

Cyber Police recovers smart-phones worth lakhs

SRINAGAR: Cyber Police Kashmir Zone, Srinagar has recovered missing mobile phones worth lakhs of rupees and handed over the same to their rightful owners.

In order to extend services to the general public and to redress their grievances, Cyber Police Kashmir is receiving applications/complaints from general public about missing of mobile phones. This was apart from various online frauds, scams and other Cyber related crimes, which were reported in Cyber Police Station Kashmir Zone on routine basis. A constant 24x7 effort is made by Cyber Police Kashmir through special teams to investigate such crimes besides tracing missing mobile-phones by using advanced technological and conventional methods. Cyber Police therefore remains on forefront in helping citizens in various technological challenges being faced by them.

In a latest development, Cyber Police Kashmir was successful in its efforts by tracing 53 such missing smart cell-phones of various makes and models worth lakhs of rupees, which were accordingly handed over to their rightful owners at Cyber Police Station Headquarters Srinagar. On the directions of IGP Kashmir Zone, various awareness campaigns and programmes have also been initiated by Cyber Police Kashmir, wherein general public is made aware about various contemporary online frauds, scams etc.

Drug peddler arrested; huge quantity of contraband recovered

ANANTNAG: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs from society, Police on Tuesday arrested a drug peddler in Anantnag and recovered huge quantity of contraband from his possession.

As per details, Police Station Bijbehara received a specific information through reliable sources that one Ishfaq Hussain Malik, son of Mohd Hussain Maillk, resident of Arwani Bijbehara has indulged in drug peddling and has hoarded a huge quantity of narcotic substance in his house. On receipt information, a Police party under the supervision of SDPO Bijbehara along with Executive Magistrate raided the specific location. During search, officers were able to recover 53 Kg Bhukki and 1.2 Kg Charas Chura from a 7-ft deep pit made in kitchen garden of house. He was arrested and shifted to police station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, a case under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Bijbehara and further investigation has been initiated.

Rs 27,400 fine recovered from COVID SoPs violators

RAMBAN: Continuing enforcement drive to implement COVID protocol across the district Ramban, Enforcement teams on Tuesday fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance.

The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs 27,400 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs. 70,68,200. The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking COVID vaccination doses at their nearest CVC. District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr Suresh informed that as many as 1043 persons were administered first and second COVID vaccine doses across Ramban district on Tuesday. As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 2,658 samples including 645 RT-PCR and 2,013 RAT samples besides administering COVID vaccine to 1,043 persons at dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.

400 vehicles booked on NH-44 for traffic violations

RAMBAN: Motor Vehicle Department (MVD) has booked about 400 vehicles on Jammu-Srinagar National Highway during its ongoing drive launched to tighten noose around violators. The transporters were booked for violations like overloading, over-speeding, overcharging and other offences.

Assistant Regional Transport Officer, Shafqat Majid along with other MVD officials and Traffic police conducted the drive.

Meanwhile, leading a checking squad at Seri, the Deputy Commissioner, Ramban, Massarat Islam personally inspected several vehicles and advised passengers to check condition of vehicle and other necessary documents before starting their journey. The DC further said that MVD has also intensified an awareness drive across the district to sensitise people, especially drivers and conductors about traffic rules as well as other road safety measures to avoid untoward incidents.

The DC informed that during the drive the Motor Vehicle Department Ramban has checked nearly 2,500 vehicles and Challaned 400 for different violations under MV Act. He said that Traffic and District Police have also started such drives in different areas to avoid road accidents.

The ARTO informed that MVD checking squad inspected more than 500 vehicles, out of which 29 were booked for violation of various rules. He also sensitized drivers and transporters about traffic rules and documents required during driving.

42 bovines rescued, 4 smugglers arrested

JAMMU/KATHUA: In a massive drive against bovine smuggling, Police on Tuesday rescued 8 bovines from two vehicles (JK02BK/5329 & JK02AL/7083) at Ban Toll Plaza Naka and arrested two smugglers, while at Kathua police also rescued 34 bovines and arrested 2 smugglers.

In this regard, two FIRs No. 442 & 443/2021 under relevant sections of law were registered at Police Station Nagrota. The accused were identified as Lakhvinder Choudhary, son of Sudagar Mal, resident of Chal Agra R S Pura and Dharampal, son of Munshi Ram, resident of Shahpur R S Pura.

During investigation, a person namely Raj Kumar, son of Om Parkash, resident of Bhojpur R S Pura produced two copies of permission for transportation of animals, but on verification from concerned department, same proved as forged. Bovine smugglers are now adopting a modus operandi by preparing forged permission documents to transport animals from one district to another. The arrest and recoveries have been made by SHO Nagrota Insp Vishav Pratap Singh under supervision of SDPO Nagrota Parupkar Singh.

Meanwhile, a police team led by Insp. Amit Sangra SHO Rajbagh under the supervision of SDPO Border Sachit Mahajan during Naka/checking duty in its jurisdiction noticed a suspicious Truck (JK02BT-6357) which was being driven by driver namely Shokat Ali, son of Khan Mohd, resident of Darmari Tehsil Mahore District Reasi who was signalled to stop for checking. During checking of aforesaid vehicle 18 bovines were found loaded in it illegally which were rescued. The accused was arrested and FIR No. 253/2021 under section 188/IPC, 11PCA was registered against him at Police Station Rajbagh.

While in another instance, a team of Police Station Hiranagar under the supervision of Insp. Yash Paul Sharma SHO Hiranagar during Naka checking duty at Londi Morh noticed the movement of suspicious truck (JK02CC-1159) which was being driven by person namely Ahmed Din, son of Jalal Din, resident of Saral Tehsil & District Poonch was signalled to stop for checking. During checking said police found 16 more bovines which were tied with ropes in mercilessly manner. All the 16 bovines were rescued and accused was arrested. FIR No. 157/2021 under sections 188/IPC, 11PCA Act was registered at Police Station Hiranagar.

Jhajjar Kotli Rs 100 cr heroin recovery case: Police teams again to visit Punjab, Srinagar

JAMMU: Taking forward investigations in Rs 100 cr heroin recovery case at Jhajjar Kotli, police teams will be again sent to Srinagar and Punjab. Recently, a team has already visited Punjab but returned empty handed. Now, another team will be sent so that absconding driver can be arrested.

According to the information, in November, Jhajjar Kotli police recovered a huge consignment of heroin from a truck but driver fled from the spot, while co-driver was arrested. He was taken on remand for questioning and during interrogation he informed that the goods were loaded in Srinagar. After this police got clues and contacted Srinagar Police. On other hand, after the remand, the arrested co-driver was taken to Amphalla Jail.

Temple burgled in broad-daylight; cash & rings stolen

Man found hanging in mysterious circumstances

JAMMU: A man was found hanging under mysterious circumstances in his house at Model Town, Gangwal on Tuesday.

As per details, 47 years Sukhjinder Singh was found hanging in his room following which family informed the police. The police took possession of the body and shifted it to morgue for autopsy. Family members told police that deceased was in stress after suffering loss in business.

Muslims perform last rites of elderly Kashmiri Hindu woman

KULGAM: Setting an example of communal harmony and brotherhood, local Muslims in Begam village of Kulgam came together to help performing last rites of their Hindu neighbour, who died on Tuesday.

As per the details, Lajwanti Devi, resident of Begam village in Kulgam was a Kashmiri Rajput Hindu and died at an age of 75 after a brief illness.

The Muslim neighbours joined hands to carry out all formalities for performing last rites of deceased woman, in line with cremation practices of Kashmiri Pandits. From setting-up cremation pyre to last minute rituals of carrying earthen pot to cremation ground, local Muslims performed every ritual.

Retired SI among two dead, 3 injured in car accident

NEWSHERA: A Retired Sub-inspector among two persons died while three others received serious injuries in a road accident that took place at Dalian on Rajouri-Nowshehra stretch of Jammu-Rajouri-Poonch highway.

As per details, a collision took place between an army vehicle on way towards Nowshehra from Rajouri and an Alto car (JK02BQ 5115) on way towards Rajouri from Jammu at Dhalian, due to which a person died on the spot while four others got injured. The deceased was identified as Mushtaq Khan (Retired SI), son of Fazal Khan, resident of Salwa Mendhar. The four injured were shifted to GMC Jammu and were identified as Atta Ullha Khan, son of Fazal Khan; Saleema Bi, wife of Mushtaq Khan; Ikra, daughter of Zaffar Ullha Khan and Amira Ishtaq, daughter of Ishtaq Ahmed, all residents of Mendhar. Later, Atta Ullha Khan succumbed to injuries at GMC Jammu.
