Rajnath unveils 27 BRO projects including 9 bridges in J&K


NEW DELHI: Defense Minister Rajnath Singh today inaugurated several road and bridge projects constructed by Border Road Organisation (BRO) in four States and 02 Union Territories through an online ceremony from South Block, New Delhi here.

Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh, who accompanied Rajnath Singh on the occasion, hailed the inauguration of nine bridges in Jammu & Kashmir, out of which four happen to be in his Lok Sabha constituency of Udhampur-Kathua-Doda. The four bridges in the Lok Sabha constituency of Udhampur-Doda-Kathua include Birhon Bridge-I and Birhom Bridge-II in Udhampur, Gutassa Bridge in district Doda and Nagrah Bridge in district Kishtwar.

Dr Jitendra Singh also made a written request to the Defense Minister to name the critical Birhon Bridge at Udhampur after local martyr Late Captain Tushar

The importance of Birhon Bridge is that it not only facilitates traffic between Udhampur and Jammu and onwards, but the Northern Command is also located near the bridge site. Therefore, this bridge is a vital link between various Army units and the Command Hospital at Udhampur.

The salient feature of Gutassa Bridge on Pul-Doda-Bhaderwah road is that

besides enhancing connectivity for the general public, it is also an important connectivity route for Security Forces in the militancy prone areas. The Nagrah Bridge on Dul-Galhar road will be the lifeline for the traffic coming from Kisthwar towards Gulabgarh and Paddar. This is the only route available to the Holy Yatra Machel Mata.

The other bridges in Jammu & Kashmir include Laspatgarh Bridge on Nallah Bridge, Z-Khusi Bridge on Bandipora-Gurez road, Asthan Bridge on Hazibal-Zaindar Gali and Rajan Bridge on Payarpora-Guthampori road. In total, Rajnath Singh dedicated to

the nation 24 bridges and three roads, built by Border Roads Organisation (BRO) in four States and two Union Territories, through a virtual event from New Delhi on December 28, 2021. Of the 24 bridges, nine are in Jammu & Kashmir; five each in Ladakh & Pradesh; three Uttarakhand and one each in Sikkim & Arunachal Pradesh.

Of the three roads, two are in Ladakh and one is in West Bengal. The main highlight was the inauguration of India's first indigenous Class 70 140feet Double-Lane Modular Bridge, built at the height of 11,000 feet at Flag Hill Dokala, Sikkim and Chisumle-Demchok road at Umling La Pass at over 19,000 feet in Ladakh which also holds the Guinness World Record of world's highest motorable road.

Ex-Tehsildar convicted in disproportionate assets case in Jammu

JAMMU: A former govern ment official was sentenced to three years in jail by a special court on Tuesday in a disproportionate assets case, an official said.

Two other accused in case filed in 2008 were acquitted by the court for want of sufficient evidence, a spokesperson of the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) said in a statement. He further said that special anti-corruption Judge Ritesh Dubey convicted former Tehsildar Janak Singh of Shastri Nagar area in Jammu in FIR No.4/2008 registered at Police Station

VOJ (now ACB Jammu) for acquiring assets disproportionate to income, acquiring assets without permission from Government and also acquiring assets in benami transactions under sections 5 (1) (e) read with 5 (2) J&K PC Act Syt. 2006 and Sections 109 and 120-B Section 12/2014 Public Men & Public Servant Declaration of Assets Act and Section (3) of J&K transactions (Prohibition) Act, 2010.

After hearting APP Irshad Ahmed for ACB whereas Adv K S Charak for the accused, the Court awarded three

years' simple imprisonment and one-year simple imprisonment for offences under Public Men & Public Servants Declaration of Assets Act and two years' simple imprisonment for commission of offences under the Benami Transactions (Prohibition) Act to the former government official, the spokesman said.

The case was registered against the revenue official on the basis of a verification conducted into the allegations that he had raised assets disproportionate to his known sources of income

J&K reports 91 new COVID cases, Ladakh 14 STATE TIMES NEWS

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir on Tuesday recorded 91 Covid cases-- 32 from the Jammu division and 59 from the Kashmir division, thus taking the total number of positive cases in the Union Territory to 340924.

Also, one Covid related death has been reported from the Valley, an official said.

Moreover, 127 more COVID-19 patients have recovered and been discharged from various hospiincluding 29from Jammu Division and 98 from Kashmir Division.

According to a Media Bulletin, out of 340924 positive cases, 1296are Active

Positive (347 in Jammu Division and 949in Kashmir 335103 have Division), recovered and 4525 have died; 2197 in Jammu division and 2328in Kashmir division.

The Bulletin further said that out of 19133058 test results available, 340924 samples have tested positive and 18792134 samples have been tested as negative till Besides, COVID tests have been conducted in last 24 hours.

Till date 5157331 persons have been enlisted for observation which included 8293 persons in home quarantine including facilities operated by government, 1296 in isolation and 432472 in home surveillance. 4710745 persons have completed their surveillance peri-

Meanwhile, the Covid death toll in Ladakh has climbed to 219 following a fatality in Leh, while 14 fresh cases pushed the overall infection tally to 22,105 in the union territory, officials said.

All the 14 fresh cases were reported in Leh.

The number of active cases has declined to 193 in the union territory -- 141 cases in Leh district and 52 in Kargil district.


