According to Dr Balvinder Singh, "The patient suffered from Avascular Necrosis of right hip due to which it was difficult for patient to perform routine work. She was living painful life since last 3 years. In such a situation, total hip replacement was the only option. The patient was admitted under Ayushman Bharat scheme and surgery was

Dr Balvinder Singh said before introduction of Ayushman Bharat scheme it was not possible for a poor labourer to go for such high end surgeries because cost of implant and surgery is too high as

In private hospital it may cost 5 to 7 lakhs.

He said the seniority has been in public domain since last two years and till date DPC has not

He expressed displeasure over the delay in the holding the DPC as certain elements are hell bent to get the issue of seniority into litigation.
