be performed by the committee till the atmosphere is congenial and elections to the Gurdwara Prabandhak Committee are held in accordance with the provisions of Act of 1973. Court further directed that until such committee is appointed by the Government and it takes over the administration and management of Sikh Gurdwaras of district Srinagar, the present dispensation shall continue.

Pension fraud: CB produces charge-sheet against 5 persons

SRINAGAR: Crime Branch Kashmir has produced a charge-sheet against five persons including Executive Engineer R&B Division Pulwama for fraudulently preparing a fictitious family pension case in which daughter-in-law was shown as the wife of the deceased man.

An official of the Crime Branch Kashmir said that the chargesheet in the case (FIR No. 09/2017) under section 420, 468, 471, 120-B-RPC was submitted before Court of Special Mobile Magistrate, Pulwama against accused persons-Fazi Begum, Abdul Rashid Laway, both residents of Lurgam Thal, Ali Mohd Wani, the then Executive Engineer R&B Division Pulwama of government Housing Colony Benina Srinagar, Harbajan Singh, the then Junior Assistant, of Baygum Thal, and Ayaz Mushtaq Bhat, the then Assistant Accounts Officer R & B Division Pulwama of Simmaniya Colony Karewa Kulgam. The case was registered based on a complaint, alleging that one Abdul Rashid Laway, Employee of R&B Division Pulwama, has fraudulently prepared a fictitious family pension case of his father in favour of his wife in place of actual claimant. During the course of enquiry, the CBK said, it was revealed that the accused persons in furtherance of criminal conspiracy with

the concerned officials of R&B Division Pulwama resorted to falsification of documents and processed a family pension case in favour of daughter in law of the deceased i.e. wife of accused and reflected Fazi Begum as wife of Abdul Rahim Laway (deceased), when the fact is that the said Fazi Begum was her daughter-in-law, the CBK said. On the basis of false documents, the CBK said, the family pension was settled by the competent authority and a huge amount was found to have been received as pension by the wife of accused, as the actual claimant i.e. Janna wife of deceased employees had expired before the death of Abdul Rahim Laway. Subsequently the act of omission and Commission on the part of accused persons prima facie disclosed the commission of offence punishable U/S 420, 468, 471 RPC and accordingly the instant case was registered at police Station Crime Branch Kashmir and investigation set into motion, the CBK said. "During the course of investigation, it has been established that the accused persons in criminal conspiracy with each other prepared illegal pension case by preparing fake pension Book, descriptive Roll certificate and life certificate in favour of Fazi Begum, which caused loss of RS. 9.5 lacs to the state exchequer."
