

Congress to hold Grand Mehangai Hatao Rally at Jaipur on Dec 12

JAMMU: Congress is holding a grand rally "Mehangai Hatao" at Jaipur on December 12 against Sky rocketing inflation unprecedented price rise, record unemployment and sinking economy, causing severe misery to the people of the nation.

This was disclosed by the JKPPC Chief G.A. Mir while interacting with the Senior PCC Functionaries here today to discuss the participation of leaders and office bearers of the party and frontal wings from Jammu and Kashmir in the proposed rally. While referring to chapter of the books, he said that the books give ample opportunity to the intelligentsia to view the problem in J&K from different perspective and the ways to tackle the problems from a different mode.

Bhardwaj also lauded the efforts of Jamwal and said that it is noteworthy that J&K High Court Bar Association has once again taken a lead in starting a debate to find a permanent solution to the vexed problem. He expressed hope

that there will be discussions and seminars on the topic in near future.

The author of the book, who is also the President of Criminologists Society, while throwing light on the salient features of the books said that all the books written so far has strong linkages with his earlier works and his endeavours of the past thirty two years.

Jamwal said that he has tried to give solutions to many pressing problems of the country and the UT of J&K by different kind of endeavours.

He said that latest studies show that Kashmir violence may have biological factors as well, besides psychological and

other factors as discussed in the book on Kashmir.

The book throws light on many unknown facets about the historical and present mess up issues and he has tried to offer a different kind of solution to the lingering Kashmir problem, which can of much use, if peace is to be established and the avenues of progress are to be made available to the resident of J&K UT. Jamwal also spoke on another book and said it has also much relevance to United Nations and International community as it suggests ways to attain sustainable development goals through Indian Philosophical means.
