CRIME REPORT

Youth found hanging with tree ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

SAMBA: A youth was found hanging with tree in a park at SIDCO Chowk on Sunday.

As per details, on seeing a youth hanging with a tree in a park, locals informed police which rushed to the spot and shifted body to morgue. The deceased was identified as 26 years old Jitender, son of Dina, resident of Hardoi, Uttar Pradesh, presently staying at Chak Manga, Rakwal Samba. Police has registered a case and started investigation.

Co-driver injured in attack ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

UDHAMPUR: A co-driver of a bus got injured in a sudden attack by an unknown person with a rod at Slathia Chowk on Sunday.

According to information, on Sunday evening, when a bus (JK02X-1453) was standing at Slathia Chowk and its co-driver, identified as Rakesh Kumar (20), son of Tara Chand, resident of Vindla Udhampur was boarding passengers, an unknown person came with an iron rod and attacked him, thereby injuring him and fled from the spot. Locals immediately informed police and injured was shifted to district hospital Udhampur for treatment. A case has been registered and investigating started.

Thieves target three shops in Samba ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

SAMBA: Thieves targeted three shops in Samba town on Saturday night.

According to information, thieves stole clothes, pent-coats etc worth about Rs 1-75 lakh from Sonu Di Hatti Garments store. At the same time, a medical store was targeted in Ward-8. Owner of the shop, Randhir Kumar, son of Om Prakash, resident of Ward-9, Samba informed that thieves took away with Rs 2,200 from his shop. On the other hand, thieves tried to commit theft at a cosmetic shop located in main market, but found anything. When owners reached their shops in morning, they found locks of shutters broken and informed the police. Police rushed to the spot and started investigation.

One arrested for cheating person on pretext of providing job ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

JAMMU: Police on Sunday arrested one man who defrauded a man of lakhs in the name of providing him a job.

According to information, a complaint was received by Bathindi police in July wherein a person told that one Vikas

Dutta, resident of Surankote has cheated him of Rs 3 lakh on pretext of providing job in bank. Police has registered a case, but accused was on run. Acting on a tip-off, police on Sunday raided a suspected location and arrested accused. He was staying in Muthi area these days.

Two women die in accidents ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

JAMMU: Two women died in accidents in different areas on Sunday.

According to information, one Usha Sidd, wife of Paras Ram, resident of Chhattisgarh, presently staying in Channi Himmat area, was found lying on railway track. GRP personnel rushed to the spot and took body into custody. In this context, further action has been started by registering a case.

Apart from this, two motorcycles collided in Bishrah area due to which a woman died. She was identified as Gurjit Kaur, wife of Surat Singh, resident of Khaud, Miran Sahib. Police has registered a case and initiated further action.

Five of family hospitalized of suffocation ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

JAMMU: Five persons got hospitalized due to suffocation in Kahara area of Doda district.

According to information, a woman of Charawa village called her neighbour that her condition is bad. She further told that four members of her family have also become unconscious as something is happening to them. Acting on phone call, people rushed to the spot and all five persons were taken to the hospital and presently, are all out of danger. During investigation, it was revealed that coal was burnt inside room due to which they became unconscious. Police has appealed people not to burn such type of coal in their houses.

Man injured in brawl ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

AKHNOOR: A man got injured in a brawl in Akhnoor and was admitted to the hospital for treatment.

According to information, Tilak Raj, son of Dasu Ram, resident of Ashram Gali was attacked after a brawl in the area, due to which he got injured. His relatives took him to hospital for treatment. Police has registered a case and started investigation.

Missing man traced, reunited with family ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

JAMMU: Police on Sunday traced a man and reunited him with his family.

As per details, information was received at Police Post Sidhra regarding missing of a person namely Rajinder Singh, son of Payar Singh, resident of Bharon Bajarni, Doda who went missing from his house.

In this regard a missing report was registered at Police Post Sidhra on June 4, 2018 and investigation started. On this, a police team under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep

Kumar led by SHO Nagrota Inspr Vishav Partap Singh assisted by Incharge Police Post Sidhra PSI Nitish Khajuria, after putting in strenuous efforts, finally traced the missing person. Subsequently, his family members were informed and he was handed over to them after completing all legal formalities.

Desperate snatcher arrested ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

BISHNAH: Police on Sunday arrested a desperate snatcher and recovered snatched ear-rings from his possession.

As per details, on December 16, 2022, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Bishnah by a woman namely Vijay Kumari, wife of Som Nath, Chak Bana Jattan Tehsil Bishnah, Jammu stating that some unknown person restrained her way and snatched her ear-rings. On this FIR 215/2022 under sections 382/323/147 of IPC was registered and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Bishnah under the supervision of SDPO R S Pura Surinder Singh led by SHO Police Station Bishnah Inspr Vikram Sharma, after putting in strenuous efforts and with the help of various CCTV footages of area along with technical assistance, rounded up a suspect namely Ankush Kumar, son of Girdhari Lal, resident of Chak Chinna, Tehsil Bishnah. During intensive questioning, accused confessed his involvement in crime and on his disclosure snatched ear-rings were recovered from his possession. It is pertinent to mention that his Motorcycle (JK02CH-5076) was also seized. Further investigation of the case is going on.



101 bovines rescued; 9 vehicles seized, 9 smugglers arrested ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

JAMMU: Police on Sunday foiled various bovines smuggling bids by rescuing 101 bovines, seized 9 vehicles and arrested smugglers.

As per the details, continuing drive against bovine smuggling, teams of District Police Reasi under supervision of SSP Amit Gupta laid special Naka and seized 2 vehicles, rescued 8 bovines besides arresting 5 smugglers. A party of Police Station Pouni led by Insp

Suman Singh under supervision of Iftkhar Ahmed Dysp Hqrs Reasi laid a special Naka in Pouni area. During checking, police party intercepted one Swaraj Tractor and trolley loaded with straw (Parali) and one swift car (PB04L 8888). Driver of tractor-trolley tried to run away by breaking Naka due to which some officials on duty also got injured but acting swiftly Police party apprehended vehicle and during checking, recovered 8 bovines which were concealed under straw. In this regard FIR 76/2022 under sections 307/147/323/188 of IPC and 11(1)(a) of PCA act was registered at Police Station Pouni. Both vehicles got seized and accused smugglers identified as Abdul Majid, son of Bhalla Shah, resident of Talab Tillo; Mushtaq Ahmed, son of Mohd Mirza, resident of Khari Bishnah; Mohd Saleem, son of Abdul Rashid, resident of Sna Akhnoor; Aqib Mushtaq, son of Mohd Mushtaq, resident of Saaj District Rajouri and Shama Din, son of Abdul Gani, resident of Phalian Mandal Jammu were arrested.

Jammu Police also made a massive recovery of 77 bovine animals i.e., 39 bovines from two vehicles at Ban toll Plaza Naka, 6 bovines from a vehicle at TCP Nagrota Naka, 32 bovines from three different vehicles in the jurisdiction of Police Stations Nagrota and Jhajjar Kotli respectively. A police team of Police Station Nagrota led by SHO Nagrota Inspr Vishav Partap Singh while on Naka checking at Ban toll Plaza rounded up two suspects who were transporting 39 bovines on two different vehicles (JK02CB-5411 and JK08P-2385), which were rescued. Police teams rounded up a vehicle (JK02CT 1310) at TCP Nagrota Naka and during checking found 6 animals. In this regard three different cases FIR No.425, 426, 427/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act were registered at Police Station Nagrota. Two accused namely Liaquat Hussain, son of Mohd Iqbal, resident of Rakwala, Poonch and his associate Arshad Ahmed, son of Liaquat Choudhary, resident of village Gunga Tehsil Nakar (UP) were arrested while vehicle (JK02CB 5411) was seized.

Similarly, a police team of Police Post Manwal led by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Inspr Samson Bhatti assisted by Incharge Police Post Manwal PSI Sanjeev Sharma while on Naka checking duty seized 3 vehicles (JK18C-7694, JK03P-4872 and JK13-5411) in which 32 bovine animals were being transported. The overall arrests and recoveries were made under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pradeep Kumar. Further investigation of the case is going on.

In another instance, Ghagwal Police rescued 16 bovines from a truck and arrested 2 smugglers, identified as Rinku Kumar, son of Darshan Lal, resident of Bari Brahmana and Ravi Kumar, son of Shankar Dass, resident of Neeli Nallah Udhampur.
