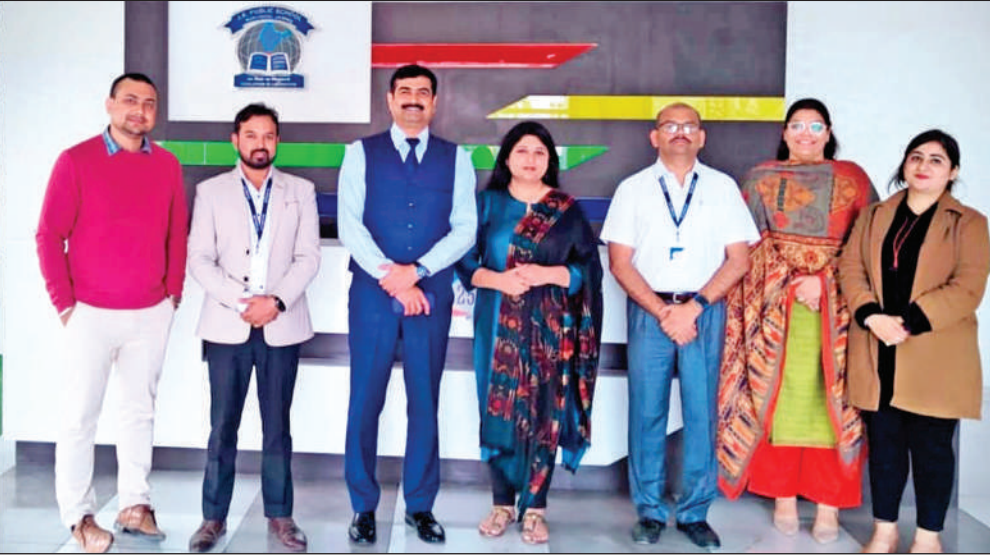


Top Indian Universities visit JKPS Kunjwani’s Career Counselling Fair
