

# Outreach programmes under ‘Mulaqaat’ held in Rajouri, Baramulla

RAJOURI/BARAMULLA: In continuation to their outreach programmes across the UT of J&K and Ladakh, Taxpayers Awareness Campaign, 'Mulaqaat' was continued on Tuesday in the district of Rajouri and Baramulla.

In Rajouri, the Outreach Programme & Interactive Session was organised at Conference Hall, PWD Dak Bungalow, Rajouri. The programme was attended by Ajay Gupta, President, Income Tax and GST Bar Association, Rajouri, Rajesh Gupta, President, Beopar Mandal, Rajouri and Vipin Sahni, President, Hotel Association, Rajouri.

Prominent businessmen Kamal Gupta, Vishal Gupta, Mohd. Farooq, Sonu Bhat, DDOs from different departments, along with NCC cadets and college students also participated in the programme.

Kannav Sharma, Dy. Commissioner CGST and Romesh Sharma, Income Tax Officer alongwith the other officers of the Income Tax Department and CGST were also present.

The audience were made aware of the technological advances made for ease of compliance and also of the various initiatives taken the Income Tax Department and Central GST Department for better taxpayer services.

It was apprised to the attendees that the Income Tax Department treats the assessee as honest and they

were urged to fulfill their obligations by paying their taxes correctly & honestly in the nation building process.

The officers from the CGST department also explained the various facets of the GST regime including the ease of compliance initiative undertaken by the Department.

Rajesh Gupta, President, Beopar Mandal and Ajay Gupta, President, Income Tax and GST Bar Association raised various concerns regarding e-way bills, ITR filing dates and requested for increase in income tax exemption limits which were addressed by the Officers of the both the Department.

The NCC cadets also thanked the Departments for including young students in the outreach programme and expressed their views on the issues raised during the programme.

It was also assured that the feedback received on budget expectations, suggestions, queries & representations received will be communicated to the relevant forum.

A tax payer facilitation camp was also held at Aaykar Sewa Kendra, Income Tax Office, Rajouri where the attendees were informed about the various features of the new income tax e-filing portal.

In Baramulla, the Income Tax Department was represented by Abhishri, Assistant Commissioner of Income Tax, Srinagar. Neeraj Chowbey, Addl. Commissioner CGST and Varun Soni, Deputy Commissioner CGST were also present.

The representatives of the local youth, trade communities, fruit growers, small shopkeepers & businessmen and industrialists participated in large numbers in the programme.

Abhishri urged and motivated the audience to contribute to the task of nation building as honest and proud taxpayers.

Special emphasis was given to encourage the locals to pay their taxes diligently since tax collection and socio-economic development go hand in hand. Javed, a trade body representative, raised con-

cerns about the complicated nature of the Income Tax and GST laws.

The locals from both districts unanimously requested that awareness and educational camps be held in their district extensively to educate the public about the same. They insisted that the locals wanted to pay taxes but they needed guidance with respect to the same to encourage voluntary compliance. Both the Departments assured the locals that they were committed to the best taxpayer services and that there is no scope of any bias or harassment any more under the new transparent and accountable tax regime.

The locals were also informed by the Income Tax Department's Taxpayer's Charter, DIN (Documentation Number) which is a computer generated 20 digit unique number which needs to be mandatorily duly quoted on every authorized communication (letter / notice / order / any other correspondence) issued by any Income Tax Authority

to any taxpayer and the Department's online and efficient grievance redressal facility.

Other than feedback regarding taxation issues, the locals of Baramulla were urged to talk about their aspirations from the upcoming Union Budget. With regard to the Union Budget, the locals gave their ideas and suggestions, centric to development of their district. Fayaz representing the local horticulture community at Baramulla highlighted that Sopore, located in Baramulla, had Asia's 2nd largest whole sale fruit market and requested for emphasis on Crop Insurance, the need for market intervention scheme for grade C apples, market connectivity and irrigation facilities in Baramulla. The locals requested for early completion of ongoing projects to save costs and increased employment opportunities for the youth of Baramulla. Issues of rehabilitation centres and preventive measures to save the local youth from the peril of drug addiction were also raised. Ahmad, a local trader, requested facilitation for the young entrepreneurs of the district, focus on tourism and increased focus on industrialization of Baramulla.

The officers assured the locals that the Income Tax Department and the Central GST Department are partners in the development of Jammu & Kashmir and that the doors of their offices are always open for the public.

JAMMU: The Director General of Police (DGP) J&K Dilbag Singh impressed upon the officers to make optimum use of the technology for security of the users, officials of the Railways and also for the hassle free services to passengers.

Director General of Police J&K Dilbag Singh was chairing a meeting of the State Level Security Committee (SLSC) to review the security of railways in Jammu and Kashmir at the conference hall at Police Headquarters here.

Speaking on the occasion the DGP expressed his satisfaction over the coordination between GRP, RPF & other departments and impressed upon the officers that best of partnership and performance by the agencies guarding the railways should be ensured on ground for the safety and security of the people.

He said that in future security issues pertaining to the safety of railways

will be more important as more and more stations will get connected and more & more people will use the services for travel & freight.

He said there have been some elements in the past that were involved in damaging the property of railways.

However, he stated that such incidents have gone down considerably.

The DGP impressed upon the officers to make optimum use of the technology for security of the users, officials of the Railways and also for the hassle free services to passengers.

At the outset of the meeting ADGP Railways while welcoming all the committee members said that due to the pandemic COVID-19 this meeting is being held after a long time as the first meeting was held in February 2020.

The meeting started with the threadbare discussion on the action taken report on the agenda points of the last meeting which included joint

security audit of vital installation, experimental running of glass top rail bogies, availability of X-ray baggage scanners for their optimum utilization.

During the meeting action taken report on the installation of CCTV cameras was also discussed and the committee was informed that 235 CCTV cameras are installed at 12 Railway stations besides there is need for more at some stations.

Strengthening of manpower, deployment of dog squads and improving infrastructure for the officers and jawans of RPF and GRP was also discussed.

The meeting was attended via video conferencing by Spl DG CID J&K R. R. Swain and Principal Chief Security Commissioner/ IGP RPF Hqrs S. N. Pandey while ADGP Railways J&K Sunil Kumar who also conducted the proceedings of the meeting and Commandant RPF Ferozepur division Rajnish attended the meeting at Conference Hall.

## JTC, SKF protest enters day 431

JAMMU: The ongoing protest of Jagti Tenement Committee (JTC) and Soan Kashmir Front (SKF) J&K entered 431st day on Tuesday. During the protest, led by President JTC Shadi Lal Pandita, a number of protestors highlighted their long pending demands.

Speaking on the occasion, Pandita said that JTC has been protesting for last 431 days demanding enhancement in relief to Kashmiri migrants which is very low in this time of high inflation. They also urged the

Government to fulfill all pending demands of KP community, who are living in exile from last more than three decades. Major demands highlighted on the occasion included enhancing monthly cash relief from Rs 13,000 to Rs 25,000 per family per month, new employment package for unemployed youth, providing at least

one job to those families where none is working, establishing three satellite townships in Kashmir valley near Baramulla, Srinagar and Anantnag, Rs 1 crore to every family as ex-gratia and compensation for damages, removing illegal occupation from land/properties and religious, providing political reservation and minority status to KPs etc.

## Centre's 'no' to restore statehood insult to Dogras, peace loving people of JK: JKPC

This was stated by JKPC Chief Spokesperson Ravinder Sharma while reacting to the statement of Home Minister's categorical no to restore Dogra state atleast before elections.

the main demand of all people of Jammu and Kashmir to restore the lost identity and dignity of historical Dogra state which was ruthlessly and arbitrarily disbanded, divided and downgraded against the wishes of entire population of Jammu and Kashmir.

"The Centre should honour its commitments on the floor of the Parliament which repeated, time again, on all important occasions, and restore the state, without further delay, in any case, before assembly elections and hold the assembly elections, at the earliest possible, after concluding the delimitation process, well within time, in a fair and transparent manner," he added.

## 15 days Capacity Building Training for AYUSH Medical Officers concludes

JAMMU: Directorate of Ayush J&K organized a 15-day capacity building training programme for Ayush Medical Officers working under National Health Mission (NHM), J&K on 'Ayush Interventions for Comprehensive Health Care' under the guidance of Director Ayush J&K, Dr. Mohan Singh.

It is pertinent to mention here that professionally qualified Ayush Medical Officers from different traditional systems of medicines like Ayurveda, Unani, Homeopathy are providing health care services in various co-located health facilities under various health schemes of NHM, J&K.

In order to re-orient these Ayush professionals about the role, principles and practices enshrined in the codified traditional health care systems can play in making the public health care delivery more comprehensive and holistic.

While addressing the 50 Ayush Medical Officers working under NHMJ&K, Director Ayush J&K emphasized the need for mainstreaming Ayush systems in the era of emergence of Non-communicable diseases and emerging infectious diseases.

Director Ayush urged the medical officers to work for the strengthening the systems of Ayush health systems at the grass root level and practice the traditional system in

More than 30 resource persons from different specialties of Ayush and Primary health care delivered their sessions. Director Ayush J&K also interacted with the participants and motivated them to practice the skills acquired during training and document the best practices so that Ayush interventions can be established as evidence based medicine. He also expressed that it is the need of the hour to converge various levels of health care to provide the patient care on the principle of continuum of care which is the essence of comprehensive health care and converge to propagate the Ayush systems of health care through

ASHA, ANMs and Anganwadi workers.

Director Ayush J&K also appreciated the state programme management unit, National Ayush Mission for conceptualizing this much required training under capacity building component of National Health Mission J&K. The program was also attended by Assistant Director Ayurveda, Dr. Rakesh Kumar Raina who briefed about the achievements of Directorate of Ayush in recent years and outlined the vision and mission of Directorate of Ayush.

The stay was extended as JDA failed to file reply in matter and Law Officer of JDA sought further time to file reply and to produce their standing counsel. The whistle-blower Adv Muzaffar Ali Shah also filed application seeking his impeachment as party respondent in the appeal preferred by Mamta Singh, wife of Dr Nirmal Singh against demolition order issued by JDA. Adv Shah, in the open court, stated that JDA is hand in glove with former Deputy Chief Minister and for this reason, he is required to be arrayed as party respondent. The tribunal has now fixed the hearing for December 14, 2021.
